



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# GREENSBURG, KENTUCKY - A RESOURCE PROFILE

Greensburg, the county seat of Green County, is located in south central Kentucky. The city had a 1990 population of 1,990. Greensburg is located 84 miles south of Louisville, Kentucky; 138 miles northeast of Nashville, Tennessee; and 323 miles southeast of St. Louis, Missouri.

Green County, with a land area of 288 square miles, is located in the Mississippian Plateaus Region of south central Kentucky. In 1990, Green County had a population of 10,371.

Greensburg re-certified as a "Kentucky Certified City" in 1993 for its fourth consecutive year. Re-certification is based on achievement in the following areas: existing industry assistance, small business assistance, educational resources, and community development factors of health care, public safety, arts and culture, recreation, governmental awareness and resources. The Certified Cities Program is sponsored by the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce.


The Economic Framework - The total number of Green County residents employed in 1992 averaged 4,912. Manufacturing firms in the county reported 859 employees; wholesale and retail trade provided 342 jobs; 286 people were employed in service occupations; state and local government accounted for 521 employees; and contract construction firms provided 22 jobs.

Labor Supply - There is a current estimated labor supply of 5,006 persons available for industrial jobs in the labor market area. In addition, from 1994 through 1998, 6,072 young persons in the area will become 18 years of age and potentially available for industrial jobs.

Transportation - Highways serving Greensburg are U.S. Highway 68, a "AAA"-rated trucking highway; Kentucky Route 61 a "AA"-rated trucking highway; and Kentucky Route 70. Eleven trucking companies provide interstate and/or intrastate service to Greensburg. The nearest rail service is provided by CSX Transportation at Munfordville, 27 miles west of Greensburg. The Taylor County Airport, twelve miles northeast, has a 5,000-foot paved runway. The nearest scheduled commercial airline service is available at Standiford Field in Louisville, 80 miles north; and at the Blue Grass Airport, 89 miles northeast, near Lexington.

Power and Fuel - Electric power is provided to Greensburg and portion of Green County by the Kentucky Utilities Company. Green County is also served by the Taylor County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation. Natural gas service is provided to Greensburg by the Western Kentucky Gas Company.

Education - Primary and secondary education in Greensburg and Green County is provided by the Green County School System. There are seven colleges and universities located within 70 miles of Greensburg. Vocational training is available locally at the Green County Area Vocational Education Center. The Elizabethtown State Vocational-Technical School, 40 miles northwest, is the nearest state vocational-technical school. Vocational training is also available in Somerset, 62 miles south of Greensburg.



#### LABOR MARKET STATISTICS

The Greensburg Labor Market Area includes Green County and the adjoining Kentucky counties of Adair, Hart, LaRue, Metcalfe, and Taylor.



# UNEMPLOYMENT RATES 1992





# AVERAGE PLACEMENT WAGES



#### TRANSPORTATION

# Highways

Direct access to Greensburg is provided by U.S. Highway 68, a "AAA"-rated trucking highway (80,000-pound gross load limit), and by Kentucky Route 61, a "AA"-rated trucking highway (62,000-pound gross load limit). Kentucky Route 70 also serves Greensburg. Interchanges of Interstate 65, a major north-south route, are located near Munfordville, 28 miles west, via Kentucky Highways 61 and 88; and at Elizabethtown, 40 miles northwest, via Kentucky 61. The Western Kentucky Parkway and the Bluegrass Parkway are multi-lane, east-west highways which are accessible at Elizabethtown. The Cumberland Parkway, a multi-lane, east-west toll road, is located 31 miles south of Greensburg via U.S. Highway 68.

Phase I of the reconstruction of U.S. Highway 68 has been completed. Phase II, which will complete reconstruction from Greensburg to Campbellsville is scheduled to be completed in 1996. Kentucky Route 61 has also been reconstructed from U.S. 68 to Kentucky 88. Another portion of Kentucky 61 from Kentucky 88 to Summersville is planned for reconstruction and scheduled for completion in 1996.



#### LOCAL GOVERNMENT

#### Structure

The City of Greensburg is served by a mayor and six council members. The mayor serves a four-year term and the council members serve two-year terms. Green County is served by a county judge/executive and five magistrates. The judge/executive and magistrates are elected to serve four-year terms.

#### Local Fees and Licenses

The City of Greensburg levies a vehicle permit fee of \$20 per year. An unloading license fee of \$5 to \$50, depending on size of vehicle, is also assessed by the City.

# PROPERTY TAXES

The Kentucky Constitution requires the state to tax all classes of taxable property, and state statutes allow local jurisdictions to tax only a few classes. All locally taxed property is subject to county taxes and school district taxes (either a county school district or an independent school district). Property located inside of city limits may also be subject to city property taxes.

Special local taxing jurisdictions (fire protection districts, watershed districts, and sanitation districts) levy taxes within their operating areas (usually a small portion of community or county).

Property assessments in Kentucky are at 100% fair cash value. Accounts receivable are taxed at 85% of face value.

# **Customized Training**

The Kentucky Tech system, through its Training and Development Coordinators, will provide technical assistance and will identify and develop low cost customized training programs and services for both established and prospective businesses. Businesses wanting to establish a customized training program should contact a Training and Development Coordinator located on the campus of Somerset SVTS.

#### Assessment Services

Kentucky Tech Career Connections offers to business, education, and government agencies customized assessment in career inventories, interest inventories, psychomotor skills and academic potential, as well as pre-hire assessment. A Career Connections Assessment Center is located on the campus of Somerset SVTS.

# Tech Prep

Tech Prep is a combined secondary and postsecondary program of studies that leads to an associate degree or diploma in a vocational-technical field. In Greensburg, the Green County Board of Education is in the third year implementation of its tech prep program in Health Technology, Home Economics, and Business.

# Adult Education Services

Adult education programs are available to adults who want to develop new skills, improve basic skills or earn a high school equivalency diploma. In Greensburg, adult literacy and adult basic education are provided through Green County AVEC.

# Bluegrass State Skills Corporation

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation, an independent public corporation created and funded by the Kentucky General Assembly, provides programs of skills training to meet the needs of business and industry from entry level to advanced training, and from upgrading present employees to retraining experienced workers.

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation is a major source for skills training assistance for a new or existing company. The Corporation works in partnership with other employment and job training resources and programs, as well as Kentucky's economic development activities, to package a program customized to meet the specific needs of a company.

# Local

The American Legion Park is a 65-acre community park located in Green County. The park was developed and financed by local residents. Recreational facilities available are: a swimming pool, ball fields, pavilion, horse show ring, fishing area, equipped playground, horseshoe pits, tennis courts, and an indoor dining facility. Four additional public tennis courts are located at the elementary school.

Other recreational and architectural points of interest are located in Green County. Greensburg has the oldest courthouse west of the Alleghenies. This building was completed in 1803. The two-story structure has been renovated and is now open to the public. Other points of interest include the home of Jeremiah Abell, Presbyterian minister who served as missionary and pastor in Green and surrounding counties during the early 1800's; the site of the home of Jane Todd Crawford on whom Dr. Ephraim McDowell performed the first successful ovariotomy in 1809; General E.H. Hobson's Home; a Court Clerk's office built in 1818; a water powered sawmill; Mt. Gilead Church, which is built on the site of the camp of the "Long Hunters" who came to Kentucky in 1769; the Old Bank Building, which originally housed the Bank of Kentucky; Old Vaughn or Allen's Inn; Pendleton House; Ben Will Penick House; Shreve House, which originally housed the Greensburg Academy; Simpson House, the birthplace of Abraham Lincoln's law partner; and a scenic footbridge.
