





CAMPTON, KENTUCKY - A RESOURCE PROFILE

Campton, the county seat of Wolfe County, is situated in the western part of the Eastern Kentucky Coal Field. Campton is located 65 miles southeast of Lexington, Kentucky, 139 miles southeast of Louisville, Kentucky; 143 miles southeast of Cincinnati, Ohio; and 189 miles north of Knoxville, Tennessee. Campton had a 1992 estimated population of 517.

Wolfe County, covering a total land area of 222 square miles, is characterized by narrow, cliff-rimmed, flat-topped ridges in the northwest. In other parts of the county, the slopes are not as steep, but the ridge tops are essentially the same. Wolfe County had a 1992 estimated population of 6,936.


The Economic Framework - The total number of Wolfe County residents employed in 1993 averaged 2,801. Manufacturing firms in the county reported 282 employees; wholesale and retail trade provided 196 jobs; 215 people were employed in service occupations; state and local government accounted for 362 employees; and contract construction firms provided 21 jobs.

Labor Supply - There is a current estimated labor supply of 12,027 persons available for industrial jobs in the labor market area. In addition, from 1996 through 2000, 6,144 young persons in the area will become 18 years of age and potentially available for industrial jobs.

Transportation - Campton is served directly by Kentucky Highway 15, a "AAA"-rated trucking highway. The Mountain Parkway, a multi-lane highway, is located just one mile north of Campton. Interstate 64 is accessible 44 miles northwest of Campton via the Mountain Parkway. Ten common carrier trucking companies provide interstate and intrastate service to Campton. CSX Transportation provides rail service at Jackson, 20 miles southeast of Campton. The nearest commercial airport, Blue Grass Airport near Lexington, is located 69 miles northwest of Campton. The Stanton Airport, 22 miles northwest of Campton, maintains a 3,000-foot paved runway designed to accommodate small aircraft.

Power and Fuel - Electric power is provided to Campton and Wolfe County by the Licking Valley Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation. Natural gas service is not available in Campton at the present time, however Jefferson Oil and Gas Company provides natural gas service to a portion of eastern Wolfe County.

Education - Primary and secondary education is provided to Campton and Wolfe County by the Wolfe County School System. In addition, one private school provides elementary education to the community. Eight institutions of higher learning are located within 70 miles of Campton. Three vocational education facilities are available within 55 miles of Campton.



The Campton Labor Market Area includes Wolfe County and the adjoining Kentucky counties of Breathitt, Lee, Magoffin, Menifee, Morgan and Powell.







PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME 1992





RECENT INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENTS

A pre-application has been submitted and approved for an EDA grant in the amount of \$1.2 million to develop 27 acres in the Quillen Chapel Industrial Park in Campton. Multi County Coal Funds will also be used to fund the project. Site development is projected to begin Spring 1995. In-Steel, Inc., a metal furniture frame manufacturer, has committed to build a \$700,000 facility on ten acres at the industrial park. The facility will employ approximately 110 people and estimated completion of the project is Fall 1995.

The Wolfe County Industrial Development Authority was formed in 1994 and has been very active in recruiting industrial prospects.

Interstate 64 is located 44 miles northwest of Campton via the Mountain Parkway. The Daniel Boone Parkway, a multi-lane toll road, is accessible 48 miles southeast of Campton via Kentucky 15.



LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Structure

The City of Campton is governed by a mayor and four commissioners. The mayor is elected to a four-year term while the commissioners each serve two-year terms. Wolfe County is governed by a county judge/executive and three magistrates. Each county official is elected to a four-year term.

Planning and Zoning

There are no planning and zoning agencies operating in Wolfe County at the present time.

Mandatory state codes enforced - Kentucky Plumbing Code, National Electric Code, Kentucky Boiler Regulations and Standards, Kentucky Building Code (modeled after BOCA code)

Local Fees and Licenses

The City of Campton levies an annual business license fee of \$50. Unloading license fees are \$25 annually. Wolfe County levies annual business license fees ranging from \$6.50 to \$11.50.

