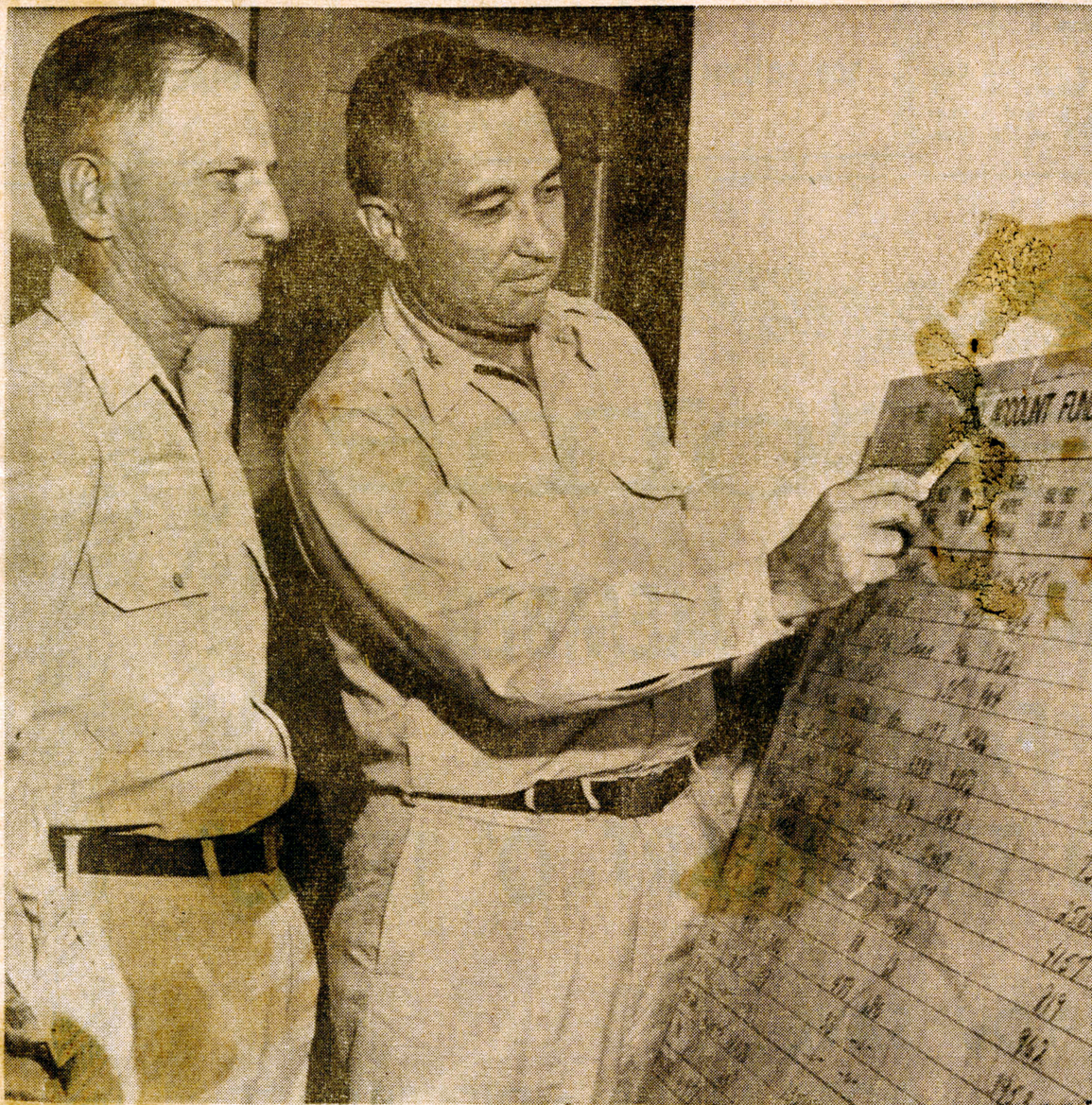

18th Opens a New Era in Waco

This month, 18th Air Force begins a new era in its colorful history. The 18th Headquarters has moved to Waco. And Waco says: Welcome 18th Air Force, welcome to Central Texas.

