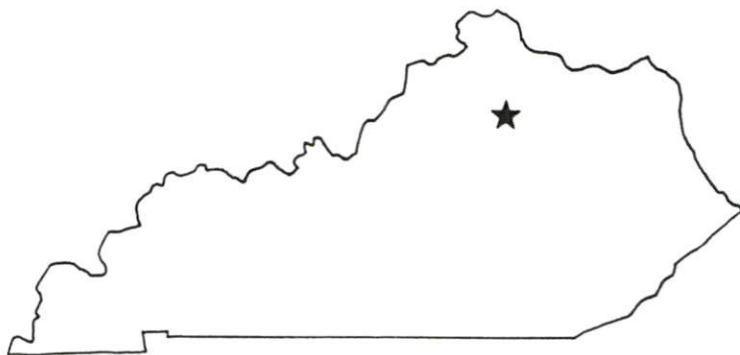

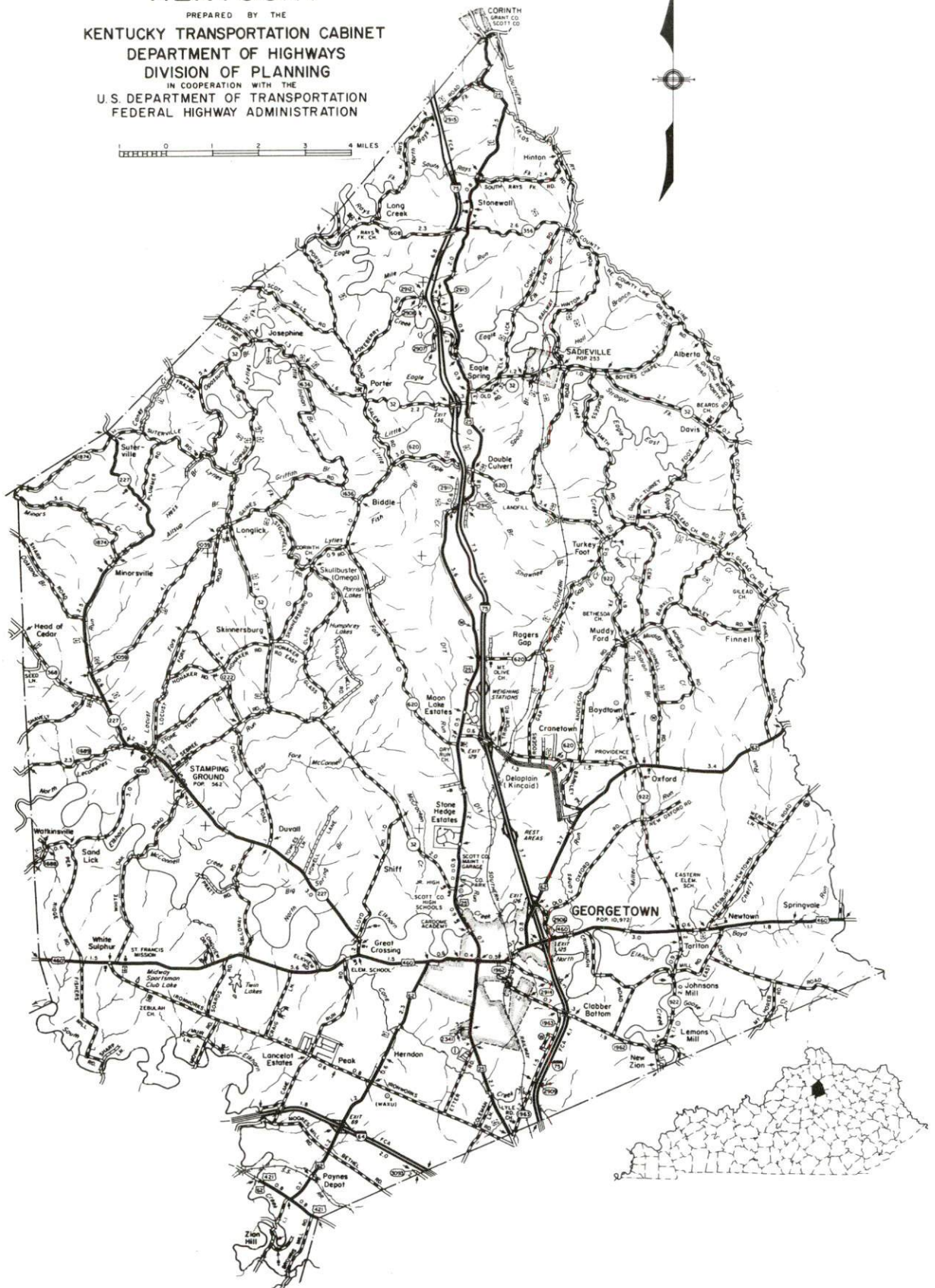

STAMPING GROUND, KENTUCKY - A RESOURCE PROFILE

Stamping Ground is located in central Kentucky's scenic Blue Grass Region, an area famous for its many beautiful horse farms and low rolling hills. Stamping Ground is located eight miles northwest of Georgetown, Kentucky, 23 miles northwest of Lexington, Kentucky; 72 miles east of Louisville, Kentucky; and 79 miles south of Cincinnati, Ohio. In 1988, Stamping Ground's estimated population was 690.

Scott County, which covers a land area of 286 square miles, had an estimated 1988 population of 22,800.

The Economic Framework - The total number of Scott County residents employed in 1989 averaged 11,515. Manufacturing firms in the county reported 4,751 employees; wholesale and retail trade provided 1,877 jobs; 1,236 people were employed in service occupations; state and local government accounted for 1,020 employees; and contract construction firms provided 453 jobs.

Labor Supply - There is a current estimated labor supply of 30,151 persons available for industrial jobs in the labor market area. In addition, from 1990 through 1994, 24,014 young persons in the area will become 18 years of age and potentially available for industrial jobs.

Transportation - The major highway serving Stamping Ground is Kentucky Route 227, which connects with U.S. 460, six miles southeast of Stamping Ground. Access to Interstate 75 is ten miles southeast of Stamping Ground. Sixteen trucking companies provide interstate and/or intrastate service to Stamping Ground. The nearest scheduled commercial airline service is available at Bluegrass Airport near Lexington, 23 miles southeast. A local airfield for small craft is available at Georgetown, which has a 1,600-foot turf runway.

Power and Fuel - Kentucky Utilities Company provides electricity to Stamping Ground and part of Scott County. The remainder of the county is served by East Kentucky Power Cooperative through the Harrison Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation and the Owen County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation.

