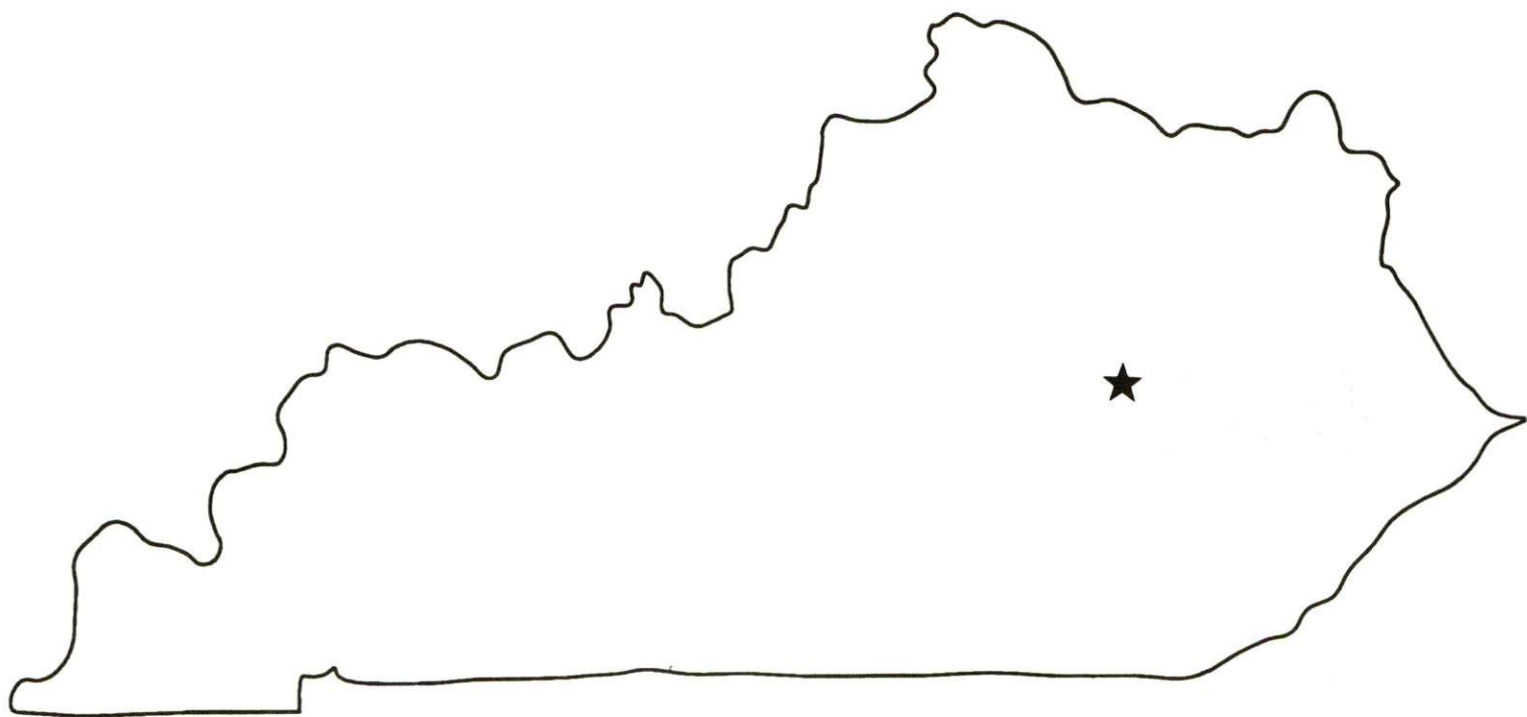

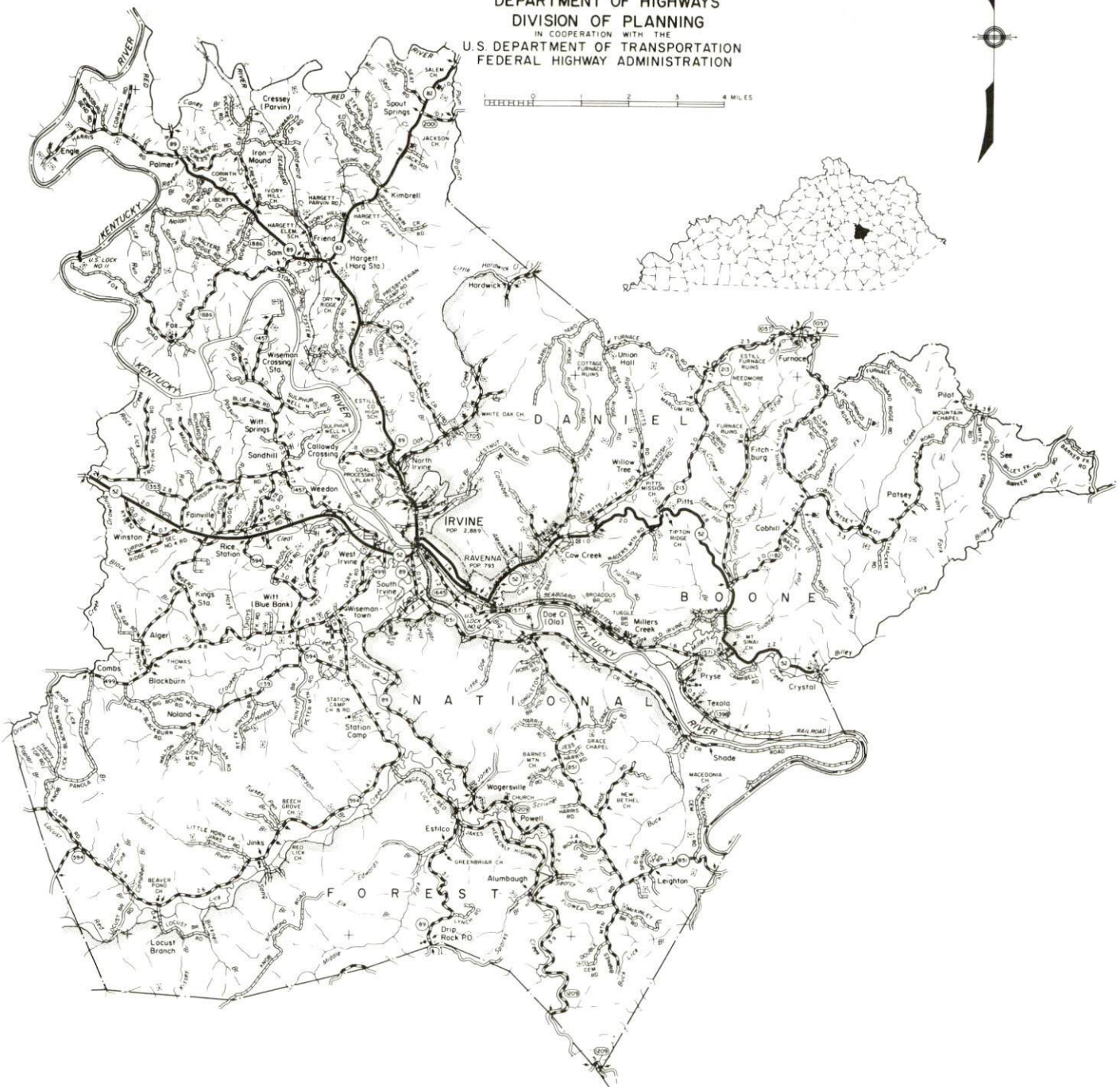

ESTILL COUNTY, KENTUCKY - A RESOURCE PROFILE

Irvine, located on the banks of the Kentucky River, is the county seat of Estill County. Irvine is located 46 miles southeast of Lexington, Kentucky; 120 miles southeast of Louisville, Kentucky; and 122 miles south of Cincinnati, Ohio. In 1992, Irvine had an estimated population of 3,330. The city of Ravenna lies immediately adjacent to Irvine. Ravenna had an estimated 1992 population of 838.

Estill County, with an estimated 1992 population of 15,204, is located along the boundary between the Outer Blue Grass and the Eastern Kentucky Coal Field Region of Kentucky.

The Economic Framework - The total number of Estill County residents employed in 1992 averaged 4,138. Manufacturing firms in the county reported 427 employees; wholesale and retail trade provided 601 jobs; 318 people were employed in service occupations; state and local government accounted for 578 employees; and contract construction firms provided 61 jobs.

Labor Supply - There is a current estimated labor supply of 9,927 persons available for industrial jobs in the labor market area. In addition, from 1994 through 1998, 9,774 young persons in the area will become 18 years of age and potentially available for industrial jobs.

Transportation - Estill County is served by Kentucky Highways 52 and 89, both "AAA"-rated trucking highways. The Mountain Parkway is located fourteen miles north of Irvine. Interstate 75 is twenty-three miles west of Irvine. Nine common carrier trucking companies provide interstate and/or intrastate service to Irvine and Ravenna. CSX Transportation provides main line rail service to Estill County. The nearest scheduled commercial airline service is available at Blue Grass Airport, four miles west of Lexington, fifty-three miles northwest of Irvine. Stanton Airport, maintaining a 3,000-foot runway; and Madison Airport, maintaining a 4,000-foot runway, are both small craft airports within twenty-seven miles of Irvine.

