
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

LABOR ORGANIZATIONS:

There are no labor organizations representing manufacturing workers in Stanton or Clay city at this time.

TRANSPORTATION:

- <u>Rail</u>: The nearest rail service is provided by the Chessie System at Mt. Sterling, about 15 miles north of Clay City, and by the Louisville & Nashville at Irvine, 14 miles south of Clay City.
- Highways: The Mountain Parkway, a multilane toll road, passes through Powell County with interchanges located at both Stanton and Clay City. In addition, Stanton is served by Kentucky Highways 11, 15, and 213, while Clay City is served by Kentucky Highways 11, 15, and 82.

- Truck: Hazard Express, Inc., and Overnite Transportation Company provide interstate and intrastate motor carrier service to Stanton and Clay City.
- $\frac{\text{Water:}}{67}$ The nearest navigable waterway is a point on the Kentucky River near Lawrenceburg,
- <u>Air</u>: Stanton Airport, a small aircraft airport located 1/2 mile east of Stanton has one paved 3,000 foot runway. The nearest scheduled airline service is available at Blue Grass Field in Lexington, 40 miles northwest of Stanton. Services at Blue Grass Field include Delta, Frontier, Piedmont, and USAir Airlines and Tennessee Airways, a commuter airline.

UTILITIES:

- Electricity: Clark RECC provides electricity to Stanton, Clay City and most of Powell County. The source of power is East Kentucky Power Cooperative.
- <u>Natural Gas</u>: Delta Natural Gas Company serves Stanton and Clay City. The source of supply is Columbia Gulf Transmission Corporation.

Other Fuels: There are two propane distributors and one distributor of fuel oil located within a 25-mile radius of Stanton.

WATER AND SEWERAGE:

- <u>Water</u>: The Stanton Water Works and Sewer System serves Stanton. The capacity of the water treatment plant is 720,000 gallons per day. Average daily consumption is 350,000 gallons and peak daily consumption is about 600,000 gallons. Total storage capacity has been increased to 823,000 gallons. Clay City Water Works serves Clay City and the capacity of the water treatment plant is 250,000 gallons per day. Average daily consumption is 195,000 gallons and peak daily consumption is 210,000 gallons. The storage capacity at Clay City is 100,000 gallons. The source of raw water for both cities is the Red River.
- <u>Sewerage</u>: Stanton is served by the Stanton Water Works and Sewer System. The design capacity of the sewage treatment plant is 345,000 gallons per day and average daily flow is 175,000 gallons. Treatment is secondary. Clay City sewerage system has a design capacity of 200,000 gallons per day and average daily flow is 58,000 gallons. Presently, the treatment is primary.

GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE:

<u>City</u>: Stanton and Clay City are each served by a mayor elected to a four-year term and six council members elected to two-year terms.

<u>County:</u> Powell County is served by a county judge/executive and five magistrates elected to four-year terms.

EDUCATION: One public school system operates in Powell County. Total enrollment in the county school system is 2,340 including 550 high school, 665 middle school and 1,125 elementary school students. The nearest state vocational school is Central Kentucky State Vocational-Technical School in Lexington, 40 miles from Stanton. The nearest area vocational education center is located in Winchester, 25 miles from Stanton.

COMMUNICATIONS:

<u>Telephone</u>: South Central Bell Telephone Company serves Stanton and Clay City with standard services.

<u>Telegraph</u>: There is a Western Union toll-free number (800-325-5100) available for sending mailgrams, telegrams and international messages.

<u>Newspaper</u>: The Clay City Times is a weekly publication serving Powell County. The circulation is 3,300.

Radio Station: WBFC-AM and WSKV-FM radio stations broadcast from Stanton.

<u>Television</u>: Cable service is available in both Stanton and Clay City. Most major network programs are received from Lexington and Louisville, Kentucky, and Cincinnati, Ohio.

OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

<u>Hospitals</u>: The Mary Chiles Hospital at Mt. Sterling, 20 miles from Stanton has 56 acute care beds, 40 skilled nursing and 8 psychiatric care beds. The Clark County Hospital at Winchester, 25 miles from Stanton, also serves the area and provides 81 acute care beds.

<u>Churches</u>: There are several different denominations represented in Stanton and Clay City area including Baptist, Christian, Church of Christ, Church of God and Presbyterian.

Financial Institutions: The Powell County Bank at Stanton and the Clay City Branch Bank at Clay City provide financial services to the area.