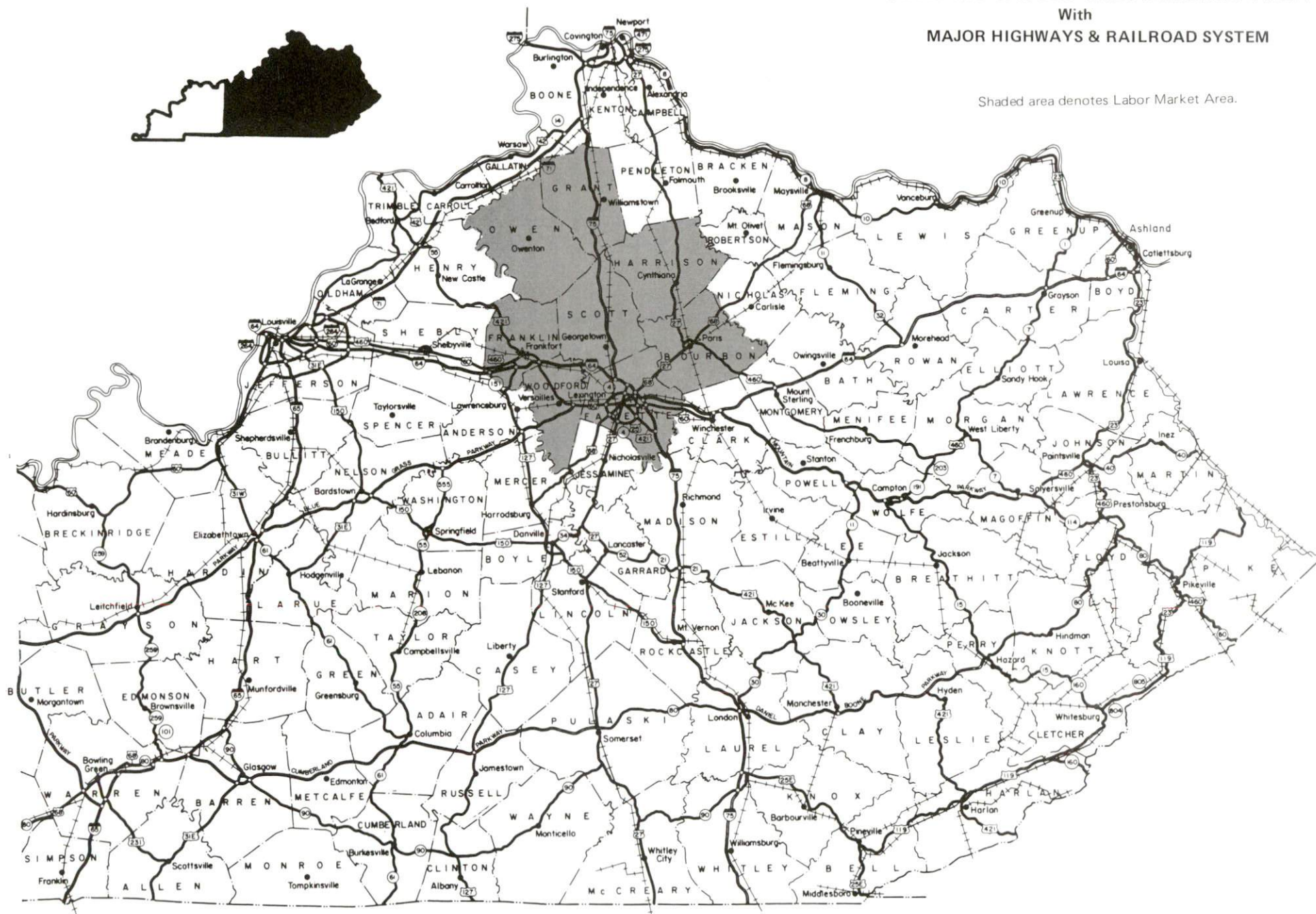
Education - The Scott County Public School System provides primary and secondary education to Stamping Ground. There are eight institutions of higher learning within 50 miles of Stamping Ground. The nearest vocational training is available at the Central Kentucky State Vocational-Technical School located in Lexington, Kentucky, 23 miles southeast, and the Franklin County Area Vocational Education Center located in Frankfort, Kentucky, 10 miles southwest of Stamping Ground.