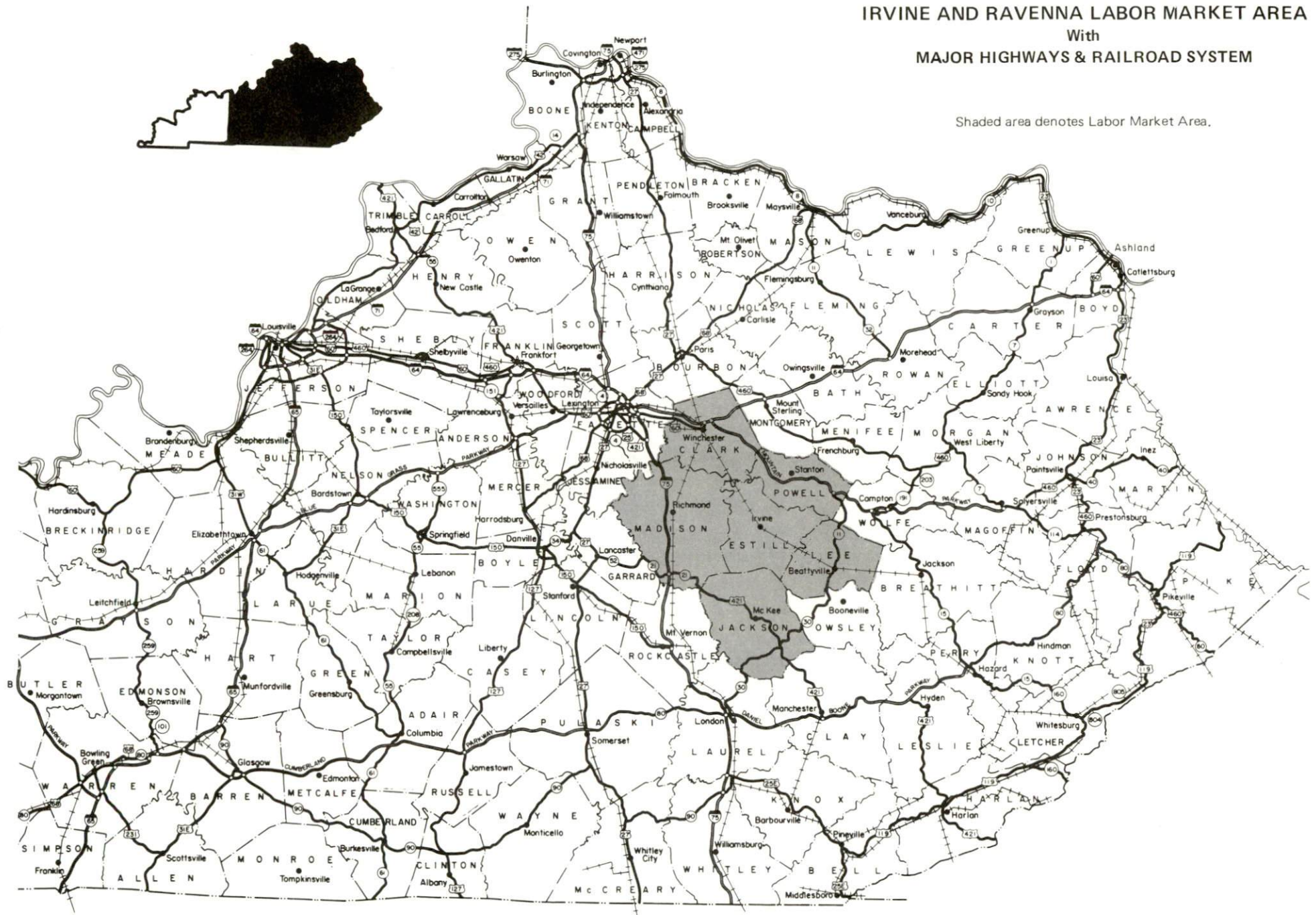
Power and Fuel - Electric power is provided to Irvine, Ravenna and a portion of Estill County by Kentucky Utilities Company. Estill County is also served by Jackson County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation, which is supplied by East Kentucky Power. Natural gas service to Irvine and Ravenna is provided by Columbia Gas of Kentucky which is supplied by Columbia Gas Transmission Corporation.

Education - Primary and secondary education is provided to Irvine and Ravenna by the Estill County School System. Three universities, three senior colleges and one community college are located within sixty miles of Irvine. Vocational training is provided by the Madison County Area Vocational Education Center, in Richmond, twenty-one miles west; and the Central Kentucky State Vocational-Technical School, in Lexington, forty-six miles northwest.

