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

#### AN ACT

to incorporate the Christian Church in

Hustonville, Kentucky:

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky: 1st. That the members of the Christian Church in Hustonville be and are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of Hustonville Christian Church with perpetual succession and by that name shall be Capable of contracting and being contracted with, suing and being sued, of purchasing and holding all such real and personal estate as may be deemed necessary for the use and accomodation of said church. They shall have power to receive all necessary conveyancés, to sell, convey, and dispose of all such real and personal estate

RECORD BOOK OF THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH, HUSTONVILLE, KENTUCKY as they may now have or hereinafter receive by devise, gift, purchase. and otherwise.

- 2nd. That the concerns of said Corporation shall be managed by W.L. Williams, Geo. Carpenter, E.W. Brown, J.M. Hocker, Edmond Powell, J.M. Cook, F.S. Kauffman, and David Williams as trustees of said Church, and as such have perpetual succession; that said Trustees shall have the power to fill all vacancies that may occur in the Board provided such persons as may be proposed to fill such vacancies shall be at that time members of said Christian Church and in good standing and in full fellowship, and that such appointment be subject to the ratification by the congregation.
- 3rd. The Legislature reserves the right to alter or repeal this CHARTER and this act shall take effect from its passage. Approved Jany 15, 1858

Written into the Charter later above their names - E.W. Brown resigned Geo. Carpenter resigned - Ednond Powell died - David William left church and joined the Presbyterians

The Trustees of the Christian Church met and proceeded to fill vacancies in this body according to the Charter for the same. Whereupon Tilman Hocker, Wm. C. Bailey, W.T. Cahill, and Geo. C. Riffe, and Wyatt Sandidge were added to the number- June 30,1866

The Trustees of the Christian Church met Sep. 20th 1884 and proceeded to fill vacancies in their body according to their charter . ( Geo. C. Riffs and F.S. Kaughman having died, W.C Bailey, W.T Caihill and Tilman Hocker having resigned) J.P. Riffe, G.G. Helm, J.W. Powell, E.S. Powell & T.J. Robinson were added to their number.

Farthing Sargent, R.F.D.#2, Box 144, Effingham, Illinois, 62401, a grandson of the journalist, Jacob (Peter) Farthing.

Regarding the "Peter" Farthing Journal from which the death dates were taken :-- Jacob (Peter) was the son of James Farthing (b. 1807 Pittsylvania Co. VA) and Susan (nee) Farthing, 1st. cousins, she being also of Pittsylvania Co. I believe it was they who kept the list of the dates of deaths. They m. in Pitts. Co. Va. 1828. In 1840 they were living in Logan Co. and the 1850 census of Robertson Co. TN found them there. A daughter 16, had apparently been born in KY and another dau. 17 b. in Ohio (1833) A number of Farthings went first to Ohio from VA, thence to KY/TN. Peter himself was born in Logan Co. in 1844. Since the dates of the deaths started before James and Susan were married I assume the list was started by one of their parents and that they inherited the job. James fr. was John, son of Richard and Grissell (WATSON) FARTHING, and Susan was the dauof Bbner FARTHING (I believe). James and Susan migrated to Marion Co. IL ca 1853 and died in 1856, probably of cholera.

James was the grandson of Grissell (WATSON) FARTHING whose sister was Anaphilda (WATSON) Townsen, mother of Jabez, and the whose browher was William WATSON, also of Logan. Other families whose names may be familiar to you with whom the FARTHINGS intermarried were Samuel PARSONS whom Rebecca FARTHING (dau of Rich and Gris.) m. 1779. Their children were (with possibly an error or two)

Richard B. Parsons m. Letty YATES Elizabeth Parsons m. Richard Farthing Stephen Parsons m Lucy FARTHING

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Another dau. of Richard and Grissell was Michael (Mickell) FARTHING who m. Charles NICHOLS, 6 Sept. 1786. Many of the above came to Logan.