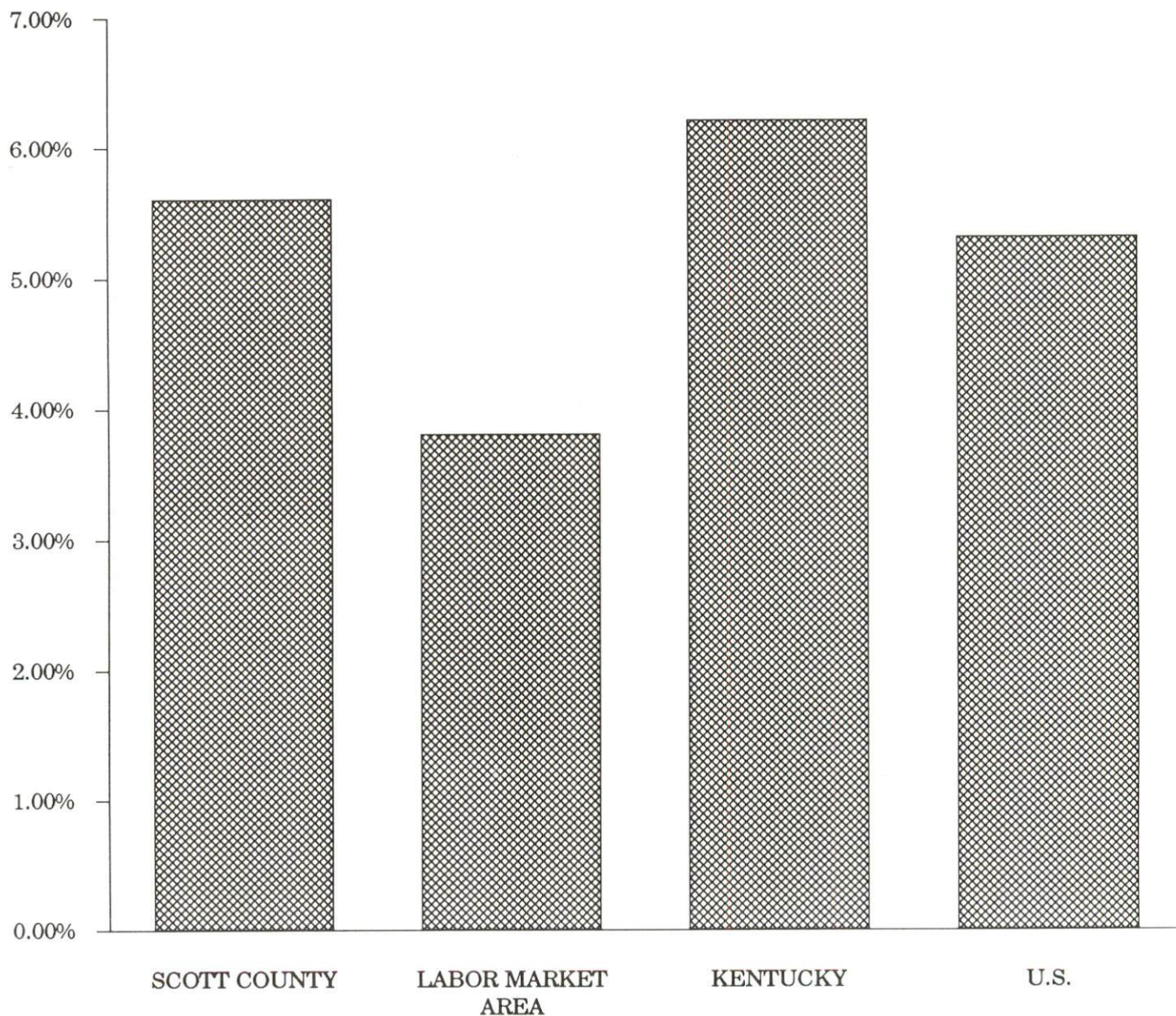

UNEMPLOYMENT RATES 1989

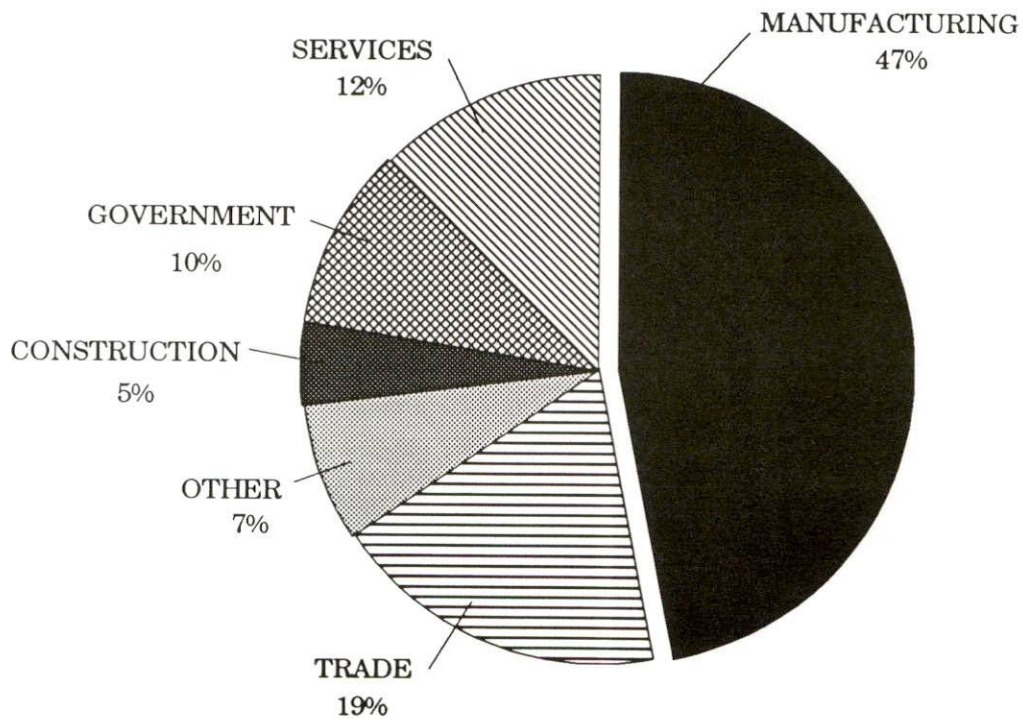

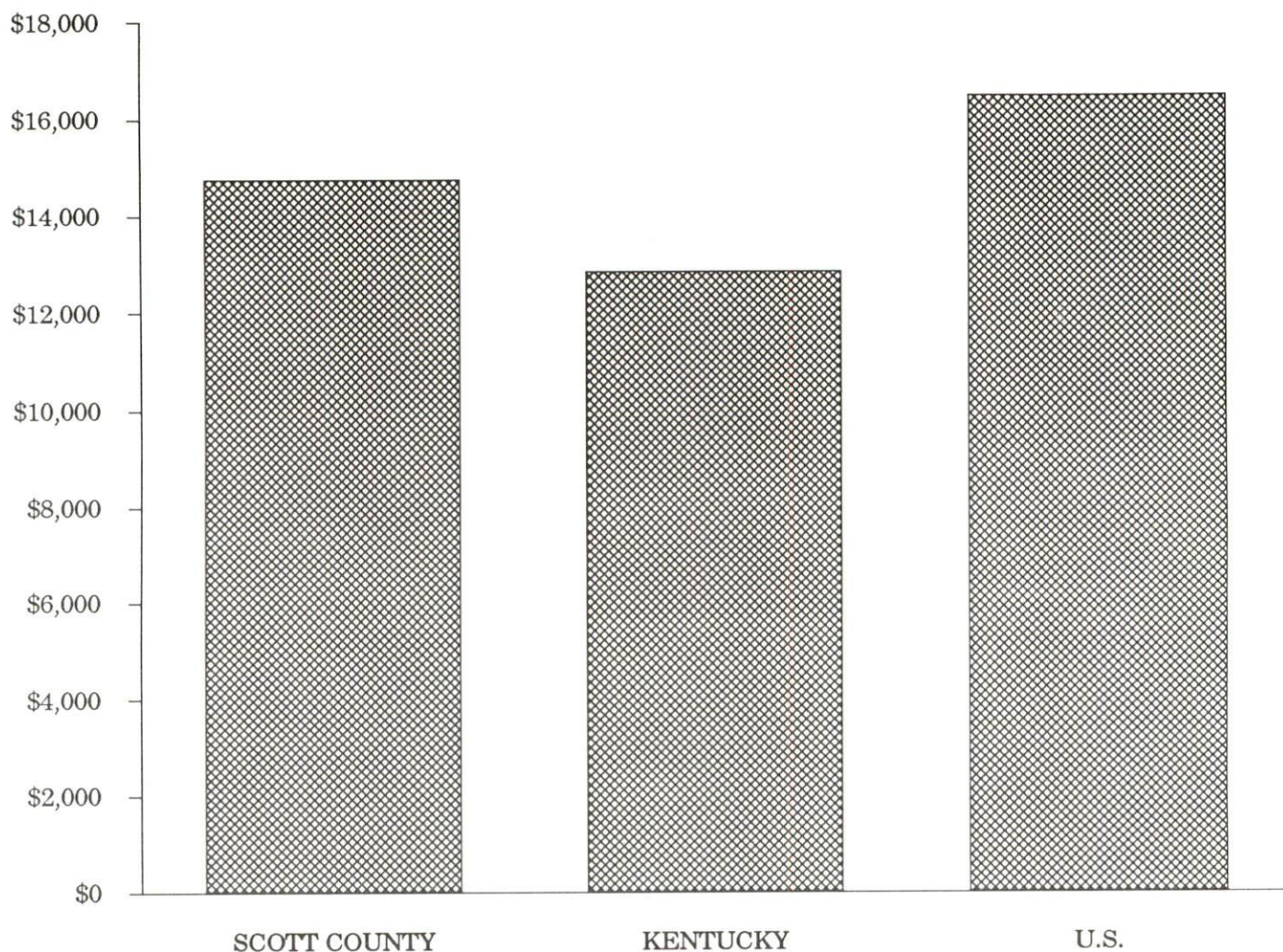

AVERAGE PLACEMENT WAGES

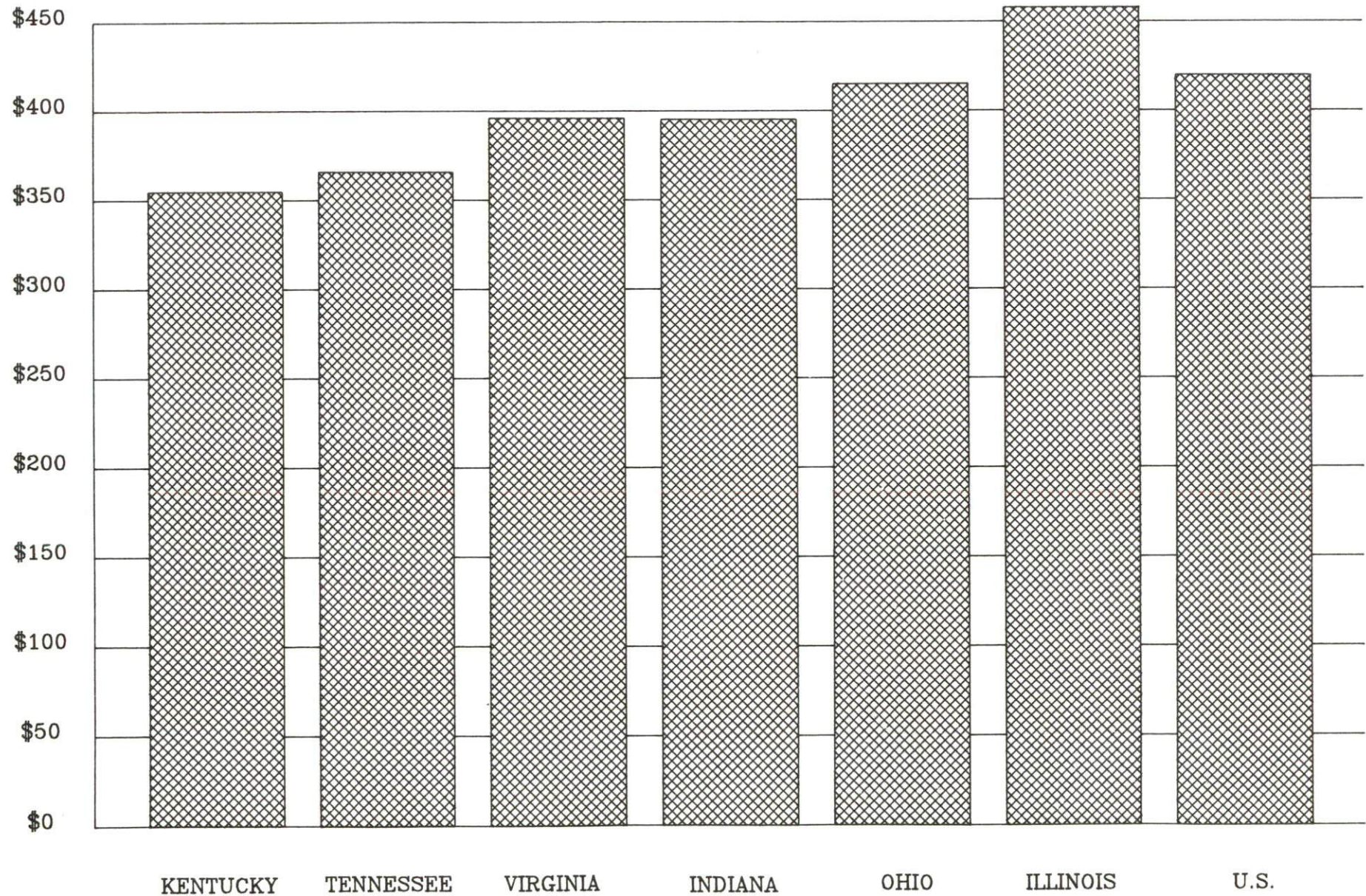

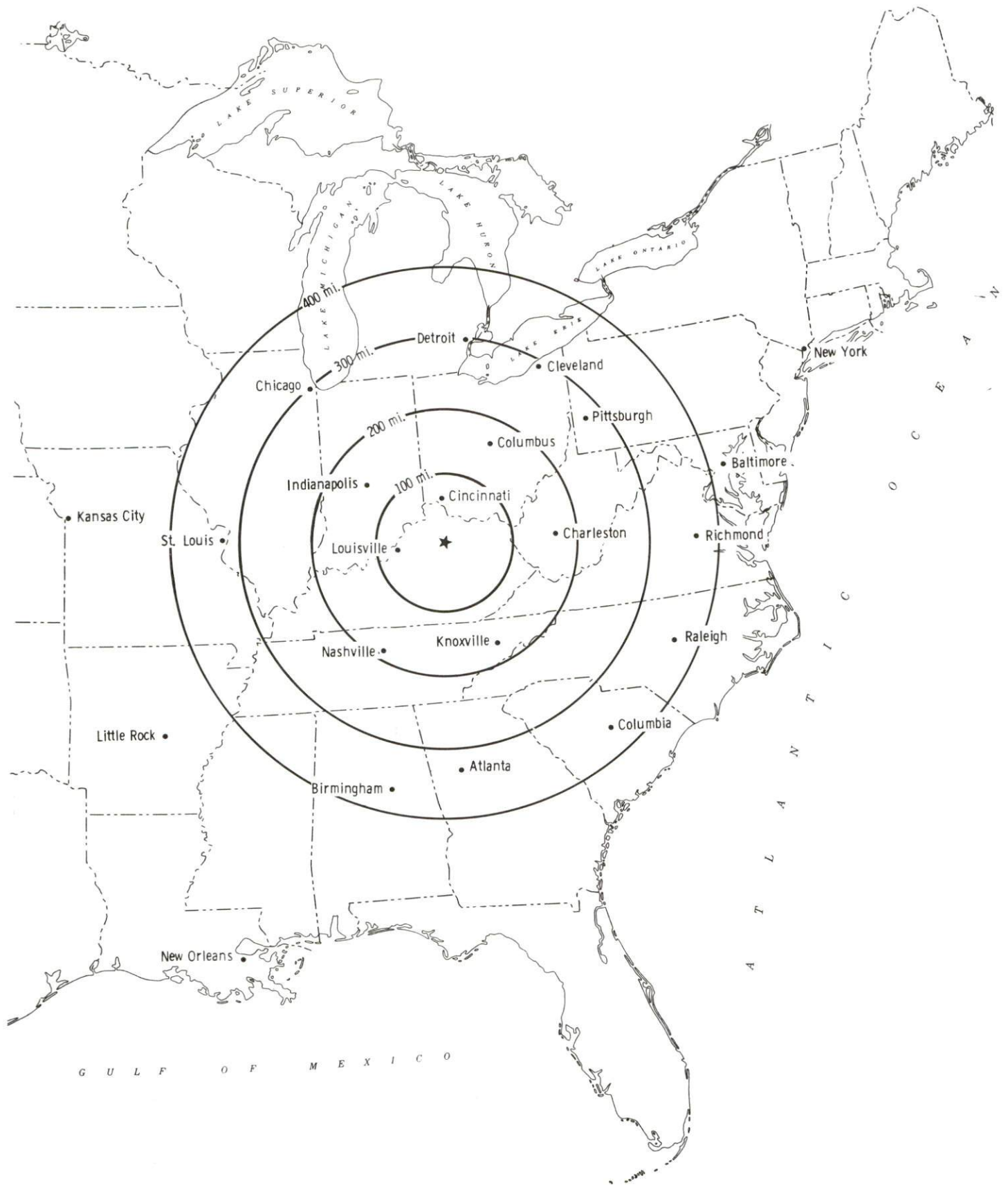

The city of Stamping Ground is served by a mayor and four commission members. The mayor is elected to a four-year term and the commissioners serve two-year terms. Scott County is served by a county judge/executive and three commissioners. The judge/executive and commissioners are elected to four-year terms.

Local Fees and Licenses

The City of Stamping Ground levies a 6% license tax on premiums received by insurance companies doing business in Stamping Ground. The City of Stamping Ground also levies a \$30 occupational license fee annually and a \$30 per year delivery license fee on trucks delivering goods in Stamping Ground.

Scott County levies a one percent occupational license tax on wages, salaries, and commissions of individuals and on net profits of businesses.

State and Local Property Taxes

All property in Kentucky, except items exempted by the state constitution, is taxed by the state. Property which also may be taxed by local jurisdictions includes land and buildings, finished goods inventories, automobiles, trucks, office furniture and office equipment. Local taxing jurisdictions in Kentucky include counties, cities, and school districts.

All property in Kentucky is assessed at 100 percent of fair cash value.

Vocational Training

Vocational training is available at both the state vocational-technical schools and the area vocational education centers. The state vocational-technical schools are post-secondary institutions. The area vocational education centers are designed to supplement the curriculum of high school students. Both the state vocational-technical schools and the area vocational education centers offer evening courses to enable working adults to upgrade current job skills.

