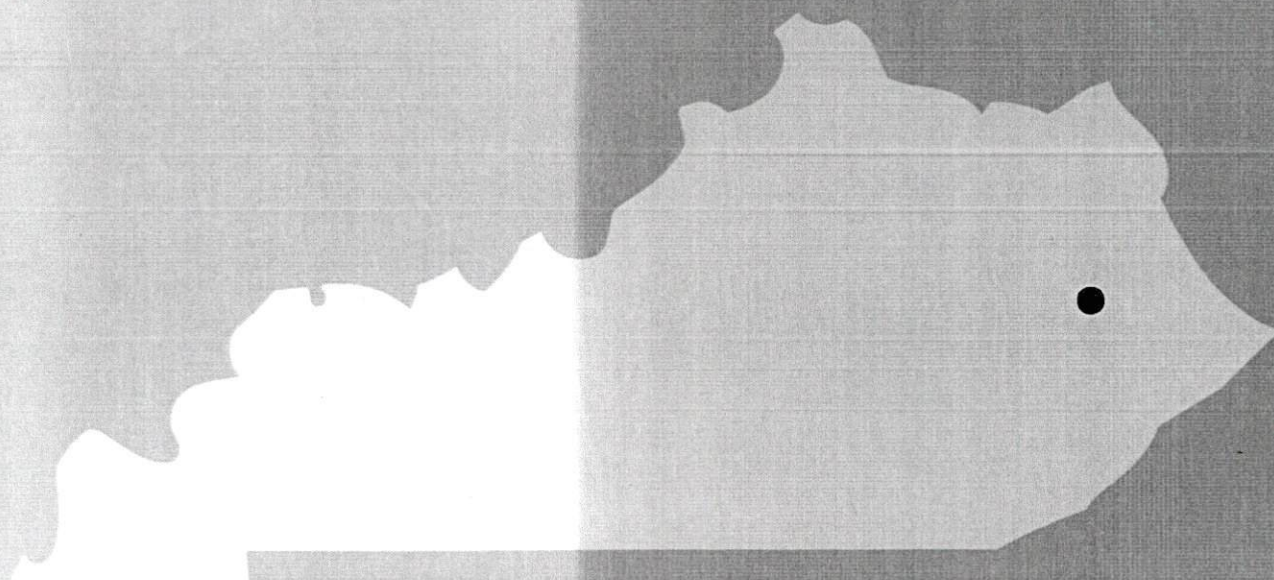

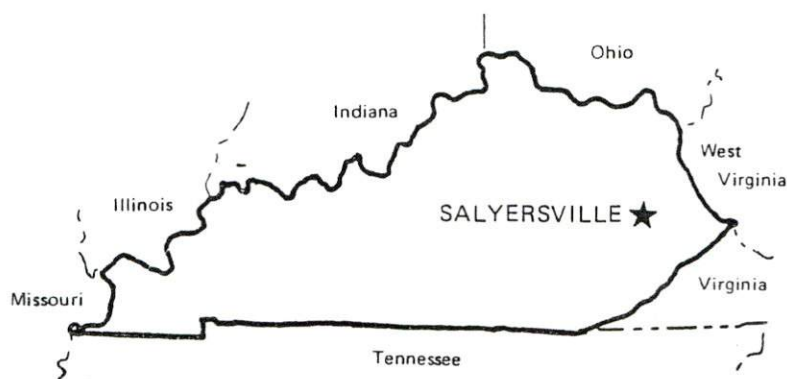

## LABOR ORGANIZATIONS:

Presently, there are no unions representing manufacturing workers in Salyersville.

## TRANSPORTATION:

Rail: The nearest rail service is provided by the Chessie System and is located at Paintsville, 18 miles east of Salyersville. Services at Paintsville include freight stops as needed; five eastbound and five westbound through freights daily; switching facilities; team track space for eight cars; and siding space for approximately 30 cars. The nearest piggyback facilities are at Huntington, West Virginia, 94 miles northeast of Salyersville.

Highways: U.S. Highway 460, Kentucky Highways 114 and 7, and the Mountain Parkway serve Salyersville. The Mountain Parkway is an east-west toll road which connects with Interstate 64.

Truck: Hogan Storage and Transfer Company and Smith's Transfer Corporation provide interstate trucking service to Salyersville. Overnite Transportation Company is available for both interstate and intrastate trucking service.

Water: The Eastern Kentucky Port Authority was formed in 1977. A feasibility study has been completed and plans are under way for the development of a riverport in the Greenup-Boyd-Lawrence County area, northeast of Salyersville.

Air: The nearest commercial airport is Tri-State Airport (Walker-Long Field) located at Huntington, West Virginia, 85 miles away. The airport is served by Piedmont and USAir Airlines. The nearest small craft airports are West Liberty-Morgan County Airport, 22 miles away, and Paintsville-Prestonsburg Combs Airport, 18 miles away. Both of these airports have paved runways which are 2,400 and 3,200 feet respectively.

## UTILITIES:

Electricity: Salyersville and parts of Magoffin County are served by Kentucky Power Company. Licking Valley RECC serves the major portion of Magoffin County and the source of supply is East Kentucky Power Cooperative.

Natural Gas: Natural gas service is not available in Salyersville.

Other Fuels: Propane and distillate fuel oil are available from distributors in the Salyersville area.

## WATER AND SEWERAGE:

Water: Salyersville Water and Sewerage Company serves the community and the source of raw water is two deep wells. The treatment plant capacity is 228,000 gallons per day and average daily consumption is 200,000 gallons. Total storage capacity is 200,000 gallons.

Sewerage: Salyersville Water and Sewerage Company provides sewerage service to the city. The design capacity of the treatment plant is 150,000 gallons per day. The average daily flow is 100,000 gallons and treatment is primary and secondary.

## GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE:

City: Salyersville is served by a mayor elected to a four-year term and six councilmen elected to two-year terms.

County: Magoffin County is served by a county judge/executive and three magistrates elected to four-year terms.

EDUCATION: One public school system operates in Magoffin County. Total enrollment is 3,007 including 2,239 elementary and 768 high school students. The nearest state vocational school is Mayo State Vocational-Technical School in Paintsville, 19 miles away.

## COMMUNICATIONS:

Telephone: Salyersville is served by Foothills Rural Telephone Cooperative Corporation, Inc.

Telegraph: A Western Union toll-free number is available for sending mailgrams, telegrams, or international messages.

Newspaper: The Salyersville Independent is published weekly and the circulation is about 3,500.

Radio Station: Radio station WRLV-AM is located in Salyersville.

Television: Cable service is available. Major networks are available from Lexington, Kentucky, and Huntington and Charleston, West Virginia.

## OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

Hospitals: The nearest hospital is Highlands Regional Medical Center at Prestonsburg, 23 miles away. The facility has 137 acute care beds.

Churches: There are approximately eight churches in Salyersville. Denominations include Baptist, Christian, Methodist and Church of Christ.

Financial Institutions: The Salyersville National Bank provides banking service to the city.
