On the motion of **Thomas Biggerstaff** who made oath as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of **Benjamin Biggerstaff** deceased who together with **William Bell and Thomas Bell** his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of one thousand pounds conditioned as the law directs. ^{Page 41} Ordered that **Jacob Studebaker, Solomon Penrod, Leonard Morgan and Benjamin Talbot** or any three of them being first sworn do appraise in current money the personal estate and slaves (if any) of Benjamin Biggerstaff deceased and that the administrator return an inventory thereof to court agreeably to law. Ordered that **Joseph Ray, George Brown, William Smith** or any two of them ^{first being sworn} view the best and most convenient way for a road to lead from Rays ferry on Mud River to the courthouse of the county and make report thereof to the next court.

On the motion of **Lewis Kinchaloe** who made oath as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of **Lewis Reno** deceased with the will annext who thereupon together with **John Bradly and William Hynes** his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of one thousand pounds conditioned as the law directs with leave for **Elizabeth (Spiller) Renno** widow and relect of the said decedant to join in the administration aforesaid when ever she may think ^{Page 44}

proper.

Spencer Oneals stockmark a crop and hole in the right ear and underbit in the left ear on his motion ordered to be recorded. **Abraham Denniss** stockmark a swallow fork in the left ear and a half penny in the upperside of the right ear on his motion ordered to be recorded. **Cornelius Drakes** stockmark underbertit in each ear and slit in the end of each ear and on his motion ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of **William Campbell** and it appearing to the court that it will be advantagious to the public and it also appearing that legal notice having been given lawfully to law. It is ordered that a town be established on his land at the seat of justice in this county on Cany including thirty acres of land to be called and known by the name of Greenville. Whereupon the said **William Campbell** together with **John Brady** and **Charles Fox Wing** his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred pounds conditioned as the law directs. It is further ordered that the said town be vested in **Samuel Russell**, **Alney McLean**, **Henry Rhoads**, **Charles Fox Wing**, **William Bradford** and John Dennis who are hereby nominated and appointed Trustees

of the said town of Greenville agreeably to law.

Ordered that **William Cissna, John Reed and John Robinet** or any two of them being first sworn do view and mark the best and most convenient for a road to lead from the big falls on Green River to Greenville and make report then to the next court.

The persons appointed for that purpose made the following report to wit, Agreeable to an order of the worshipful court of the County of Muhlenberg passed at the September term that we the undernamed subscribers appointed to view a road leading from Lewisberg to Greenville as follows passing through the land of **Lewis Kinchalo, William Cissna, John Robinet and William Campbell** and they all consenting to the same. On the motion of **Solomon Penrod** and it appearing to the satisfaction of the court that the dwelling house of the said **Solomon** was burnd and that there was a patent for 200 acres of land granted to **John Organ** with an assignment thereon from **Matthew Ogden** heir at law to said **John Ogden** deceased to said **Penrod** which was consumed by the fire at the time the said **Solomons** house was burnt which is ordered to be certified.

THE JOHNSONS OF SOUTH MUHLENBERG

FAMILY TREE COMPILED--THE SECOND, THIRD AND FOURTH GENERATIONS COPIED FROM THE MUHLENBERG COUNTY SENTINEL, JULY 29, 1910.

I shall here attempt to present a family tree of the Johnsons of southern Muhlenberg. I shall give the names of all Johnsons of the second and third generations and many of those belonging to the fourth. In many cases the fifth and sixth generations exist, but they are not referred to here.

My list of the fourth generation is far from complete. It is very probable that a number of mistakes occur throughout this record. I will be glad to have any one call my attention to any error or omissions. I will also appreciate receiving a memorandum of the birth or death of any individual here named.

Practically, all the Johnsons of southern Muhlenberg trace their ancestry to Jacob Johnson or to Wm. Johnson. Jacob Johnson came to Muhlenberg about the year 1810, with his father Josiah Johnson. Josiah died about 1831 and Jacob died in 1845. The offspring of this Jacob Johnson are here recorded under the head of Jacob Johnson.

About twenty five years after Jacob located in the county, his cousin, William Johnson, settled in Muhlenberg among his kinsmen. The offsprings of this William Johnson are recorded under the head of William Johnson.

JACOB JOHNSON - Jacob Johnson, the forefather of this division of Johnsons, was the father of six sons: I Alfred Johnson; II. John or "Jack" Johnson; III. Jacob Johnson; IV. Bert Johnson; V. Hines Johnson; VI. James Johnson; I. ALFRED JOHNSON was born in 1811, died Oct. 5, 1896. He married Winnie Wright, who died July 4 1890. They were the parents of ten children: 1. Harvey Johnson married Emeline Dukes. Their children live in Todd Co. 2. John Johnson married Mrs. Temp J. Allen. They were the parents of six children. Winnie, died in youth; Florence, married W. A. Kennedy; Foster married Nannie Dukes, then Nannie Greer; Laura Ann, died in youth; Georgia, married W. S. Lyon; Lille, married Eugene Smith; 3. Lonz Johnson was born Nov. 27, 1837, died Dec. 24, 1904. He married Sarah Jenkins. They were the parents of four children: Lucy; Alice, married John Powell; John H., married Tucy Johnson; Anna, married J. L. or Rip Jenkins; The second wife of Lonz Johnson was Alma Tuley. They were the parents of: Della, who married Joe Hall. 4. Colonel Johnson married Indiana T. Newman. They were the parents of seven children: Delia, married _____ Posey; Tiney, married M. Bivens; Leota, married Jake Bivens; Winnie, married M. Cornett; Jess; Jossie; Austin; 5. Mahala Johnson married James Henry Johnson son of William Johnson. They were the parents of nine children: John W. married Belle Wells; Jenny married Geo. Grace; R. T. "Bead" married Belle Dukes; H. O. "Dug" married Georgia Hill; J.W. married Ella Dearson; Tiney married John H. Johnson; Charles B. married Erma Dearson; Pearl married Bob Dukes; Maddie married Lucian Wilson; Cont. in the next issue.