Arrangements can be made to provide training in the specific production skills required by an industrial plant. Instruction may be conducted either in the vocational school or in the industrial plant, depending upon the desired arrangement and the availability of special equipment.

Bluegrass State Skills Corporation

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation, an independent public corporation created and funded by the Kentucky General Assembly, provides programs of skills training to meet the needs of business and industry from entry level to advanced training, and from upgrading present employees to retraining experienced workers.

The Bluegrass State Skills Corporation is the primary source for skills training assistance for a new or existing company. The Corporation works in partnership with other employment and job training resources and programs, as well as Kentucky's economic development activities, to package a program customized to meet the specific needs of a company.

RECREATION

Local

A wide variety of recreational opportunities is available to residents of Stamping Ground and Scott County. The City of Stamping Ground schedules supervised recreational programs each summer at the Stamping Ground Elementary School. Recreational facilities at the school include a gymnasium, playground, and ball fields. Public facilities include five parks.

The Ed Davis Playground features playground equipment, a recreation building, two basketball courts, horseshoe pits, and a picnic shelter. The Buffalo Springs Park consists of two acres of passive recreation. Features at the 12-acre Suffoletta Park include a swimming pool, tennis courts, basketball and volleyball courts, four baseball fields, a horseshoe pitching complex, a picnic pavilion, picnic tables, and playground equipment. Marshall Park features a softball field, a youth football field, and playground equipment.

The 90-acre Scott County Community Park has a baseball and softball field, two new soccer fields, tennis courts, basketball courts, volleyball courts, and a lighted horse show ring with a show barn. The park also includes a picnic area, several playground areas, a lighted regulation-size croquet court, a tractor pull area, a concession-multi-purpose building, and parking.

The Georgetown-Scott County Parks and Recreation Board sponsors youth sports programs in baseball, football, soccer, T-ball, basketball, swimming, tennis, and ponytail softball. The board sponsors a supervised summer playground program at four locations for age 6 to 15, a summer camp for handicapped children, and a year-round supervised latchkey service is offered at the Ed Davis Recreation Building. The board also offers Red Cross-approved swimming lessons and sponsors a 10K race and two tennis tournaments yearly. During the evening hours, the community pool may be rented for private parties. Adult programs are offered in men's, women's, co-recreational, and church softball; men's, women's, and co-recreational volleyball; men's basketball; square dance classes; horseshoe pitching leagues; and tennis lessons and leagues.

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENTS

Recent

A twelve-acre Industrial Park was recently developed by the City of Stamping Ground on Kentucky 227, adjacent to the Municipal Wastewater Treatment Plant. The city invested \$110,000 in the land for the park and \$50,000 in utilities and an access road. Grading, storm water retention, seeding, ditching and an entrance improvement on Kentucky 227 have been completed. The Industrial Park is served by six-inch sewer and six-inch water lines and has three phase electric. Three phase electric was also installed recently at the existing 60-acre industrial site.

Commonwealth Tool located in the newly developed Industrial Park in 1990. The plant employs 23 and manufactures machine, tools, dies, jigs, and fabricated metals. Commonwealth Tool is a supplier for Toyota and Johnson Controls.

In 1989, Stamping Ground received a \$50,000 Community Development Block Grant which they used to help Commonwealth Tool and Machine purchase equipment. A revolving loan fund has been created using funds from Commonwealth Tool's repayment of the Community Development Block Grant. Loans are made to facilitate industrial expansions or other community development projects.

1990 marks the 200th birthday of Stamping Ground. The city published a commemorative booklet on Stamping Ground's history and many events were held in observance of Stamping Ground's bicentennial.

A new pump was installed at the water filtration plant in 1990. The \$1,200 investment increased the plant's treatment capacity by 25,000 gallons.

Five retail and service businesses have opened in Stamping Ground in the last two years.

In 1989, a 12-unit apartment building was constructed in Stamping Ground using Farmer's Home Loan funds.

Underway

Construction of a mini-mall in downtown Stamping Ground is currently underway. The mall will contain several specialty shops.

Planned

Stamping Ground plans to develop a model community park in conjunction with the Georgetown-Scott County Recreation Board. The park, which will be located at the Stamping Ground Elementary School, is scheduled to be completed by 1991.