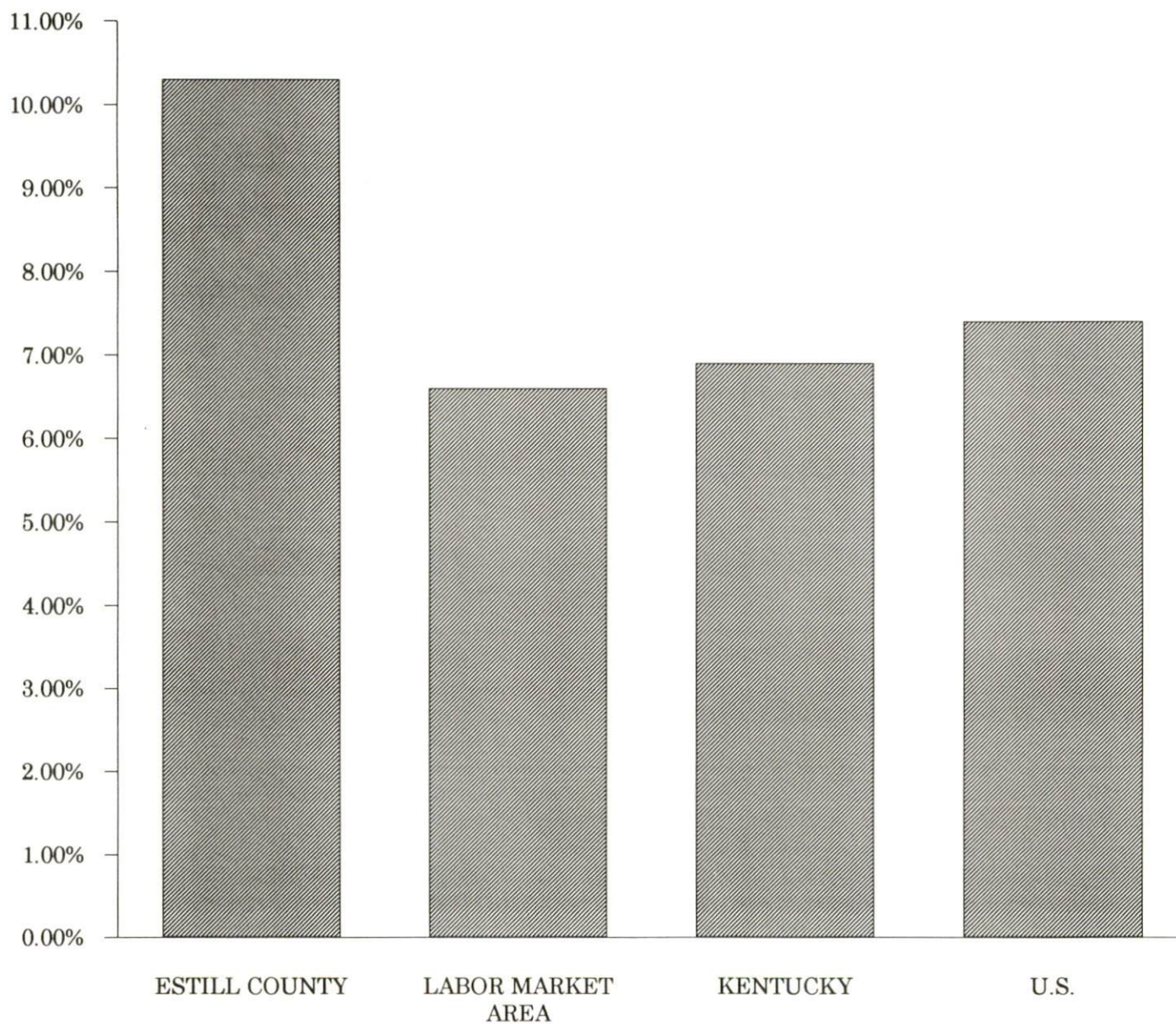

UNEMPLOYMENT RATES 1992

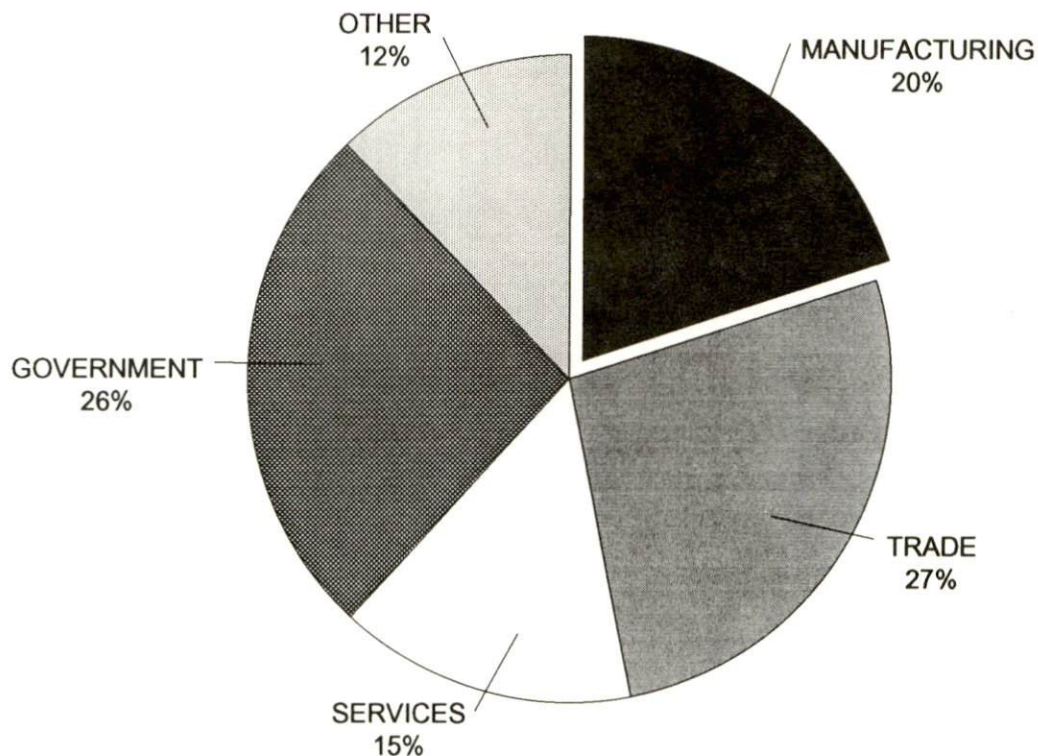

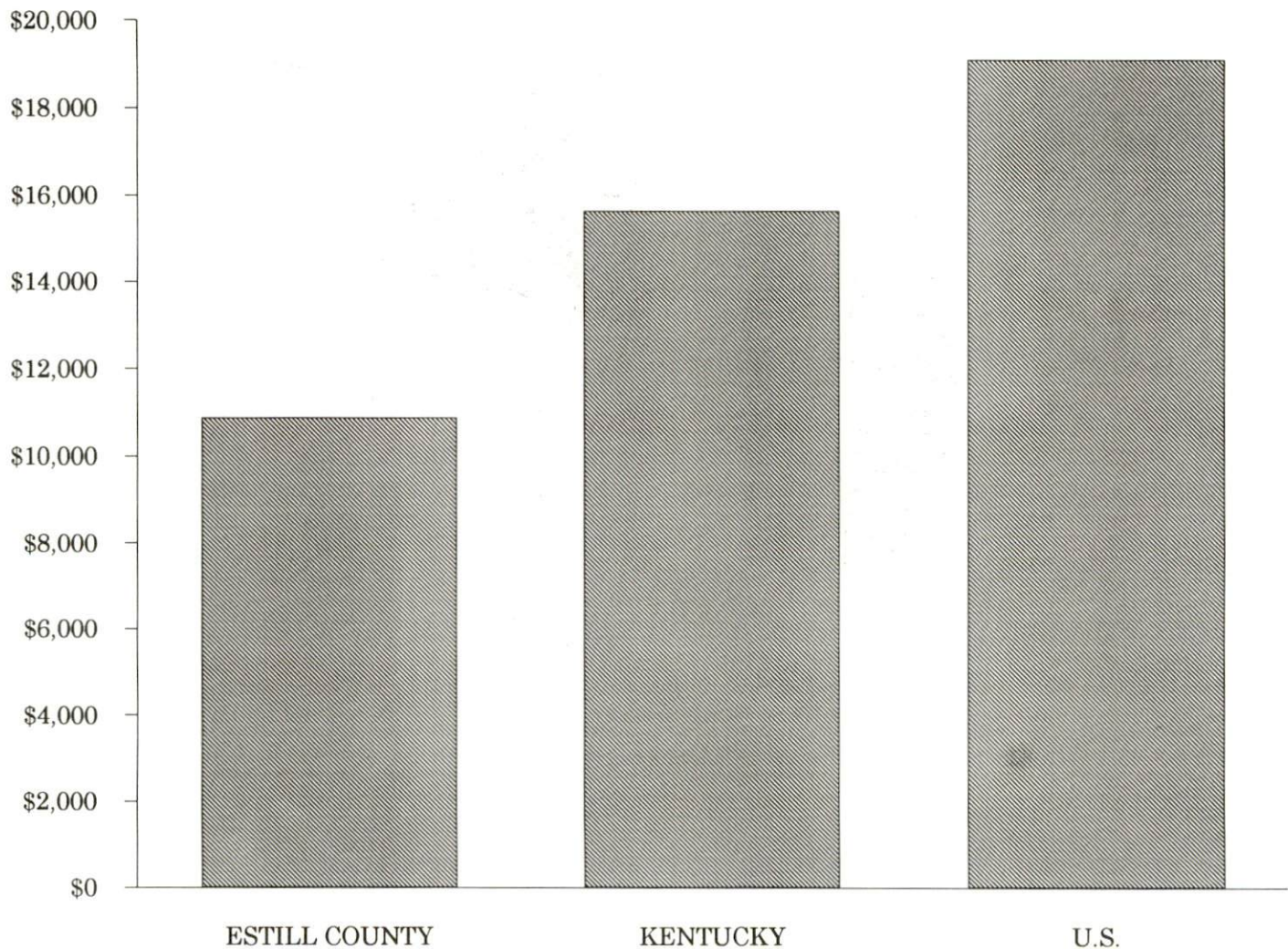

