



NICHOLASVILLE, KENTUCKY - A RESOURCE PROFILE

Nicholasville, the county seat of Jessamine County, lies within central Kentucky's Blue Grass Region, an area of low rolling hills. Nicholasville is located 12 miles south of Lexington, Kentucky; 87 miles east of Louisville, Kentucky; and 90 miles south of Cincinnati, Ohio. The city had an estimated 1994 population of 16,121 persons.

Jessamine County, with a land area of 173 square miles, features terrain which ranges from rolling hills in the northern and central portions of the county, to steeper hills in the southern portions. Along the Kentucky River, which forms the southern boundary of the county, the landscape is much more rugged. The river winds through a deeply entrenched gorge where cliff-lined walls rise vertically 400 feet or more. Jessamine County had an estimated 1994 population of 33,557 persons.


The Economic Framework - The total number of Jessamine County residents employed in 1994 averaged 17,330. Manufacturing firms in the county reported 1,671 employees; wholesale and retail trade provided 2,317 jobs; 1,267 people were employed in service occupations; state and local government accounted for 1,719 employees; and contract construction firms provided 1,047 jobs.

Labor Supply - There is a current estimated labor supply of 10,180 persons available for industrial jobs in the labor market area. In addition, from 1996 through 2000, 25,299 young persons in the area will become 18 years of age and potentially available for industrial jobs.

Transportation - Nicholasville is served by U.S. Highway 27, a "AAA"-rated trucking highway, and by Kentucky Routes 29, 39, and 169, all "AA"-rated trucking highways. In addition, Interstate Highways 64 and 75 are accessible approximately 16 miles northeast of Nicholasville near Lexington. Thirty-one trucking companies serve Nicholasville. The Norfolk Southern Corporation provides main line rail freight service to Nicholasville. The nearest scheduled commercial airline service is available at Blue Grass Airport, 13 miles northwest of Nicholasville near Lexington.

Power and Fuel - The City of Nicholasville Utilities, whose source of electric power is Kentucky Utilities Company, provides electric power to Nicholasville. Kentucky Utilities Company and Blue Grass Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation also serve portions of Jessamine County. Delta Natural Gas Company, Inc. provides natural gas service to Nicholasville.

Education - The Jessamine County Public School System, accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, provides primary and secondary education in Jessamine County. Asbury College, seven miles west of Nicholasville, is the nearest of 11 colleges and universities located within 50 miles of Nicholasville. Vocational training is available at the Central Kentucky Regional Technology Center in Lexington, 12 miles north of Nicholasville.









AVERAGE PLACEMENT WAGES



Highways

Nicholasville is served by U.S. Highway 27, a "AAA"-rated (80,000-pound gross load limit) trucking highway, and by Kentucky Routes 29, 39, and 169, all "AA"-rated (62,000-pound gross load limit) trucking highways.

Interstate 64, a major east-west highway, and Interstate 75, a major north-south traffic artery, intersect 16 miles northeast of Nicholasville near Lexington via four-lane access.

Widening of U.S. 27 to four lanes south of Nicholasville to Camp Nelson is under way.

Local Fees and Licenses

The City of Nicholasville levies an occupational license tax of one and one-half percent of salaries, wages, and commissions of individuals employed within the city. Businesses pay a business license tax on gross receipts based upon a sliding scale.

Jessamine County levies a one percent occupational license tax on wages, salaries, and commissions of individuals and on net profits of businesses.

PROPERTY TAXES

The Kentucky Constitution requires the state to tax all classes of taxable property, and state statutes allow local jurisdictions to tax only a few classes. All locally taxed property is subject to county taxes and school district taxes (either a county school district or an independent school district). Property located inside of city limits may also be subject to city property taxes.

Special local taxing jurisdictions (fire protection districts, watershed districts, and sanitation districts) levy taxes within their operating areas (usually a small portion of community or county).

Property assessments in Kentucky are at 100% fair cash value. Accounts receivable are taxed at 85% of face value.

