





Occupational wage rates for specific industries are usually not available to most government agencies, and wage data furnished to state employment agencies by individual industrial employers is protected from disclosure by federal law. The most reliable up-to-date wage information can be obtanied by direct contact with local employers.

Associated Industries of Kentucky, a voluntary organization of Kentucky businesses, regularly collects occupational wage rates and fringe benefits data from participating member firms. Data is compiled for over 127 clearly defined office, production, and service occupations. Tabulations are published for seven regions of Kentucky, as shown on the map below. It should be noted that the data may be weighted by the preponderance of firms in the larger cities and may be somewhat higher than the rates paid in the smaller communities. Data from these tabulations are available, upon request, from the Kentucky Department of Commerce, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.

#### Property Taxes

All property in Kentucky is assessed at 100 percent of fair cash value.

Land and buildings are taxed by the state and may be taxed by local jurisdictions. The state rate is \$0.315 per \$100 of assessed valuation. Beginning January 1, 1977, local school tax rates were reduced by \$0.30 per \$100 valuation and the state rate was increased by \$0.30 per \$100 (from \$0.015), resulting in no net change in the combined state and local rates.

Manufacturing machinery, raw materials inventories, pollution control equipment, and goods in the process of manufacture are not subject to local taxation. The state rate is \$0.15 per \$100.

Other tangible personal property owned by manufacturers (automobiles, trucks, finished goods, office furniture, office equipment) is taxed by the state at \$0.45 per \$100 and may be taxed by local jurisdictions. Beginning January 1, 1977, local school rates were reduced by \$0.30 per \$100 valuation and the state rate was raised by \$0.30 per \$100 (from \$0.15).

Property stored in public warehouses in a transit status is not subject to local taxation. The state rate is only \$0.015 per \$100.

Intangible personal property located in Kentucky (money in hand, shares of stock, notes, bonds, accounts, and other credits) is taxed by the state at \$0.25 per \$100, and is not subject to local taxation. (Contd.) Intangible personal property owned by corporations in Kentucky as a result of business transactions performed out-of-state, but having a tax situs in Kentucky (accounts receivable, notes, bonds, credits, non-domestic bank deposits, licensing or royalty agreements, shares of stock of any affiliated company, etc.) is taxed by the state at \$0.015 and is not subject to local taxation.

#### RECREATION

#### Loca1

Public recreation facilities include five playgrounds, a swimming pool, four tennis courts, two baseball diamonds, two softball fields, two football fields, and a community center. Other recreational facilities include a country club and 9-hole golf course. Tourist attractions include the Abraham Lincoln Birthplace National Historical Site, Lincoln's Knob Creek Home, and the Lincoln Day Celebration.

Area (Within 50 miles)

Hodgenville is located within easy driving distance of several excellent recreational areas.

My Old Kentucky Home State Park is 25 miles from Hodgenville. Federal Hill, the original Old Kentucky Home, has been preserved in every detail, and is an outstanding example of Kentucky Georgian-Colonial architecture. This park has a gift shop, amphitheater, playgrounds, and camping accommodations. "The Stephen Foster Story," a nationally famous outdoor drama, is presented in the amphitheater during the summer months.

Green River Lake State Park is located 30 miles from Hodgenville. Facilities on this 8,200-acre lake include a marina, boat dock, beach, and 100 primitive campsites.

Lincoln Homestead State Shrine is a 153-acre park located only 42 miles northeast of Hodgenville. A replica of the cabin occupied by Abraham Lincoln during his boyhood has been built on the spot where the original 1792 cabin stood. The park also features an 18-hole golf course, gift shop, museum, and several picnic areas.

Mammoth Cave National Park, 50 miles southwest of the city, is world famous. Mammoth Cave consists of one of the largest cave networks ever discovered with at least 150 miles of charted caverns and vast areas not yet mapped. Some famous attractions of the cave include the Snowball Dining Room (267 feet below surface), Frozen Niagara, Crystal Lake, and Bottomless Pit. The 51,000 surface acres of the National park provide a beautiful wild life preserve filled with nature trails and overlooks. A scenic boat trip on the Green River, an amphitheatre, and a visitor center exhibit room with audiovisual programs hourly are additional features of the park. Hotel, lodge, and cottage accommodations are available at the park.

#### COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENTS

#### Recent:

1. The North Fork Nolin River Watershed program involves construction of four dams which will provide an additional raw water supply, flood control, and recreation areas. Dam #1 has been completed and a 100-acre permanent pool impounded, providing a raw water supply.

2. 8,000 feet of sewerage collector lines have been added to the municipal sewerage system.

3. A 201 Facilities Study has been completed and is being reviewed.

4. A new doctor recently located in Hodgenville.

5. The local radio station, WLCB-AM and FM, which has been in operation about three years, has recently updated all equipment and is now reaching a larger listening audience.

6. A street repaying project has been completed.

7. A 300,000-gallon water storage tank had been repainted, and 600 feet of 6-inch line and 600 feet of 4-inch line have recently been extended.

8. An existing building has been renovated and is now being used as a community center.

#### Underway:

1. A commercial complex is being developed and presently includes a new grocery, a used car dealership, and a fast-food restaurant.

2. A 20-acre site has been purchased by the city and is being developed as a city park. Recreational facilities will include tennis courts, softball area, and a swimming pool. Construction of the swimming pool will be underway by the summer of 1977. Planned:

1. A fuel oil distribution service and a small animal clinic plan to move into a commercial complex now being developed.

2. Construction of dam #2 of the North Fork Nolin River Watershed program is to begin during the summer of 1977.

3. The Larue County Rescue Squad plans to replace the station wagon now being used.

4. Plans are underway to replace and improve the sidewalks within the next two years.
