

LABOR ORGANIZATIONS:

Manufacturing workers at MacGregor Division, Brunswick Corporation are represented by the Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers of America, AFL-CIO.

TRANSPORTATION:

- Rail: The nearest rail service is at Shelbyville, 12 miles south of Eminence. The Louisville and Nashville Railroad provides an average of 2 local freights per week; 2 north-bound and 2 southbound through freights daily; switching facilities; team track space for 8 cars; siding space for 25 cars. L & N piggyback facilities are available at Louisville, 40 miles from Eminence. The Southern Railway System provides services at Shelbyville including 6 eastbound and 6 westbound through freights daily; switching facilities; team track space for 22 cars; and piggyback facilities at Louisville.
- Highways: Kentucky Highways 22 and 55 intersect at Eminence. U.S. Highway 421, only 2 miles north of Eminence, provides access to Interstate 71, 14 miles to the north. Access to Interstate 64 is 14 miles to the south via Kentucky Highway 55.

Road Distance in Miles:

Truck: Interstate and intrastate motor carrier service is available to Eminence.

<u>Water:</u> Eminence is located about 40 miles northeast of Louisville, where port facilities are available on the Ohio River. The Louisville and Jefferson County Riverport Authority has been designated as a Foreign Trade Zone and offers complete U.S. Customs services for exports and imports.

Air: The nearest scheduled airline service is available at Standiford Field in Louisville 40 miles distant. Services include American, Delta, Eastern, New York Air, Ozark, Piedmont, TWA, USAir, Wright and Allegheny commuter airlines.

UTILITIES:

Electricity: Eminence and part of Henry County is served by the Kentucky Utilities
Company. The remainder of Henry County is served by Shelby RECC, which is supplied by
the East Kentucky Power Cooperative.

Natural Gas: Eminence is served by the Louisville Gas and Electric Company, which is supplied by Texas Gas Transmission Corporation.

Other Fuels: One propane distributor and one distributor of fuel oil are located in Eminence. Additional supplies are available from cities in the area.

WATER AND SEWERAGE:

<u>Water:</u> Water service to Eminence is provided by the Eminence Water Works. The design capacity of the treatment plant is 250,000 gallons per day. Treated water is also purchased from Henry County Water District #2. Average daily consumption is 120,000 gallons and peak daily consumption has reached 350,000 gallons. Total storage capacity is 375,000 gallons.

<u>Sewerage</u>: The design capacity of the municipal sewerage treatment plant is 180,000 gpd and average daily flow is at capacity. A study is being made and plans for expansion of the sewer system will be forthcoming.

GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE:

<u>City</u>: Eminence is served by a mayor elected to a 4-year term and 6 council members elected to 2-year terms.

County: Henry County is served by a county judge/executive and 6 magistrates elected to 4-year terms.

EDUCATION: There are two school systems operating in Henry County. The Eminence Independent School District has a total enrollment of 530 with 270 elementary and 260 high school students. Total enrollment in the Henry County School System is 2,067 with 913 elementary, 506 middle school, and 648 high school students. The nearest state vocational-technical school is at Jeffersontown, 35 miles distant. The Shelby County Area Vocational Education Center is located at Shelbyville, 12 miles away.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Telephone: South Central Bell Telephone Company provides standard services to Eminence.

Telegraph: A Western Union toll-free number, 1-800-325-5100, is available for sending telegrams, mailgrams, and international messages.

Newspaper: The Henry County Local is published weekly in New Castle and the circulation is 5,300.

Radio Station: Radio station WSTL-AM operates in Eminence.

Television: Major television networks are received without cable from Lexington and Louisville, Kentucky, and Cincinnati, Ohio. Cable service is being planned for Eminence.

OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

Hospitals: The nearest general hospital is King's Daughters' Hospital at Shelbyville, 12 miles from Eminence. There are 76 beds at this facility.

Churches: There are seven churches located in Eminence. Denominations represented are Baptist, Christian, Methodist, Pentecostal and Presbyterian.

Financial Institutions: The Farmers Deposit Bank is located in Eminence.