A five-million dollar expansion was completed at Kentucky Tech's Central Kentucky Regional Technology Center in the fall of 1992. The expansion includes a manufacturing technology building that houses manufacturing related programs such as machine tool technology, computer aided drafting, electronics and industry electrical technology. A computer-integrated work cell laboratory in one room of the building links all the programs, simulating the operation of an actual manufacturing plant. Applied physics, hydraulics, and quality control applications are integrated into the curriculum. Another room in the new building can be used by business and industry for startup and new production training. Also included are medical imaging, medical assisting, bio-medical technician, and laboratory technician programs.

Customized Training

The Kentucky Tech system, through its Training and Development Coordinators, will provide technical assistance and will identify and develop low-cost customized training programs and services for both established and prospective businesses. Businesses needing customized training should contact a Training and Development Coordinator located at the Central Kentucky Regional Technology Center in Lexington (606) 255-8501.

Assessment Services

Kentucky Tech Career Connections offers to business, education, and government agencies customized assessment in career inventories, interest inventories, pre-hire assessment, psychomotor skills, and academic potential. The Career Connections Assessment Center is located on the campus of Central Kentucky Regional Technology Center (606) 255-8501.

Adult Education Services

Adult education programs are available to adults who want to develop new skills, improve basic skills or earn a high school equivalency diploma. In Jessamine County, adult literacy is provided by Operation Read at the Adult Learning Center and adult basic education is provided by the Jessamine County Board of Education.

Bluegrass State Skills Corporation

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation, an independent public corporation created and funded by the Kentucky General Assembly, provides programs of skills training to meet the needs of business and industry from entry level to advanced training, and from upgrading present employees to retraining experienced workers.

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation is a major source for skills training assistance for a new or existing company. The Corporation works in partnership with other employment and job training resources and programs, as well as Kentucky's economic development activities, to package a program customized to meet the specific needs of a company.

RECREATION

Local

City-County Park, a 22-acre facility, was developed jointly by the City of Nicholasville and the Jessamine County Fiscal Court. It is the home of many youth and adult sports activities. Primary facilities include: a softball field, two basketball courts, two shelters, two tennis courts, and four soccer fields. City-County Park also provides space for the Jessamine Youth Football League in an enclosed lighted football facility equipped with a fieldhouse, grandstands, and concession area. The park is also the home of the Jessamine Little League and Babe Ruth Baseball Association. The baseball games are held at a four-field complex which includes a concession area. City-County Park provides a large playground area suitable for all ages of youth.

The Jessamine County Fairgrounds, located at City-County Park, offers a multi-purpose building including restroom facilities with group reservations available. The Fairgrounds also features a horse show ring, a tractor pull arena, animal barns, a 16-pit horseshoe area, and a covered shelter for pageants, shows, and theatricals.

Six other parks are available locally. Lake Mingo Park, a municipally-owned facility, features three shelter areas which are available for group reservations, a tennis court, a playground area, a picnic area, a basketball court, an exercise area, and a one-half mile paved jogging/walking track. Hayden Park, located on Jefferson Street, offers a state of the art playground area, a multi-purpose ball diamond, and a shelter/restroom facility. Rock Fence Park, located on the corner of Oak Street and Kentucky 169, offers a large playground area and shelter/picnic area for the surrounding neighborhood. The James Mason Soccer Facility, located on Keene Road at Belle Place, offers an Olympic-size soccer field that is recessed for amphitheater-type seating on all sides of the field. Billy Lockridge Park is located in the front of Keene Land on Keene Way Drive. The park includes a playground area, a picnic area, and a shelter. Woody Grow Park is located in the rear of Keene Land. The park offers a sand volleyball court, a basketball court, a playground area, and a shelter.

Youth athletic programs include baseball, basketball, football, and soccer. The football programs have corresponding cheerleading programs for girls. Adult leagues for basketball, softball, and volleyball are available as well.

The Lone Oak Country Club offers an 18-hole golf course, a swimming pool, and tennis.

Asbury College, located in Wilmore, features special exhibits, performances, and sports events which are open to the public.
