



LABOR ORGANIZATIONS:

Presently there are no unions representing manufacturing workers in New Castle.

TRANSPORTATION:

Rail: Campbellsburg is on a main line of the Louisville and Nashville Railroad.

Services include 1 northbound and 1 southbound freight stopping Monday through Friday; 5 northbound and 5 southbound through freights daily; and team track space for 2 cars. The nearest piggyback facilities are located at Louisville, 38 miles away. New Castle is not directly served by any railway system but the nearest rail service is at Campbellsburg, 8 miles away.

<u>Highways</u>: U.S. Highway 421 passes through both New Castle and Campbellsburg and is the connecting route to Interstate 71. This interstate, located 2 miles from Campbellsburg and 10 miles from New Castle, is the major highway between Louisville and Cincinnati.

Road Distance in Miles from New Castle:

Truck: One truck line provides New Castle with interstate motor carrier service and three truck lines provide both interstate and intrastate service to the city. Two truck lines provide interstate motor carrier service to Campbellsburg and there are three lines providing both interstate and intrastate service.

<u>Water:</u> New Castle is 20 miles and Campbellsburg is 12 miles from Carrollton, Kentucky, where the Kentucky River and the Ohio River converge.

Air: The nearest commercial airport is Standiford Field at Louisville, 38 miles from New Castle. This airport is served by TWA, American, Eastern, Delta, Piedmont, Ozark, Allegheny and Air Kentucky (commuter) Airlines.

UTILITIES:

Electricity: Kentucky Utilities Company serves New Castle, Campbellsburg and parts of Henry County. The major portion of Henry County is served by Shelby RECC whose source of power is East Kentucky Power Cooperative.

Natural Gas: Louisville Gas and Electric Company serves New Castle and Campbellsburg and the source of supply is Texas Gas Transmission Corporation.

Other Fuels: One propane distributor and four distributors of distillate fuel oil are located in Henry County. Additional supplies are available from major distributors in Louisville, 38 miles away.

WATER AND SEWERAGE:

Water: New Castle Water Works serves the city and the source of supply is Henry County Water District No. 2. The average daily consumption is 57,000 gallons and peak daily consumption is 75,000 gallons. Storage capacity for New Castle is 40,000 gallons. Campbellsburg water service is provided by Campbellsburg Water Works and the source of supply is Henry County Water District No. 2. The average daily consumption is 35,500 gallons and peak daily consumption is 43,160 gallons. Storage capacity for Campbellsburg is 75,000 gallons.

Sewerage: New Castle Sewerage System serves the city and the design capacity of the treatment plant is 120,000 gallons per day. The average daily flow is 60,000 gallons and treatment is primary. A study of the municipal sewerage system has been completed and the city is preparing application for funds for the design and engineering stage of a 201 Facilities Plan to upgrade the treatment plant. Campbellsburg Water Company provides sewerage service to the city and the design capacity of the treatment plant is 105,000 gallons per day. Average daily flow is 50,000 gallons and treatment is tertiary.

GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE:

<u>City</u>: New Castle and Campbellsburg are served by 5-member boards of trustees elected to 2-year terms.

County: Henry County is served by a county judge/executive and 6 magistrates elected to 4-year terms.

EDUCATION: Students in New Castle and Campbellsburg are served by the Henry County School System. There are 740 elementary, 514 middle school and 650 high school students in the county system. The nearest state vocational school is Jefferson State Vocational-Technical School at Jeffersontown, 39 miles from New Castle. Shelby County Area Vocational Education Center is 16 miles from New Castle.

Newspaper: The Henry County Local is published weekly in New Castle and current

Television: Most major network programs are received, without cable, from Louisville and OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

Hospitals: The nearest hospitals are The King's Daughters' Hospital in Shelbyville, 16 miles from New Castle, and the Carroll County Memorial Hospital in Carrollton, 20 miles from New Castle. There are 76 beds available at the Shelbyville facility and the hospital at Carrollton has a total of 80 beds.

Churches: There are six churches in New Castle and six in Campbellsburg. Henry County has a total of approximately 50 churches. Many of the major denominations are
