Recreation

Local: Recreation facilities consist of two parks covering an area of 55 acres, four playgrounds, two theatres, 9-hole golf course, two tennis courts, swimming pool and civic center. Little League, Babe Ruth League, American Legion League baseball, Little League football, church softball leagues and swimming team, roller skating rinks.

Area: Old Fort Harrod State Park, Harrodsburg, 31 miles distant; My Old Kentucky Home State Park, Bardstown, 29 miles distant; Lake Cumberland State Park, Jamestown, 60 miles distant; Louisville and Lexington, Kentucky, are approximately one hour's drive from Lebanon.

Recent Community Improvements: New Central High School, Vocational Extension Center, airport, new sewage treatment plant, new Marion County Water District, new garbage truck, new apartment building and a new library.

Planned: Shopping center, baseball diamond.