Dudley FARTHING, son of Richard and Grissell, m. Mary (Polly) ADAMS, dau. of <u>Nathan ADAMS</u>. who also migrated to the Red River area.

In the next generation, grandchildren of Richard and Grissell--Lucy FARTHING m. Stephen PARSON s 16 Jul 1810, Pitts. Co. and Frances FARTHING m. David Parsons 4 Feb, 1841. Shsan FARTHING m. John J. CRANE 17 Jul. 1858, (Robertson Co.) Solomon FARTHING (b. 1777) m. Milley WATSON. They settled on Buzzard Cr. in Robertson Co. before 1820.

Richard Farthing II, son of Richard I m. Elizabeth Parsons and settled first on the N. side of Barren R. in Warren Co. near Clifty Cr. then moved to Robertson Co. His sons m. Lucinda HIGHSMITH, Polly PARSONS, Mariah JONES, Elizabeth HOLLAND and his dau.'s m. <u>Alfred JONES</u> and <u>Thos. FREY</u>, all between Adairvilée and Springfield.




LOGAN

For many years I have believed that my 4th great grandfathr was the younger brother of Benjamin Logan, KY frontiersman. This younger brother William came later than his other family members from Va to KY. All my Logan family were from the Lincoln and Pulaski Co. areas of KY. Some information indicates that my William Logan, A Revolutionary War veteran, was from Newcastle in Henry Co. KY. Please study the family information printed in this Newsletter to see if you might add additional records which might clear up this matter. Are there Revolutionary War records for both William's which might establish the accurate family idenity?.....Lois Masters, 219 Wenatchee, Umatilla, Oregon 97882



The following 13 pages are submitted by Lois Masters, 219 Wenatchee, Umatilla, Oregon 97882 in the hopes that someone with additional information will be able to enlighten her more on what happened to this family.





...Also give unto my wife Sally Logan my Nearo woman Sarah during her life then to my children and lastly appoint my two sons James M. Logan and William H. Logan Executor of this my last will and testament revoking all other and former ones heretofore made and do hereby empower them to transact all of business after my death the same as I were living. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 29th day of October in the year 1847.

Signed: Hugh Logan

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Lincoln Logan and his wife were married on March 6, 1822 in Pulaski County, Kentucky. Their lives, like their father's were hard ones spent on the frontier borders of an emerging nation.

Tax records show Lincoln Logan was a farmer. He owned land along Fishing Creek in Fulaski County, Kentucky.

On December 13, 1822, Lincoln's first son Columbus Hugh was born. According to the 1840 Census of Fulaski County, two female children were born between 1825 and 1830. The name of one of those girls is known to have been America. The other girl may have died with her parents or at least before 1847. Her name is not known. Carter was born between 1830 and 1835. Then a girl, Sarah Jane was born on May 15, 1835. On April 5, 1837 the last of their six children was born. He was named John Lincoln Logan.

Five months after John Lincoln's seventh birthday, intestate probate records show Lincoln Logan had died. Shortly before his death, court records show he had bought a yearling and two heifers as well as feed. This indicates to the writer his death was unexpected. Additionally, records of his wife and the other daughter cannot be found. Often a widow's pension was created by the court. No such record exists. How did they die? Disease? Fire?

In the will of Lincoln's father, no mention of Mary Holmes Logan or the daughter is made. Even so, the "heirs" of Lincoln Logan are listed. If someone of our family should be in Pulaski County, Kentucky, a search of the cemeteries in existence at that time might be made to determine the location of the graves.

At the death of their parents, it appears America, Sarah and John moved into the home of a relative of their mothers. The 1850 Census of Pulaski County, Kentucky shows Telemachus Holmes as the head of a family. Besides the three children of Lincoln Logan, there is also a 29 year old merchant, Davis Logan, a 25 year old female, Angeline Holmes and a 35 years old female Margaret Holmes. All of these people are listed as one family.