AVERAGE PLACEMENT WAGES

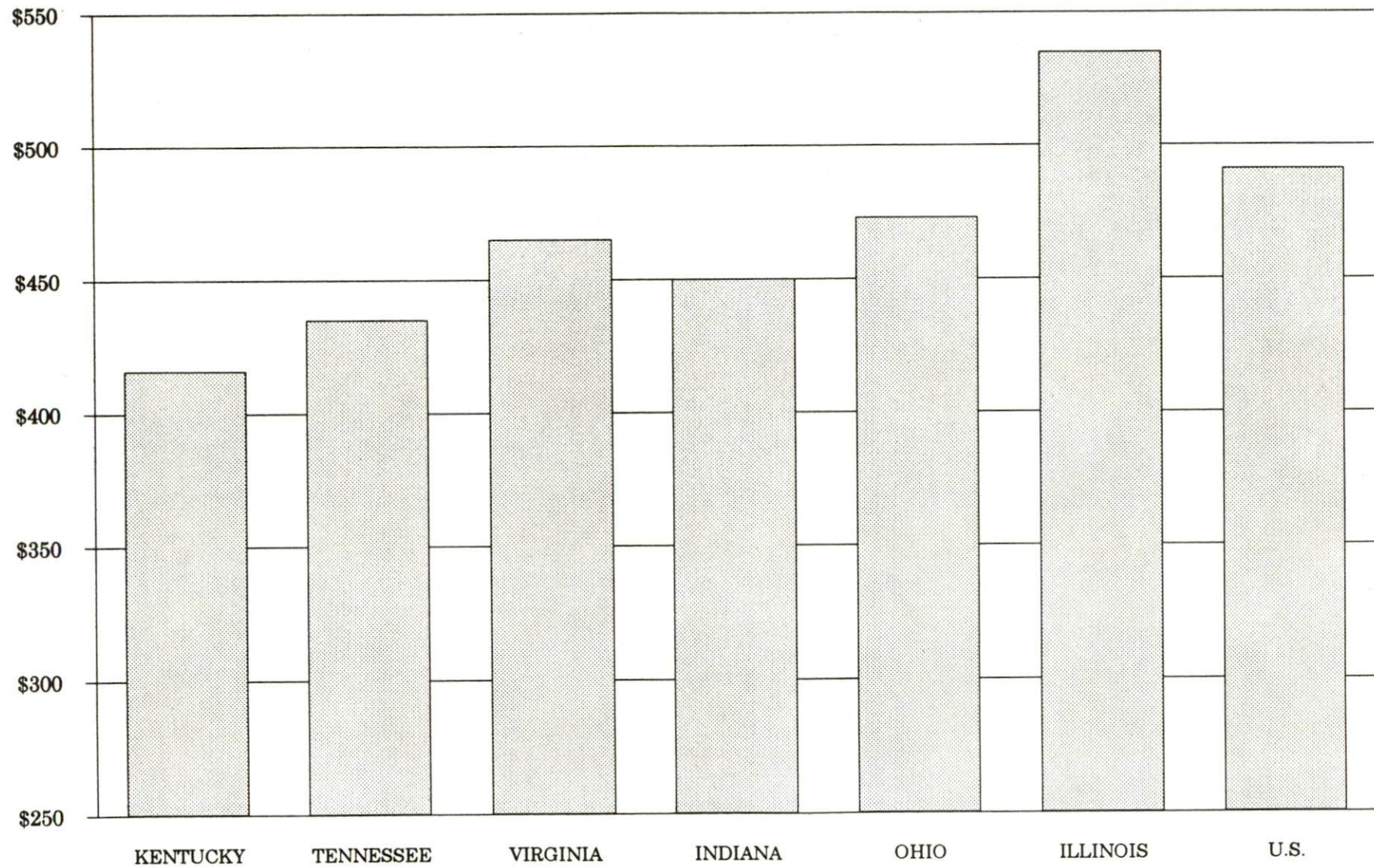

RECENT INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENTS

The grand opening of the new Estill County Industrial Park was held in November 1993. The Park contains 62 acres and has access to all utilities.

