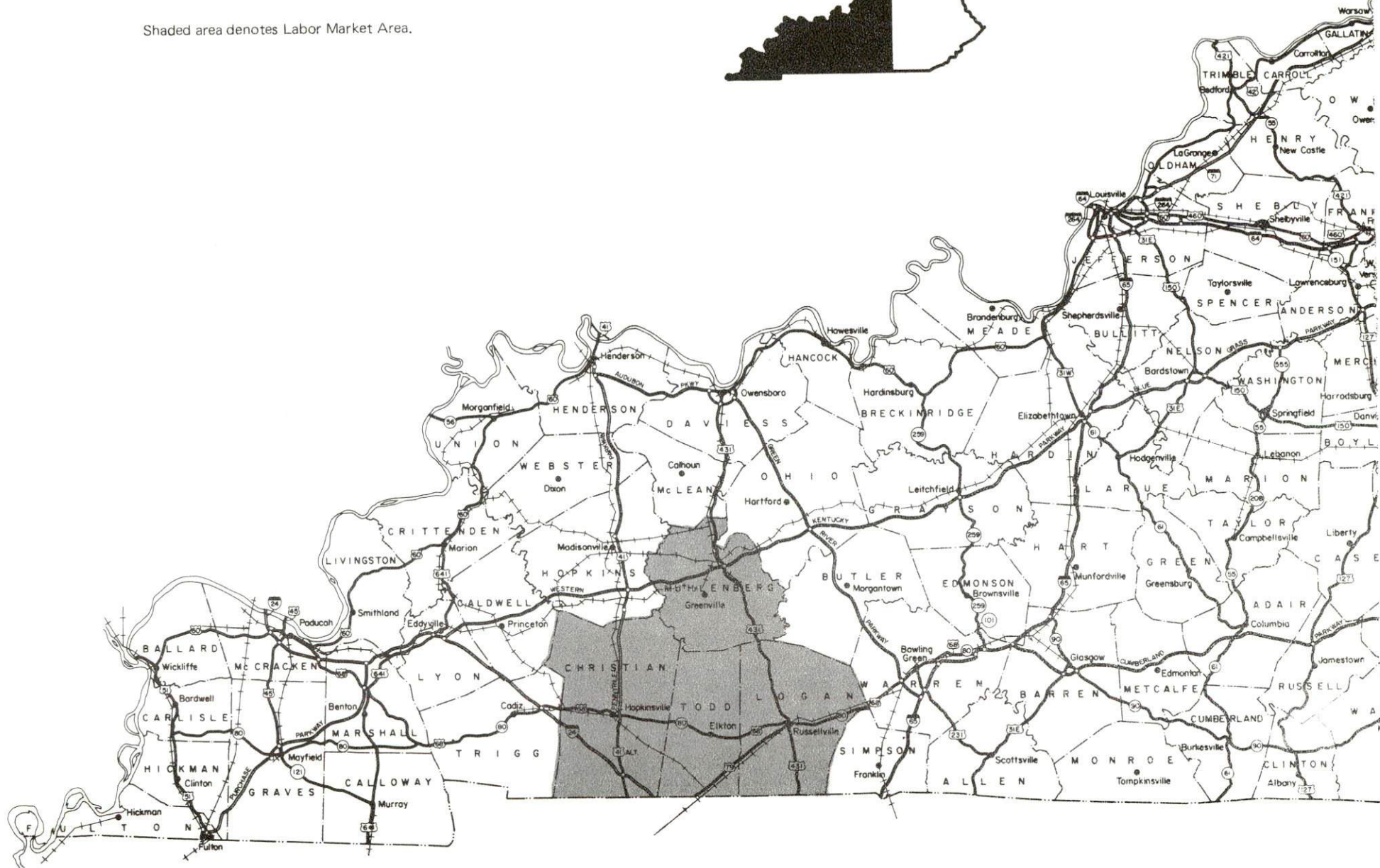
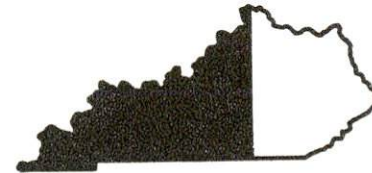




# TODD COUNTY LABOR MARKET AREA

## TODD COUNTY, KENTUCKY - A RESOURCE PROFILE

Todd County is situated in southwestern Kentucky's Mississippian Plateaus Region. Todd County is bordered on the south by the Tennessee state line and has a land area of 377 square miles. The county had a 1984 estimated population of 10,898 persons.