The 18th has said goodbye to its former home in Greenville, S. C.

With this move, the 18th shifts its gears from the subsonic to the supersonic, from piston engines to jets, from airlifting to fighters and fighter bombers.

Its former mission was to carry anything anywhere in the world, top to bottom—and it did.

Its new mission will be to fly bullets and bombs anywhere in the world, top to bottom—and it will.

The 18th now becomes a sort of global fire department. Its Super Sabres, Voodoos and Thunderflashes will fly faster than sound to put out little wars, help prevent big ones.

What has made the 18th's history rich and the promise of its future bright is the main ingredient of successful enterprise: plenty of good people.

The 18th is a combination of people and planes, progress and proficiency, discipline and initiative.

After 30 Years In Uniform

A Last Salute For Prindle

Brig. Gen. Hoyt L. Prindle received his last salute from the airmen of Donaldson Air Force Base yesterday and retired after a military career of over 30 years.

The general was deputy commander of the 18th Air Force until the unit transferred to Waco, Tex., last summer and has since been serving as a special assistant to the 18th commander. He has been stationed at Donaldson since July 1954.

During yesterday's ceremonies Gen. Prindle reviewed a parade, heard his retirement orders read and accepted the congratulations of five of his fellow general officers.

Also present for the parade and a reception which followed was Cadet H. L. Prindle Jr. of the Air

Force Academy, the general's son. Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation.

Maj. Gen. Chester E. McCarty, commander of the 18th Air Force, flew in from his new headquarters at Waco to attend the ceremony.

Other generals there were Maj. Gen. John W. Persons of Dobbins Air Force Base, Ga., commander of the 14th AF; Brig. Gen. Theodore D. Kershaw of Pope Air Force Base, N.C.; Brig. Gen. Frank T. McCoy Jr. of Nashville, Tenn., and Brig. Gen. E. Wade Hampton, DAFB commander, the host officer.

Gen. Prindle commanded a B29 bomber group during World War II and was vice commander of the Korean Airlift during the Korean conflict.

A native of Lawton, Mich., he began his military service in June 1927. Prior to the outbreak in Korea, Gen. Prindle commanded a troop carrier wing at Smyrna Air Force Base, Tenn.

The general's first assignment at Donaldson was chief of staff of the 18th. He was promoted to brigadier soon after coming here.

Gen. Prindle remained a flying officer right up to the end of his career, two months ago taking the new Lockheed C130 for its first high altitude flight on a trip over South America.

He holds the Legion of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross and

