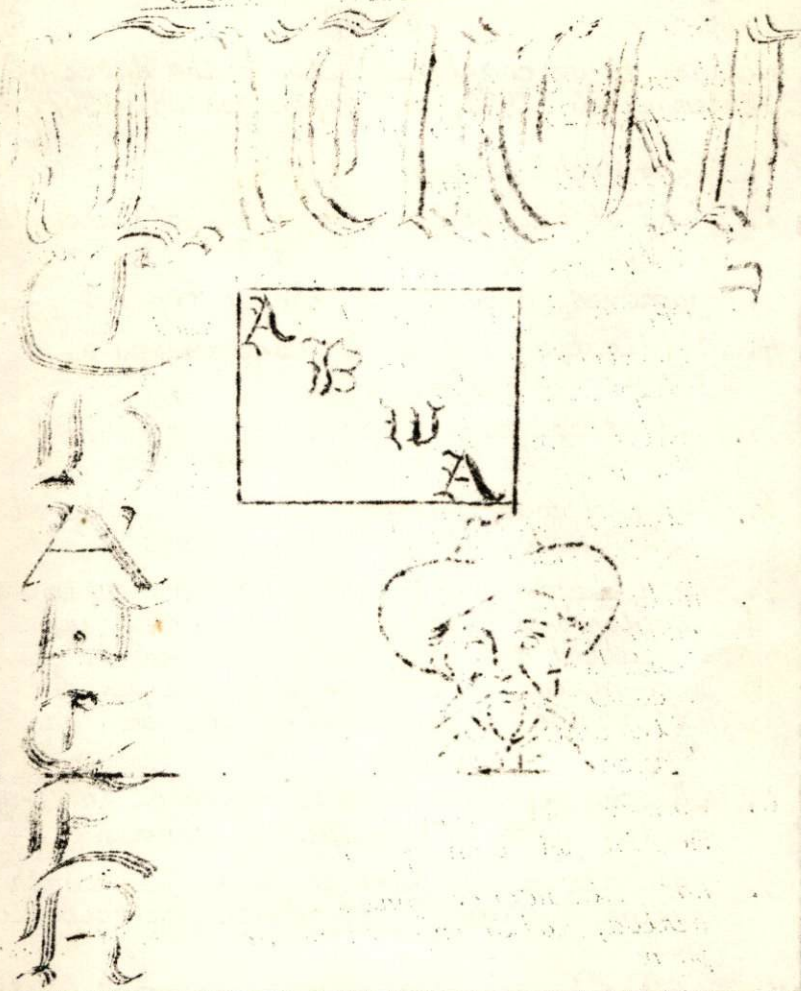

STANDARD of ACHIEVEMENT

1966-67

All are to be completed between the dates of September 26, 1966, and September 25, 1967.

1. Boss Night Dinner
2. Hand of Friendship Tea on either March 12, 1967, or September 17, 1967
3. Approved Educational Scholarship
4. Publication of nine or more issues of a chapter bulletin
5. Select and submit material on a 1967-68 Woman of the Year from the chapter
6. Minimum contribution of \$35.00 to the Stephen Lufston Memorial Educational Fund
7. Hold Chapter Anniversary Observance in month chapter was chartered (except chapters installed after September 26, 1966), giving recognition to members having a perfect attendance for a period of one year or longer
8. Observe ABWA Scholarship Month at the May meeting with an appropriate program
9. Hold Attendance Contest over three month period, following attendance participation plan
10. Either have member in attendance at District Meeting; or verification of delegate to the 1967 National Convention
11. Enroll a total of at least ten (10) new members

BANNER CHAPTER

1966-67

To qualify for Banner Chapter status, a chapter must complete all requirements for Standard of Achievement, and in addition, fulfill any eight of the following requirements between the dates of September 26, 1966, and September 25, 1967.

1. Hold twelve (12) chapter meetings during the year
2. Have twelve (12) planned programs with speaker
3. Have a vocational talk by member at each meeting, including Boss Night
4. Hold Hand of Friendship Teas on both March 12 and September 17, 1967, (official dates); or hold one Tea on one of the official dates and an Enrollment Party on, or within one week before the other official date
5. Enroll a minimum of ten (10) members at a single Hand of Friendship Tea or Enrollment Party
6. Have one or more members qualify for "Inner Circle"
7. Both verification of delegate to 1967 National Convention and have a member in attendance at the District Meeting
8. Have Woman of the Year in attendance at 1967 National Convention
9. Have a minimum of ten (10) members in attendance at District Meeting
10. Sponsor a single Ways and Means Project returning \$300.00 or more net profit

BANNER CHAPTER CONTINUED

11. SBMEF Donors' plaque recognition (name of donor inscribed on plaque at National Headquarters in acknowledgement of a contribution of at least \$100.00 in addition to meeting the Standard of Achievement SBMEF requirement.)
12. Award more than one scholarship annually
13. Sponsor an approved candidate for an SBMEF Loan or Grant
14. Sponsor Torchbearer Chapter, Friendship Chapter, or Expansion Chapter
15. Nominate a qualified candidate for National Office
16. Sponsor District Meeting or National Convention