Elkton, the county seat, is located in central Todd County, 65 miles northwest of Nashville, Tennessee; 158 miles southwest of Louisville, Kentucky; and 265 miles southeast of St. Louis, Missouri. Elkton had a 1984 estimated population of 1,810 persons.

Guthrie is located on the Tennessee state line in southern Todd County, 13 miles south of Elkton, and had a 1984 estimated population of 1,214 persons.

Trenton, located in southwestern Todd County, had a 1984 estimated population of 390 persons.

**The Economic Framework** - The total number of Todd County residents employed in 1985 averaged 4,790, with nonagricultural jobs accounting for 3,940 workers. Manufacturing firms in the county reported 950 employees; wholesale and retail trade provided 330 jobs; 100 people were employed in service occupations; state and local government accounted for 370 employees; and contract construction firms provided 50 jobs.

**Labor Supply** - There is a current estimated labor supply of 8,810 men and 12,060 women available for industrial jobs in the labor market area. In addition, from 1986 through 1990, 10,040 young men and 9,290 young women in the area will become 18 years of age and potentially available for industrial jobs.

**Transportation** - Both Guthrie and Trenton receive rail freight service from CSX Transportation. Elkton is not served by rail. "AAA"-rated highways serving Todd County include U.S. Highway 41, which serves Trenton and Guthrie; U.S. Highway 68, which serves Elkton; and U.S. Highway 79, which serves Guthrie. In addition, two interchanges of Interstate 24 are located within 5 miles of Todd County. There are 16 common carrier trucking companies with authority to serve Todd County. The nearest scheduled commercial airline service is available at Nashville Metropolitan Airport, 71 miles southeast of Elkton, near Nashville, Tennessee. Commuter air carrier service is available at Clarksville, Tennessee's, Outlaw Field, 35 miles southwest of Elkton. Standard Field at Elkton has a 3,500-foot turf runway. The nearest navigable waterway is Lake Barkley, approximately 50 miles west of Elkton.

**Power and Fuel** - Electricity is supplied to Todd County by Pennyrite Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation, whose source of power is Tennessee Valley Authority. Natural gas service is provided to Elkton by Western Kentucky Gas Company. Natural gas service currently is not available in Guthrie or Trenton. Five propane distributors and nine fuel oil dealers are located within 20 miles of Elkton.



**Education** - The Todd County School System provides primary and secondary public education to Todd County residents, and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. One nonpublic school operates in Todd County. There are 13 institutions of higher learning located within 65 miles of Elkton. Vocational training is available at the Bowling Green State Vocational-Technical School, 45 miles east of Elkton; the Madisonville State Vocational-Technical School, 52 miles northwest of Elkton; the Russellville Area Vocational Education Center, 16 miles east of Elkton; and the Christian County Area Vocational Education Center, 20 miles west of Elkton.

## LABOR MARKET STATISTICS

The Labor Market Area includes Todd County and the adjoining Kentucky counties of Christian, Logan and Muhlenberg. The southern boundary of Todd County is formed by the Tennessee state line. The labor market area is supplemented by the Tennessee counties of Montgomery and Robertson.

