SEPTEMBER is anniversary month for ABWA. Why not "celebrate" by adding a record number of NEW MEMBERS at your September Enrollment Event!

STANDARD OF ACHIEVENENT 1965-66

All are to be completed between the dates of September 26, 1965 and September 25, 1966.

- 1. Boss Night Dinner
- 2. Hand of Friendship Tea on either March 20 1966 or September 13, 1966.
- 3. Approved Educational Scholarship
- 4. Publication of nine or more issues of a chapter bulletin.
- 5. Select and submit material on a 1966-67 Woman of the Year from the Chapter.
- 6. Minimum contributions of \$35.00 to the Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund.
- 7. Hold Chapter Anniversary Observance in month Chapter was chartered (except chapters installed after Sept. 26, 1965) giving recognition to members having perfect attendance for a period of one year or longer.
- 8. Hold Attendance Contest over three month period, following attendance participation plan.
- 9. Either have member in attendance at Dist.
 Meeting or verification of delegate to
 the 1966 National Convention.
 - 10. Enroll a total of at least ten (10) new members.

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BANNER CHAPTER 1965-66

To qualify for Banner Chapter status, a chapter must complete all requirements for Standard of Achievement, and in addition, fulfill any eight of the following requirements between the dates of September 26, 1965, and September 25, 1966.

Note: Chapters previously qualifying for the Banner will receive a Medallion in place of an additional Banner.

- *1. Hold twolve chapter meetings during the year.
- *2. Have twelve planned programs with speaker.
- *3. Have a vocational talk by member at each meeting, including Boss Night.
- *4. Hold Hand of Friendship Teas on both March 20 and September 18, 1966.
 - 5. Enroll a minimum of ten members at a single Hand of Friendship Tea or Enrollment Party.
 - 6. Have one or more members qualify for Inner Circle.
- *7 Both verifications of delegate to 1966 National Convention and have a member in attendance at the District Meeting.
 - 8. Have Woman of the Year in attendance at National Meeting.
 - 9. Have a minimum of ten members in attend ance at District Meeting.

- *10. Sponsor a single Ways and Means Project returning \$300 or more net profit.
- *11. SBMEF Donors' Plaque recognition
 (name of donor inscribed on plaque at
 National Headquarters in acknowledgment of at least \$100 in addition to
 meeting the Standard of Achievement
 SBMEF requirement)
- *12. Award more than one scholarship arnually.
- *13. Observe ABWA Scholars ip Month in May .-
 - 14. Sponsor Torchbearer Chapter, Friendship Chapter, or Expansion Chapter.
 - 15. Nominate a quali ied candidate for National Office.
 - 16. Sponsor District Meeting or National Convention.
