

LABOR ORGANIZATIONS:

There are no unions representing manufacturing workers in Carlisle at this time.

TRANSPORTATION:

Rail: Carlisle is served by TTI Railroad, which is a line running from Paris to Maysville. Services include stops daily and Saturday when needed; team track with space for 10 cars; siding space for 20 cars; and switching facilities. The nearest piggyback facilities are at Frankfort, about 60 miles from Carlisle.

<u>Highways</u>: Carlisle is served by Kentucky 36 and 32 and U.S. 68 which is three miles west of Carlisle. Carlisle is within 35 miles of both Interstate 75 and Interstate 64

Road Distance in Miles:

<u>Truck</u>: McLean Trucking Company provides interstate and Smith's Transfer Corporation provides intrastate service to Carlisle. Both interstate and intrastate trucking service is provided by O.K. Trucking Company and Bronaugh Motor Express.

<u>Water</u>: Terminal facilities are located on the Ohio River in the Northern Kentucky-Cincinnati area, 116 miles from Carlisle.

Air: Blue Grass Field at Lexington, 36 miles from Carlisle, is the nearest commercial airport. Services at Blue Grass Field include Delta, Eastern, Piedmont, USAir, and Tennessee Airways, a commuter air carrier. The nearest local airport is the Cynthiana-Harrison County Airport, 19 miles west of Carlisle. This field has one paved 3,200-foot runway.

UTILITIES:

Electricity: Kentucky Utilities Company serves Carlisle and parts of Nicholas County. Fleming-Mason RECC and Harrison RECC also serve Nicholas County. The source of power for both RECC's is East Kentucky Power Cooperative.

 $\frac{\text{Natural Gas}}{\text{is Columbia}}$: Carlisle Gas Company serves the city. The source of supply to Carlisle

Other Fuels: One distributor of propane and two distributors of distillate fuel oil are located in Carlisle.

WATER AND SEWERAGE:

<u>Water</u>: Carlisle is served by the Carlisle Municipal Water Plant and the source of raw water is impounded lakes and the Licking River. The treatment plant capacity is 710,000 gallons per day and average daily consumption is 377,000 gallons. Peak daily consumption has reached capacity and storage capacity is 1,168,000 gallons.

Sewerage: The City of Carlisle Sewage Disposal Plant serves Carlisle. The design capacity of the treatment plant is 220,000 gallons per day, average daily flow is 90,000 gallons, and treatment is primary and secondary.

GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE:

<u>City</u>: Carlisle is served by a mayor elected to a four-year term and six councilmen elected to two-year terms.

<u>County</u>: Nicholas County is served by a county judge/executive and five magistrates elected to four-year terms.

EDUCATION: One school system operates in Nicholas County. Total enrollment is 1,270 including 900 elementary and 370 high school students. The nearest state vocational school is Central Kentucky State Vocational-Technical School in Lexington, 36 miles away. Harrison County Area Vocational Education Center is located in Cynthiana, 33 miles from Carlisle.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Telephone: South Central Bell Telephone Company serves Carlisle with standard services.

<u>Telegraph</u>: Counter service is available in Paris, Kentucky, 17 miles away. A Western Union toll-free number is also available for sending mailgrams, telegrams and international messages.

Newspaper: The Carlisle Mercury is published weekly in Carlisle and circulation is 2,500.

<u>Television</u>: Major networks are received without cable from Lexington, Kentucky, and Cincinnati, Ohio. KLR Cable TV is received from Stanton, Kentucky.

OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

<u>Hospitals</u>: The Nicholas County Hospital and the Johnson Mathers Nursing Home are located in Carlisle. The hospital has 28 acute beds available.

<u>Churches</u>: There are eight churches in Carlisle. Denominations include Assembly of God, Baptist, Catholic, Christian, Methodist, and Presbyterian.

<u>Financial Institutions</u>: The First National Bank of Carlisle and the Deposit Bank of Carlisle provide financial services.