Carhartt, Inc. is presently constructing a new plant in the industrial park. The \$2.0 million plant will be completed in the summer of 1994 and employ approximately 400 persons. The existing facility will be used for warehousing.

TRANSPORTATION

Highways

Estill County is served by Kentucky Highways 52 and 89, both "AAA"-rated (80,000-pound gross load limit) trucking highways. The Mountain Parkway is accessible 14 miles north of Irvine via Kentucky Highways 89 and 82. The Mountain Parkway provides multi-lane highway access to eastern Kentucky and to Interstate 64. Interstate 75, a major north-south corridor, is located 23 miles west of Irvine via Kentucky Highway 52.

Construction of a new bridge and bypass connecting Kentucky 52 and Kentucky 89 is currently in the design phase. The cost of the project is approximately \$8.2 million. River Drive, from Irvine to Ravenna, is scheduled to be widened to three lanes.

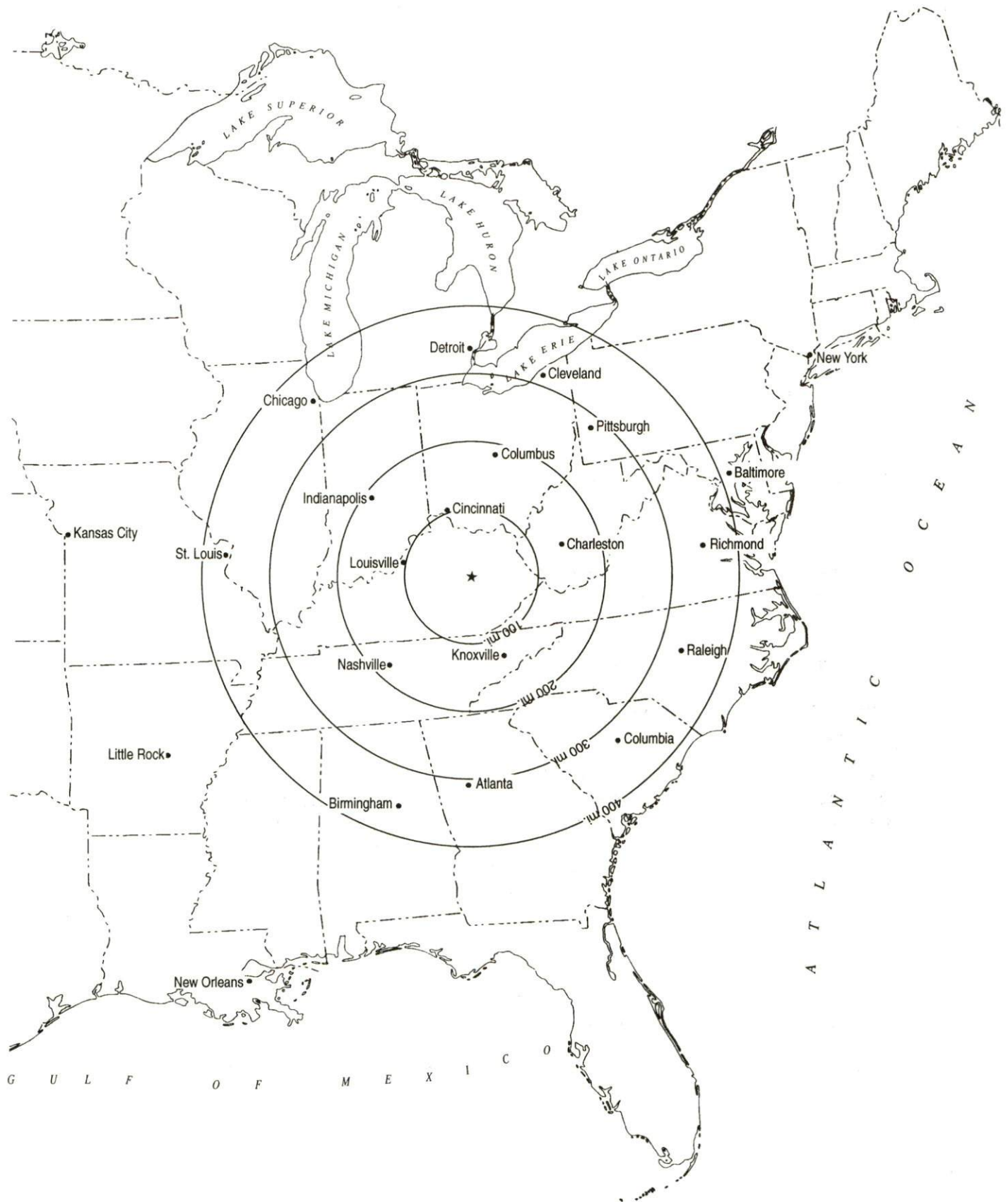

LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Structure

Irvine and Ravenna are each served by a mayor and six council members. Estill County is served by a county judge/executive and three magistrates.