PROPERTY TAXES

The Kentucky Constitution requires the state to tax all classes of taxable property, and state statutes allow local jurisdictions to tax only a few classes. All locally taxed property is subject to county taxes and school district taxes (either a county school district or an independent school district). Property located inside of city limits may also be subject to city property taxes.

Special local taxing jurisdictions (fire protection districts, watershed districts, and sanitation districts) levy taxes within their operating areas (usually a small portion of community or county).

Property assessments in Kentucky are at 100% fair cash value. Accounts receivable are taxed at 85% of face value.

As part of the Business and Industry Technical Assistance (BITAC) division of Hazard Community College, the facility is available to businesses and organizations for retreats and conferences.

VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL TRAINING

Kentucky Tech schools are operated by the Cabinet for Workforce Development and provide secondary (Sec) and postsecondary (P/S) vocational-technical training.

Customized Training

The Kentucky Tech system, through its Training and Development Coordinators, will provide technical assistance and will identify and develop low-cost customized training programs and services for both established and prospective businesses. Businesses needing customized training should contact a Training and Development Coordinator located at Hazard State Vocational-Technical School.

Assessment Services

Kentucky Tech Career Connections offers to business, education, and government agencies customized assessment in career inventories, interest inventories, pre-hire assessment, psychomotor skills and academic potential. A Career Connections assessment center is located at Kentucky Tech - Hazard, Hazard, Kentucky and Kentucky Tech-Mayo, Paintsville, Kentucky.

Tech Prep

Tech Prep is a combined secondary and postsecondary program of studies that leads to an associate degree or diploma in a technical field. Lee County Area Vocational Education Center is currently implementing tech prep programs in the area of auto technology, business education, carpentry, electrical technology, health services, and welding. Similar Tech Prep programs are being implemented at Kentucky Tech - Hazard, Kentucky Tech - Breathitt County, and Kentucky Tech-Mayo.

Adult Education Services

Adult Education is available to adults who want to develop new skills, or earn a high school equivalency degree. In Wolfe County, adult literacy and adult basic education are provided by the Hazel Academy, Campton, Kentucky, 41301; Wolfe County Literacy Council, 100 Main Street, Campton, Kentucky 41301; and the Wolfe County Board of Education, P.O. Box 160, Campton, Kentucky 41301.

Bluegrass State Skills Corporation

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation, an independent public corporation created and funded by the Kentucky General Assembly, provides programs of skills training to meet the needs of business and industry from entry level to advanced training, and from upgrading present employees to retraining experienced workers.

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation is a major source for skills training assistance for a new or existing company. The Corporation works in partnership with other employment and job training resources and programs, as well as Kentucky's economic development activities, to package a program customized to meet the specific needs of a company.

RECREATION

Local

The Campton Community Park offers a baseball field, a basketball court, a tennis court, picnic tables, shelter houses, and a playground. Other recreational facilities in Campton include two baseball fields and four gymnasiums.

A homecoming festival is held annually each Labor Day weekend in Campton. The festival includes a parade, booths, crafts, and live music.

Wolfe County is located within the Daniel Boone National Forest, which covers 640,000 acres of timberland in eastern Kentucky. It encompasses much of Kentucky's great beauty and provides a vacation paradise. There are scenic hiking trails, rivers and streams stocked with a variety of fish, hunting preserves, camping sites, and numerous other natural and historical attractions.

Several tourist attractions are located near Campton. Red River Gorge, part of the Daniel Boone National Forest and considered one of eastern Kentucky's most prominent features, is a boulder-strewn area of rugged forest, streams, cliffs, overlooks, arches, rare plants and animal life. Picnic and campsites are available in the Koomer Ridge Recreation area. Pioneer Weapons Area features a 7,480-acre preserve where hunters are limited to primitive weapons use only.

Natural Bridge State Resort Park near Slade, 13 miles northwest of Campton, is located within the Daniel Boone National Forest where cliffs and stone arches fill the landscape. The rugged awesomeness of the great Natural Bridge is the main attraction. The park offers a 35-room resort lodge with a dining room, a convention center, a gift shop, ten rustic cottages, and 95 camping sites. Other facilities include a lake, a swimming pool, picnic shelters and playgrounds, mini-golf, hiking trails, a riding stable, a chair lift, and pedal boats.
