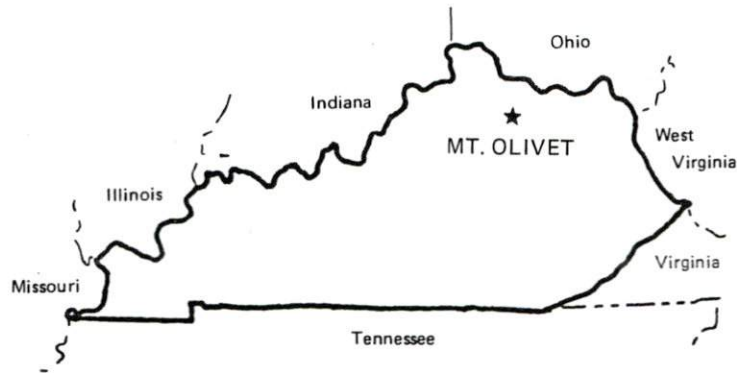

LOCAL MANUFACTURING PLANTS:

There are no manufacturing plants in Mount Olivet at the present time.

TRANSPORTATION:

Rail: The nearest rail service is available at Maysville, 23 miles northeast of Mount Olivet. Both the Chessie System and TTI Railroad provide freight service to Maysville. Freight service is also provided by the Louisville and Nashville Railroad at Cynthiana, 24 miles southwest of Mount Olivet.

Highways: U.S. Highway 62 and Kentucky Highway 165 serve Mount Olivet. An interchange of Interstate 75 is located 43 miles southwest of Mount Olivet via U.S. 62.

Truck: Budig Western provides interstate and intrastate motor carrier service and McDaniel Motor Express provides intrastate motor carrier service to Mount Olivet.

Water: Mount Olivet is located 23 miles southwest of a point on the Ohio River at Maysville. Plans are under way to develop a public port at Maysville which will serve as a general cargo facility.

Air: The nearest scheduled airline service is available at Blue Grass Field in Lexington, 52 miles southwest of Mount Olivet. Delta, Eastern, Piedmont, USAir and two commuter airlines serve Blue Grass Field. The Cynthiana-Harrison County Airport, 25 miles southwest of Mount Olivet, has one paved, 3,200-foot runway.

UTILITIES:

Electricity: Mount Olivet and portions of Robertson County are served by Kentucky Utilities Company, an electric generation and transmission company. The remainder of Robertson County is served by Fleming-Mason RECC and Harrison RECC. The source of supply for both of the RECC's is East Kentucky Power Cooperative.

Natural Gas: The Mount Olivet Natural Gas Company, Inc., supplied by Columbia Gas Transmission Corporation, serves Mount Olivet.

Other Fuels: Two propane distributors are located in Maysville, 23 miles distant. Seven fuel oil distributors are also located in Maysville and additional supplies of both propane and fuel oil are available in the surrounding area.

WATER AND SEWERAGE:

Water: The City of Mount Olivet Water Department provides water service to Mount Olivet. The source of raw water is the Licking River. The treatment plant capacity is 200,000 gallons per day; average daily consumption is 142,000 gallons and peak daily consumption is 168,000 gallons. Storage capacity is 100,00 gallons.

Sewerage: Septic tanks are being utilized for sewage disposal at the present time.

GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE:

City: Mount Olivet is governed by a mayor elected to a 4-year term and 6 councilmen elected to 2-year terms.

County: Robertson County citizens elect a county judge/executive and 5 magistrates to 4-year terms of office.

EDUCATION: There is one school system operating in Robertson County. Total enrollment in the Robertson County school system is 440, including 215 elementary and 225 high school students. The Central Kentucky State Vocational-Technical School is located at Lexington, 52 miles from Mount Olivet. Two area vocational education centers, one at Maysville and one at Cynthiana, are located within 25 miles of Mount Olivet.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Telephone: Continental Telephone Company of Kentucky provides standard service to Mount Olivet.

Telegraph: There is a Western Union toll-free number for sending telegrams, mailgrams and international messages.

Newspaper: The Robertson County Review is a weekly publication serving Robertson County. Current circulation is about 700.

Television: Major television networks are received, without cable, from Lexington, Kentucky, and Cincinnati, Ohio.

OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

Hospitals: The nearest hospital is Hayswood Hospital in Maysville, 23 miles away. There are 113 acute care beds and 30 skilled nursing beds at this hospital. The Harrison Memorial Hospital in Cynthiana, 24 miles away, has 83 acute care beds and 10 skilled nursing beds.

Churches: There are four churches in Mount Olivet. Denominations include Baptist, Christian, Christian Baptist and Methodist.

Financial Institutions: The Farmers and Traders Bank of Mount Olivet, Kentucky, Inc., provides financial services to the city.
