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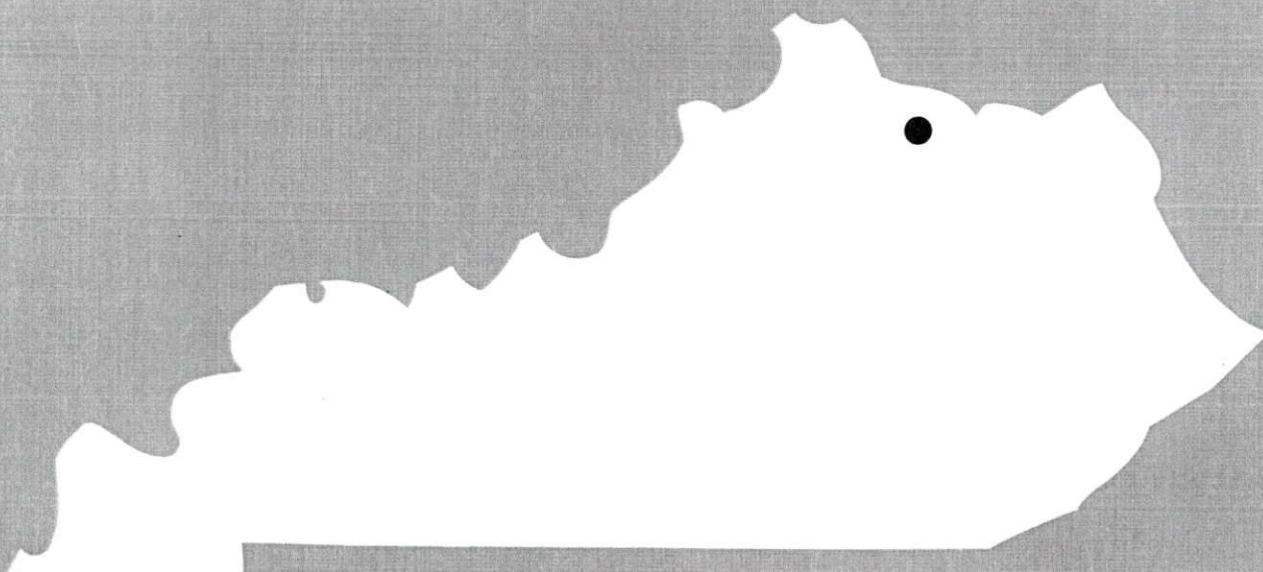
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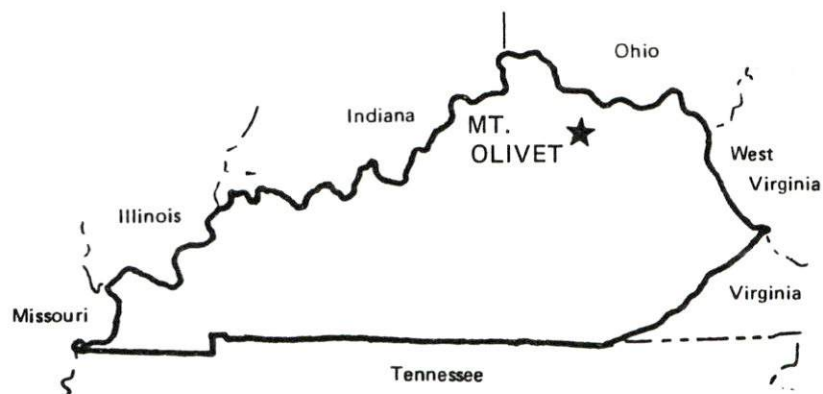

LOCAL MANUFACTURING PLANTS:

There are no manufacturing plants in Mt. Olivet at the present time.

TRANSPORTATION:

Rail: Mt. Olivet is not served directly by rail. However, main line rail service is available at Maysville and Cynthiana, both within 25 miles of Mt. Olivet. The Chessie System and the T.T.I. Railroad provide freight service at Maysville. The Seaboard System Railroad serves Cynthiana. Piggyback service is available within 65 miles of Mt. Olivet.