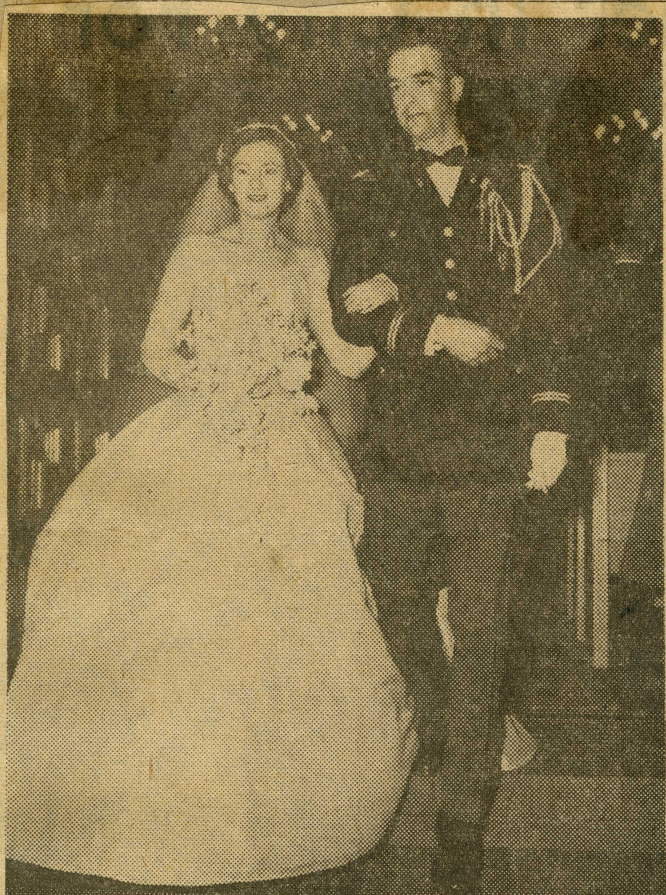

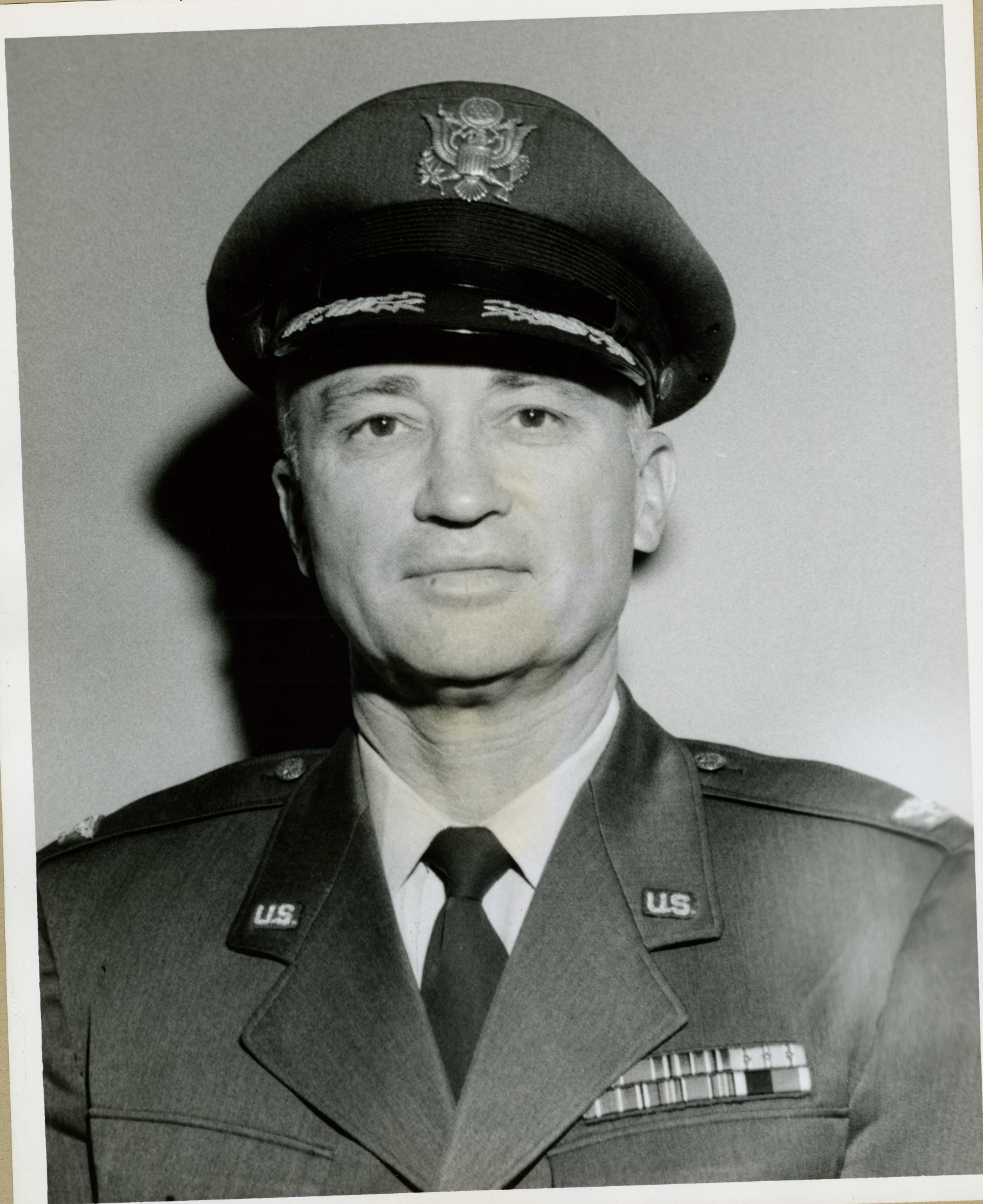