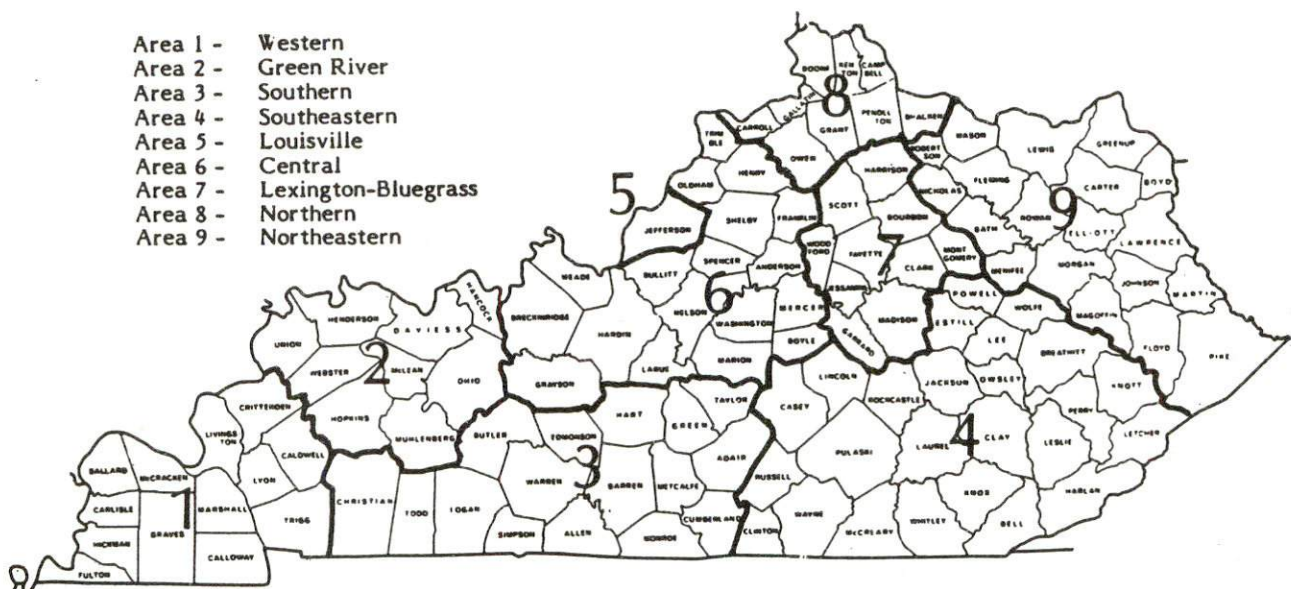

Associated Industries of Kentucky, a voluntary organization of Kentucky businesses, regularly collects occupational wage rates and fringe benefits data from participating member firms. Data are compiled for over 127 clearly defined office, production, and service occupations. Tabulations are published for nine geographical areas of Kentucky, as shown on the map below. It should be noted that the data may be weighted by the preponderance of firms in the larger cities and may be somewhat higher than the rates paid in the smaller communities. Data from these tabulations are available, upon request, from the Kentucky Department of Economic Development, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.

## **TRANSPORTATION**

### **Rail**

#### **Line serving Guthrie - CSX Transportation**

Services - Main line; one local freight originates at Guthrie and one local freight originates at Madisonville, Kentucky; one southbound and two northbound freights also make daily stops; four southbound and five northbound through freights daily; switch engine; team track space for 10 cars; siding space for 50 cars; nearest piggyback facilities available at Nashville, Tennessee, 54 miles southeast of Guthrie

#### **Line serving Trenton - CSX Transportation**

Services - Main line; two local freights provide service as needed; four southbound and five northbound through freights daily; switching services; team track space for seven cars; nearest piggyback facilities available at Nashville, Tennessee, 59 miles southeast of Trenton

Elkton is not served directly by a rail line, but the CSX Transportation lines serving Guthrie and Trenton are located within 15 miles of Elkton.