Pulaski County tax records show Telemachus Holmes paid land taxes at least from 1834 to 1847. More research on this man may show he was an uncle to John Lincoln and the brother of Mary Holmes. Following this man's record may be the only way to locate Mary Holmes Logan's parentage.

Eelow are some extractions from the intestate record of Lincoln Logan:

When Sarah Jane Logan married Morgan Slade Hammonds on August 31, 1854, they must have opened their home to John Lincoln. In 1860, shown at age 23, John Lincoln was living with his sister and brother-in-law. He was a Com. school teacher at that time.

Like so many young men at that time, his life was altered forever by the Civil War. On August 7, 1861, he formed a company of Kentucky Volunteers. Known as the 3rd Kentucky Volunteer Infantry, John Lincoln left a fine record of his activities and an outstanding history of the foot soldier's travail during that Civil War.<sup>1</sup> Following are a few entries from his diary. Hopefully, at some time a complete copy of his diary will be made available for these desiring it.

Dec. 25, 1863. We have been in camp all day. Stood to arms before daylight. Had rabbit, butter, cornbread, crackers and coffee for breakfast. For dincer, no rabbit. For surper, no meat...Had a party policing in the morning...Read the newspapers and passed off the day in camp without any amusements. But I hope for a better day.

Jan. 5, 1864. A cold, cloudy day. We have been in camp all day. (typical of many early entries)

A cory of his military and pension record can be obtained from the General Services Administration, Washington, D.C. There is a charge of a few dollars for this.

...Also give unto my wife Sally Logan my Negro woman Sarah during her life then to my children and lastly appoint my two sons James M. Logan and William H. Logan Executor of this my last will and testament revoking all other and former ones heretofore made and do hereby empower them to transact all of business after my death the same as I were living. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 29th day of October in the year 1847.

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May 26, 1864. Clear. Fighting has commenced... I expect hard fighting today...We've only got 12 men for duty today...Collins took some 50 men and went out to the first line to build works...The sharpshooters are hitting some of our men...It is now 4 p.m. Troops are moving to our left. We expect an engagement soon. Ch Lord, be with us, is my trair, and save us and crown us with a victory without sustaining mutch loss. But thy will be done. But O Lord, I trust in thee for our victory, and for all earthly success, both in war and in peace Lord, give us a steedy peace. By Thy aid, we'll succeed in this time of trouble...."

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June 1st, 1864. Came on picket at daylight. Firing is going on all day. We are in our rifle pits. If you raised your (head), you'd be shot at. Corpl. Baugh and John Reynolds was wounded. I got so sick I could not stay till night. Collins took my place. Oh what a headache I had....

June 2nd, '64. We are behind cur works, but greatly exposed. On mar of Co. B was shot this morning..., probably mortally. I am very unwell today. Sergt. Trimble, Thomas Hoover was wounded seriously at the breastworks.

June 18th, '64. Our Regt was ordered forward over a branch and muddy field and up a ravine close to the Rebel battery. We fought about 5 hours in the rain and mud.' Loss was considerable in our Regt. It was the worst day on us of the war. We had 5 killed and 111 wounded.

June 21st, '64....Run the Rebels from their rifle pits ....It was a gloricus little charge and well executed. We were wet and slept cold. Oh, Bad.

June 27th. ....We are to make an attack along the line....Oh, Lord, save us and give us a victory. But peace, oh, sweet peace is what I desire. (the battle followed) Ch, Lord, I am thankful to Thee for the preservation of my life.

July 22nd, 1864. ....Men of the reserve are very much displeased about having to advance the lines. Are boistrous and slough....I have only 8 men for duty. Oh, Lord God, be with us is my Prair....Skirmishing still going on...I am very sleepy....We moved to the right while bombs were flying thick over us.... Our fellows gave back at first, but retook the ground and drove the Rebels with great loss to them. Aug. 6, 1864. We remained in camp all day. Cur three years was out on that day, but we still have to stay here.

August 17, 1864. Our regiment seems to be a little confused over a raper gotten up in the regt against doing duty in the front. The Col. had the party asserbled and gave them the opportunity to erase their names and a good many did so. And finally, S.R. Tarter reduced from Sergt. for insubordination.

