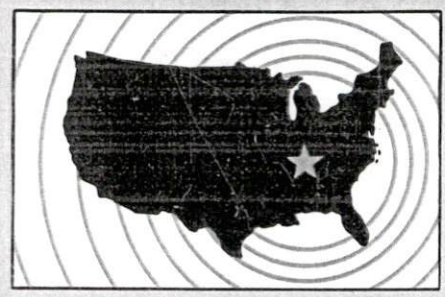

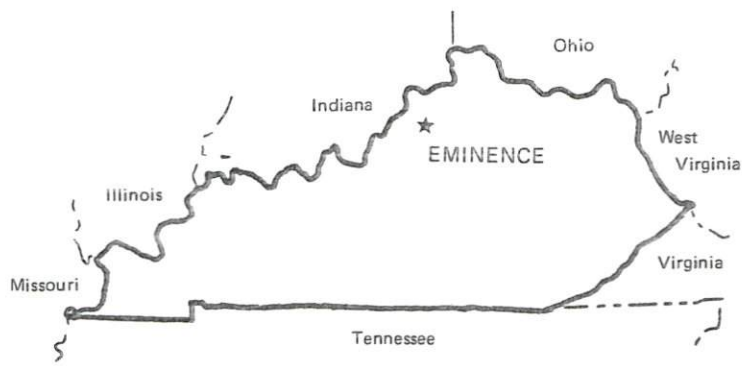

## LABOR ORGANIZATIONS:

Manufacturing workers at MacGregor Division, Brunswick Corporation are represented by the Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers of America, AFL-CIO.

## TRANSPORTATION:

Rail: The nearest rail service is at Shelbyville, 12 miles south of Eminence. The Louisville and Nashville Railroad provides an average of 3 local freights per week; 3 northbound and 3 southbound through freights daily; switching facilities; team track space for 8 cars; siding space for 25 cars; and piggyback facilities available at Louisville, 42 miles from Eminence. The Southern Railway System provides services including 6 eastbound and 6 westbound through freights daily; switching facilities; team track space for 22 cars; and piggyback facilities available at Louisville.

Highways: Kentucky Highways 22 and 55 intersect Eminence. U.S. Highway 421, only 2 miles north of Eminence, provides access to Interstate 71, 14 miles to the north. Access to Interstate 64 is 14 miles to the south via Kentucky Highway 55.

Truck: Both interstate and intrastate motor carrier service is available to Eminence.

Water: Eminence is located 42 miles northeast of Louisville, where port facilities are available on the Ohio River. Louisville has been classified as a Foreign Trade Zone and offers complete U.S. customs services for exports and imports.

Air: The nearest scheduled airline service is available at Standiford Field in Louisville, 42 miles distant. Services include American, Delta, Eastern, Ozark, Piedmont, TWA, USAir, and Air Kentucky (commuter) Airlines.

## UTILITIES:

Electricity: Eminence is served by Kentucky Utilities Company, a generation and transmission company. Henry County is served by Shelby RECC and the source of power is East Kentucky Power Cooperative.

Natural Gas: Eminence is served by Louisville Gas and Electric Company and the source of supply is Texas Gas Transmission Corporation.

Other Fuels: One propane distributor and one distributor of fuel oil are located in Eminence. Additional supplies are available in Shelbyville, 12 miles away, and other cities in the area.

## WATER AND SEWERAGE:

Water: Water service to Eminence is provided by Eminence Water Works. The design capacity of the treatment plant is 250,000 gallons per day and the source of raw water is a lake. In addition, treated water is purchased from Henry County Water District #2. Average daily water consumption in Eminence is 120,000 gallons and peak daily consumption is 350,000 gallons. The total storage capacity has been increased to 375,000 gallons.

Sewerage: Eminence is served by Eminence Water Works. The design capacity of the treatment plant is 170,000 gpd and average daily flow is 164,000 gallons. Treatment is primary and secondary. Currently a study is being made and plans for expansion of the sewer system will be forthcoming.

## GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE

City: Eminence is served by a mayor elected to a 4-year term and 6 councilmen elected to 2-year terms.

County: Henry County is served by a county judge/executive and 6 magistrates elected to 4-year terms.

EDUCATION: There are two school systems operating in Henry County. The Eminence Independent School District has a total enrollment of 560 with 310 elementary and 250 high school students. Total enrollment in the Henry County School System is 1,970 with 805 elementary, 515 middle school and 650 high school students. The nearest state vocational-technical school is at Jeffersontown, 35 miles distant. Shelby County Area Vocational Education Center is located at Shelbyville, 12 miles away.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Telephone: South Central Bell Telephone Company provides standard services to Eminence.

Telegraph: A Western Union toll-free number is available for sending telegrams, mailgrams and international messages.

Newspaper: The Henry County Local is published weekly in New Castle and the circulation is 5,300.

Radio Station: Radio station WSTL-AM operates in Eminence.

Television: Major television networks are received without cable from Lexington and Louisville, Kentucky, and Cincinnati, Ohio.

OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

Hospitals: The nearest general hospital is King's Daughters' Hospital at Shelbyville, 12 miles distant. There are 76 acute beds at this facility.

Churches: There are 8 churches located in Eminence. Denominations which are represented in Eminence are Baptist, Catholic, Christian, Church of God, Disciples of Christ, Methodist and Presbyterian.

Financial Institutions: The Farmers Deposit Bank is located in Eminence and provides financial services to the city.