### **Highways**

"AAA"-rated (80,000-pound gross load limit) trucking highways serving Todd County include U.S. Highways 41, 68 (also designated as Kentucky Route 80), and 79, and Kentucky Route 181. U.S. Highway 41 runs through southwestern Todd County and serves the cities of Guthrie and Trenton. U.S. Highway 68 runs east to west through central Todd County and serves Elkton. U.S. Highway 79 passes through southeastern Todd County and intersects with U.S. Highway 41, near Guthrie and the Kentucky-Tennessee state line. Kentucky Route 181 connects Elkton with the city of Guthrie, 13 miles south of Elkton.

Two interchanges of Interstate Highway 24 are located within 5 miles of Todd County. Access is via U.S. Highway 79 at a point 6 miles southwest of Guthrie, and via Kentucky Route 104 at a point 8 miles southwest of Trenton. ## **LOCAL GOVERNMENT**

### **Structure**

Elkton and Guthrie are each served by a mayor and six council members. Trenton is served by a mayor and four commissioners. Todd County is governed by a county judge/executive and five magistrates.

### **Local Fees and Licenses**

Elkton - The city levies an occupational license tax of one-tenth of one percent of gross receipts of businesses (\$25 minimum tax), a withholding tax of one percent of gross salaries, and an annual unloading license of \$25 per truck.

Guthrie - The city levies an annual occupational privilege tax on manufacturers based on the number of employees; the tax ranges from \$100 to \$500. Privilege taxes for other types of businesses vary from \$7.50 to \$500. The city also levies an annual unloading license of \$37.50 per truck and an annual vehicle license of \$10 per vehicle.

Trenton - The city levies annual business license taxes ranging from \$10 to \$50.

A 3 percent tax is levied on utilities receipts for schools in Todd County. Tax is paid by all consumers of utilities as an add-on to the utilities bills. Exempted are receipts from utilities services that are resold and the receipts from the sale of energy or energy producing fuels that exceed 3 percent of the cost of production in manufacturing, processing, mining or refining.



## State and Local Property Taxes

All property in Kentucky, except items exempted by the state constitution, is taxed by the state. Property which also may be taxed by local jurisdictions includes land and buildings, finished goods inventories, automobiles, trucks, office furniture and office equipment. Local taxing jurisdictions in Kentucky include counties, cities, and school districts.

All property in Kentucky is assessed at 100 percent of fair cash value.

Todd County government provides 20 dumpsters located throughout the county in addition to a central collection center, all of which are emptied by private contractors. ## **Vocational Training**

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation, an independent public corporation created and funded by the Kentucky General Assembly, provides programs of skills training to meet the needs of business and industry from entry level to advanced training, and from upgrading present employees to retraining experienced workers.

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation is the primary source for skills training assistance for a new or existing company. The Corporation works in partnership with other employment and job training resources and programs, as well as Kentucky's economic development activities, to package a program customized to meet the specific needs of a company.

Vocational training is available at both the state vocational-technical schools and the area vocational education centers. The state vocational-technical schools are post-secondary institutions. The area vocational education centers are designed to supplement the curriculum of high school students. Both the state vocational-technical schools and the area vocational education centers offer evening courses to enable working adults to upgrade current job skills.

Arrangements can be made to provide training in the specific production skills required by an industrial plant. Instruction may be conducted either in the vocational school or in the industrial plant, depending upon the desired arrangement and the availability of special equipment.

## RECREATION

### Local

Public recreational facilities in Elkton include a 15-acre municipal park and playground with three lighted ball diamonds, four tennis courts (two are lighted), a picnic area and a pavilion. A playground is located at the elementary school; a baseball diamond, football field and four tennis courts are located at the high school; and a basketball court is available at a local church.

Recreational facilities in Guthrie include Kent Greenfield Park with a lighted Little League baseball field and a concession stand, as well as a local playground and a basketball court. The Guthrie Senior Citizens Center hosts weekly social functions.

A playground is available in Trenton, and recreational facilities are also located at the local elementary school.

Private recreational facilities in Todd County include a country club with a 9-hole golf course, a swimming pool, and two tennis courts.