August 18, 1864. The Col. went to the hospt. to order Capt. Gilmore back to his company.

The source of love lies in two of the purest sentiments, admiration and hope. In love contrary to almost all other passons, the memories of the past are always superior to the hopes of the future. Love, like life, cannot subsist without continual movement. And it ceases to live the moment it ceases to hope or fear.

John Lincoln Logan was discharged October 16, 1864. After his discharge, John Lincoln married Eliza Jane Osborn. Eliza Jane had been born in Somerset, Kentucky. But the couple's marriage took place in Albany, Missouri July 4, 1865.

Family tradition here takes hold and gives us some interesting stories. One is that Miss Osborn's parents disapproved of the marriage. This is not possible as her parents were dead at the time, but perhaps her Uncles who cared for her did not approve. A second story tells of a gunfight over the antagonisms left by the Civil War. John Lincoln escaped to hide out for a time in Texas; thus leaving his bride.

The account of their life left by Eliza Jane, but written in 1939, is the only record we have of this time. It follows:

#### Our Travels

I was born on a farm near Somerset, Fulaski County, Kentucky on September 24, 1844. My father, Caswell Osborn, was born Feb. 2, 1815. My mother was born January 14, 1818. Her maiden name was Elizabeth Hammonds. There were seven children of my father's family, two sisters and one brother older than myself and two sisters and one brother younger. We did not have the school advantages that there are now, had only three months of school each year. I walked two and a half miles to and from my first school and carried my lurch.

:-

I remember well the first matches that came around, and how we had to make fires before that, by striking a flint, with a steel knife and kindle fire from the spark. Everyone tried to keep fire by covering it up in the ashes in the fireplace, and sometimes when it did not keep, we would go and borrow a chunk of fire from a neighbor a mile away. We did our cooking on the open fire, baking bread, pies and cakes in a cast iron skillet, with a lid, by putting coals of fire under and on top of the skillet on the hearth. There were no cockstoves at that time. We spun the yarn and wove the cloth for our winter clothes and blankets, and knit our winter stockings.

My mother died when I was twelve years old, when she was only 39. I joined the Christian Church when I was thirteen. I taught school when I was sixteen and taught a part of each year after that until I was 21 years old.

In the spring of 1863 my father went from our home in Ky to Mo and bought land intending to move there, but was taken sick and died on Oct. 10, 1863 at the age of 48.

At that time, my older brother, John C. Osborn was in the Union Army with Gen. Sherman on his "March to the Sea". He served over four years, and when he went to get his discharge, was taken with smallpox and died at the age of 24, was buried in the National Cemetery at Louisville, Ky.

In the Spring of 1864 I and three sisters and my younger brother, with three of my uncles, and their families, moved from Ky to Alanthus Grove, Mo.

I was married on the 4th of July, 1865 at Albany, Gentry Co., Mo to John Lincoln Logan, who was born in Ky on April 5th, 1837; his father's name was Lincoln Logan. His mother's maiden name was Mary Holmes. His parents died when he was a small boy.

At the beginning of the Civil War, he made up a Company for the Union Army and served as First Lieut. and was later promoted to Capt.. of Co. C 3rd Ky Vol Inft. was commissioned Major of the Mo. Militia after he got out of the Regular Army with Gen. Sherman.

On one occasior while in the Army, he was detailed to bring in to the Regiment a number of soldiers who were at home on furlough, and while enroute to the Army were surprised and captured by Gen. John Morgan and his Marauding Band of Cavalry, and taken to Confederate headquarters, then sent to Carp Chase, Ohio and kert there until exchanged. They then got back to their Regiment. ١

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We lived on a farm in Mo, where Melvern was born on Sept. 14, 1866 and Leon born on July 20th, 1868.