Planning and Zoning

City agency - Irvine Planning & Zoning Commission

Zoning enforced - Yes

Subdivision regulations enforced - Within city and five miles beyond corporate limits

Local Fees and Licenses

The City of Irvine levies business license fees that range from \$10 to \$200 annually. The City of Ravenna levies business license fees that range from \$30 to \$100 annually. Estill County levies an occupational license tax of 0.75% on wages, salaries, and commissions of individuals and on net profits of businesses (\$350 maximum).

PROPERTY TAXES

The Kentucky Constitution requires the state to tax all classes of taxable property, and state statutes allow local jurisdictions to tax only a few classes. All locally taxed property is subject to county taxes and school district taxes (either a county school district or an independent school district). Property located inside of city limits may also be subject to city property taxes.

Special local taxing jurisdictions (fire protection districts, watershed districts, and sanitation districts) levy taxes within their operating areas (usually a small portion of community or county).

Property assessments in Kentucky are at 100% fair cash value. Accounts receivable are taxed at 85% of face value.

STATE PROPERTY TAX RATES PER \$100 VALUATION

VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL TRAINING

Kentucky Tech schools are operated by the Cabinet for Workforce Development and provide secondary (Sec) and postsecondary (P/S) vocational-technical training.

A five-million-dollar expansion was completed at Kentucky Tech-Central in the fall of 1992. The expansion includes a new manufacturing technology building that houses manufacturing related programs such as machine tool technology, computer aided drafting, electronics and industry electrical technology. A computer-integrated work cell laboratory in one room of the building links all the programs, simulating the operation of an actual manufacturing plant. Applied physics, hydraulics and quality control applications are integrated into the curriculum.

Another room in the new building can be used by business and industry for start-up and new production training.

Moving all manufacturing-related training into one building provided space for Kentucky Tech-Central to add health care programs as part of its expansion. These include medical imaging, medical assisting, bio-medical technician and laboratory technician programs.

Customized Training

The Kentucky Tech system, through its Training and Development Coordinators, will provide technical assistance and will identify and develop low-cost customized training programs and services for both established and prospective businesses. Businesses wanting to establish a customized training program should simply contact a Training and Development Coordinator located at the Kentucky Tech North Central Region office in Lexington.

Assessment Services

Kentucky Tech Career Connections offers to business, education, and government agencies testing packages for evaluating job applicants, selecting employees for promotional consideration and developing training programs within the organization. A Career Connections Assessment Center is located on the campus of Central Kentucky SVTS.

Adult Education Services

Adult education programs are available to adults who want to develop new skills, improve basic skills or earn a high school equivalency diploma. In Estill County, adult education and adult literacy programs are provided through the Estill County Board of Education.

Bluegrass State Skills Corporation

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation, an independent public corporation created and funded by the Kentucky General Assembly, provides programs of skills training to meet the needs of business and industry from entry level to advanced training, and from upgrading present employees to retraining experienced workers.

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation is a major source for skills training assistance for a new or existing company. The Corporation works in partnership with other employment and job training resources and programs, as well as Kentucky's economic development activities, to package a program customized to meet the specific needs of a company.

RECREATION

Local

Public recreation facilities in Irvine are centered around the Kiwanis Park. Facilities at this park include four baseball diamonds and a public swimming pool. A public park in Ravenna contains a picnic area, playground, and a tennis court. The Kentucky River provides opportunities for boating, fishing, and swimming enthusiasts.

Among private recreational facilities in the area are a country club with a nine-hole golf course, an indoor movie theater, and a pleasure boat dock.

Some of the highlights of the county are the Estill County Fair, held annually in August; and the Kentucky River Folk Festival, an annual event held in September which features folk music, arts, crafts, entertainment booths, food and refreshments.

Estill County is located in an area that provides excellent recreational facilities. The Cottage Furnace Recreation Area and the Fitchburg Furnace, located in the northeastern part of the county, provide facilities for picnicking and camping, as well as historical sites.

The Daniel Boone National Forest, located within Estill County, covers 640,000 acres of timberland in eastern Kentucky. It encompasses much of Kentucky's great beauty and provides a vacation paradise. There are scenic hiking trails, rivers, and streams stocked with a variety of fish, hunting preserves, camping sites, and numerous other natural and historical attractions.