### Area (Within 70 miles of Elkton)

**Jefferson Davis Monument State Shrine** is located 9 miles west of Elkton at Fairview. The shrine is at the site of the birthplace of Jefferson Davis, a former U.S. Senator, Secretary of War, and the only president of the Confederate States of America. The park contains a 351-foot obelisk with an elevator to the top for viewing, a museum, a gift shop, and a playground with picnic tables.

**Lake Malone State Park**, located in southern Muhlenberg County, 25 miles north of Elkton, offers camping facilities, swimming, fishing, and boating on a 788-acre lake. Playground facilities and picnic shelters are located in a beautiful scenic cliff area. Located across from the entrance to the park is an inn featuring luxury rooms, a restaurant, a swimming lake, a beach, boating, fishing, tennis, and nature trails.

**Pennyrile Forest State Resort Park** near Dawson Springs is located 40 miles northwest of Elkton. The 24-room lodge and cottages nestled within the trees provide excellent accommodations. Other facilities and activities include a dining room, a gift shop, rental rowboats and pedal boats, a 9-hole golf course, hiking trails, horseback riding, picnicking, playgrounds, shuffleboard, swimming at the lodge pool and off a sand beach, and two tennis courts. Lake Beshear, only four miles from the lodge, sports good fishing.

**Bowling Green** is located 45 miles east of Elkton. Bowling Green serves the area as a recreational and educational center. Western Kentucky University provides the city with many exciting sporting events. Beech Bend Amusement Park has many rides, games and other forms of entertainment.



**Lake Barkley State Resort Park**, 49 miles west of Elkton near Cadiz, is located on an embayment of Lake Barkley. The magnificent lodge includes 130 rooms, five suites, 13 cottages, a dining room, a coffee shop, a gift shop, two meeting rooms, and a recreation room. An activities center with a capacity for 1,000, a complete fitness center, and an 80-site campground are located near the lodge. A lodge pool, a beach and a bathhouse, an 18-hole golf course, tennis courts, a riding stable, a trapshooting range, a basketball court, hiking trails, playgrounds, and a picnic area round out the recreational facilities. The marina near the lodge has everything for the "boat lover": covered and open slips, a launching ramp, and rentals for fishing boats, skiing boats, and pleasure ride pontoons. An airport is available also.

**The Land Between the Lakes**, located on a 170,000-acre wooded peninsula, is an outdoor recreational and conservational education center. Camping, swimming, fishing, boating, hiking, a buffalo herd on a 250-acre range, an Environmental Education Center for school study groups, an educational farm and a central station with films and displays are among the attractions. Kentucky Lake and Lake Barkley are among the top fishing and water sport recreation areas in the southeastern United States. The Land Between the Lakes area is 50 miles west of Elkton.

Charm and serenity exemplify **Kenlake State Resort Park** which is located on Kentucky Lake, 67 miles west of Elkton. The park offers hotel and cottage accommodations and an efficient camping site. Other facilities include a 9-hole golf course, pool and lake swimming, horseback riding, hiking trails, fishing, boating, picnicking, planned recreation, and one of the finest tennis complexes in the area.

## COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENTS

### Recent

The Elkton-Todd County Industrial Foundation reorganized in 1985 and commissioned the Fantus Company to prepare a locational audit for Elkton. A full-time executive director for the industrial foundation was hired in 1986.

The city of Guthrie recently constructed a new building to house its emergency services vehicles.

### Planned

The Elkton-Todd County Industrial Foundation is planning to construct a 25,000-square-foot speculative building on property owned by the industrial foundation.

The city of Elkton is planning to build a new wastewater treatment facility. The capacity of the new oxidation ditch plant will be 350,000 gallons per day. The new facility is expected to be operational by the end of 1987.

Tentative plans are being made to construct a new municipal building in Elkton.

The Todd County School System is planning to construct two new 450-student school buildings to house grades K-5. A renovation-expansion project also is planned for the school system's administration building.