We left Gentry Co. Mc Aug. 10, 1868, went South through Indian Territory and into Texas, nearly to the Southern Border. But it being so soon after the Civil War and the slaves had just been liberated, we found that would not be a pleasant place to live, so turned and went back to Ultamathiele, Sevier Co. Ark., arrived there in Nov. 1868. Raised a cotton crop, disposed of it and left there in ox wagon in Dec. 1869 for Kansas City, Mo., then on train to Calif and from there on the ocean steamer from SanFrancisco to Fortland, Cre.

Arrived in Folk Co., Ore near Rickreal on March 1st, 1870 where Everett was born on Arril 25, 1870, and where Olive was born on Sept. 6, 1871. We left there for Tracy, Calif in wagon and from Tracy on train to Colorado Springs, and from there in wagon by way of Pikes Feak to Delnorte, Conejos Co., Colorado on the RicGrande River where Boyd was born on Jan 17th, 1873. We left there in June, 1873, for Pueblo Colorado. Left there in May 1874. Arrived in Grayson County, Tex, near Sherman in March 1875, where Ettle was born on April 4th, 1876, went from there to Gainesville, Cook Co, Texas in Nov. 1877, then to a place in Cook Co., near Valley View where Zenett was born on March 10th, 1879, went from there to the Indian Territory In Nov 1880, where John L. Jr. was born Feb. 6, 1881; went from there to Burlington, Tex in Arr. 1881, then in wagen to Newton, Kansas, took train there to Los Angeles, California; left there in Jan. 1882 in wagon for Eastern Oregon. Arrived in Gilliam County, near Arlington in 1882 where Oren was born on June 17th. 1887. We left there for Monmouth in Nov. 1894, left there in April 1895, arrived on the West side of the San Joaquin River near Westley, Calif on the 4th of July, 1895, and in the Spring of 1896, moved to Cakdale, Calif, remaining there until the year 1906, then moved to Stockton, Calif.

Left Stockton May 5th, 1909, arrived in Portland, Ore May 9, 1909 and on April 25, 1910 settled down at 103 E. 82nd St. N., where my husband passed away on Dec. 2nd, 1915.

On Sept 24th, 1932, the number on our home was changed to 323 N.E. 82nd Avenue where I with a part of our family still reside this August the 6th, 1935.

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More has been written; more research has been done on the ancestral lines of Eliza Jane Csborn. Virginia and Kentucky court records are full of fascinating references to the Osborns, (Ozburns, Osbornes, etc.). An outstanding book, <u>Kinfolk of William Parke and Synah Perry...etc.</u> (see bibliography) tells the best story of this family. It is highly interesting as the author tells many personal anecdotes from the lives of these people. She also directs people to places they could visit now and rediscover the family trail.

The Osborn line itself is not traced a great distance back. But offshoots from this line, as you can see from the enclosed bedigree charts do go back several centuries.

For your interest, two will extractions are following. One is from the will of Caswell Osborn, Eliza Jane's father. It is from Will Book 6; page 209 of Fulaski County, Kentucky. The date is 21 September 1863.

The bay horse called John C. Osborn's and the large yoke of cattle and any other stock, thought most suitable for the purpose to be sold by Josiah W. Osborn to manage my estate for benefit of himself and the other heirs while they remain together, any leaving at marriage or mature age, to have a horse valued at 3100. and a saddle at \$15. When youngest is 21, all remaining to be divided equally among my heirs, and my son, Josiah W. Osborne, excr., it to distribute same. My son John C. Osborn and my daughter Mary M. Minton have received their full share already.

I authorize my brother Gilbert Osborn to sell and convey title to my land in the flat woods of this country for the benefit of my heirs and estate (except my son J. W. trading in lands before he is 21 years.)

Guardia Caswell Osber Thip records were set up following the death of Eliza Jane, T. His brother Gilbert was set up as guardian of Falthy Ann, Josiah W. and Frances Isabell.

Will Book 3; p. 1062 has this will dated 5 Jan 1848. It is the will of whn Hammonds, maternal grandfather of Eliza Jane.
