Autograph books created by Beulah Collins Ellis. This book has a padded cover of brown cloth. The majority of the autographs date to 1902 and 1903. Mrs. Ellis' daughter Lena wrote in the book in 1922.

Of special note is an inscription by Edgar Cayce:

"To thine own self be true and it must follow as the night the day. That you will be true to others. Your friend, Edgar Cayce, BG, September 17, 1902"

The original book is extremely fragile and will not be pulled for researchers.