Highways: U.S. Highway 62 and Kentucky Highway 165 serve Mt. Olivet. An interchange of Interstate 75 is located 43 miles southwest of Mt. Olivet via U.S. 62.

Truck: Budig Western and Leoni Motor Express, Inc., provide interstate and intrastate motor carrier service and McDaniel Motor Express provides intrastate motor carrier service to Mt. Olivet.

Water: Mt. Olivet is located 23 miles southwest of Maysville, which is located on the Ohio River. Plans for a public port at Maysville are under way.

Air: The Cynthiana-Harrison County Airport, 24 miles southwest of Mt. Olivet, has one paved 3,200-foot runway. The nearest scheduled airline service is available at Blue Grass Field, in Lexington, 57 miles southwest of Mt. Olivet. Delta, Frontier, Piedmont, USAir, Allegheny Commuter, Comair and Tennessee Airways serve Blue Grass Field.

UTILITIES:

Electricity: Mt. Olivet and portions of Robertson County are served by the Kentucky Utilities Company, an electric generation and transmission company. The remainder of Robertson County is served by the Fleming-Mason RECC and the Harrison RECC, with the East Kentucky Power Cooperative the source of supply for both.

Natural Gas: The Mt. Olivet Natural Gas Company, Inc., which is supplied by the Columbia Gas Transmission Corporation, serves Mt. Olivet.

Other Fuels: Supplies for propane and distillate fuel oil are available from several distributors in a 25-mile area.

WATER AND SEWERAGE:

Water: The City of Mt. Olivet Water Department serves the city and purchases treated water from the Western Fleming Water District. The source of raw water is the Licking River. The Western Fleming Water District treatment plant capacity is 1,000,000 gallons per day. Mt. Olivet's average daily consumption is 160,000 gallons and peak daily consumption is 200,000 gallons. Local storage capacity is 100,000 gallons. The City of Mt. Olivet Water Department and the Buffalo Trail Water Association have plans to merge and become the Buffalo Trail Water District.

Sewerage: Septic tanks are being utilized for sewage disposal at the present time. A 201 study of the sewerage facilities in Mt. Olivet has been completed. Recommendations include the construction of a package treatment plant with a design capacity of 25,000 gallons per day. Funding for the treatment plant is tentatively scheduled for 1986.

GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE:

City: Mt. Olivet is governed by a mayor elected to a four-year term and six council members elected to two-year terms.

County: Robertson County citizens elect a county judge/executive and five magistrates to four-year terms of office.

EDUCATION: One school system serves Robertson County. Total enrollment in the Robertson County school system is 450, including 210 elementary and 240 high school students. The Central Kentucky State Vocational-Technical School is located in Lexington, 52 miles from Mt. Olivet. Two area vocational education centers, one at Maysville and one at Cynthiana, are located within 25 miles of Mt. Olivet.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Telephone: Continental Telephone Company of Kentucky provides service to Mt. Olivet.

Telegraph: A Western Union toll-free number (800-325-5100) is available for sending mailgrams, telegrams and international messages.

Newspaper: The Robertson County Review is a weekly publication serving Robertson County with a circulation of about 850.

Television: Major television networks are received, without cable, from Lexington, Kentucky, and Cincinnati, Ohio.

OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

Hospitals: The nearest hospital is the Meadowview Regional Hospital in Maysville, 23 miles away. The recently constructed hospital has 111 acute care beds. The Harrison Memorial Hospital in Cynthiana, 24 miles away, has 89 acute care beds and 10 skilled nursing beds.

Churches: There are four churches in Mt. Olivet. Denominations are Assembly of God, Baptist, Christian and Methodist.

Financial Institutions: The Farmers and Traders Bank of Mt. Olivet, Kentucky, Inc., provides financial services to the city.

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
