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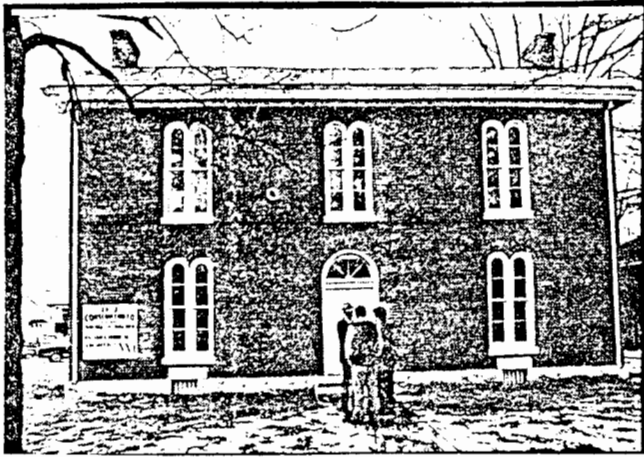

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THE LOGAN COUNTY ARCHIVES

The "Land of Logan" or "The Free State of Logan" are both maxims which bring a bright smile to the face of those with ties to Logan County, Kentucky. And well it should, as Logan is the parent county of twenty-eight south-central and southwestern Kentucky counties. The following counties were

formed wholly or in part from Logan, or from counties which had previously been formed from Logan:

Logan County was formed in 1792--the same year Kentucky was granted statehood--from the area which was previously Lincoln County, Virginia. Therefore, if you are searching for ancestors in this region of Kentucky, around the turn of the Nineteenth Century, you might enjoy visiting the Land of Logan, and, particularly, the Logan County Archives in historic Russellville, Kentucky.

The evolution of this archives, from an original simple need for record storage to a finely organized public research center, is a commendable example of community foresight, cooperation, dedication, and pride.

In 1978, Logan County was in dire need of adequate storage space for its older court records. At this same time, several citizens were interested in preserving the old jail, an Eighteenth Century structure which had recently been replaced by a modern building (it is believed the cut stones in the "old jail" are from the original Logan jail). Keeping the old court records in Logan County and research accessibility to them was a primary concern to still another group. After all three positions were vigorously argued before the fiscal court, a compromise position, consisting of all three, was decided to be the best one. In August of 1978, the court, led by County Judge Bob Brown, voted to spend over \$80,000 to remodel the old jail for record storage. The architect's plan called for office space for the researchers' convenience.

In February of 1980, Judge Brown was presented the key to the resplendent restored structure. However, unforeseen difficulties arose when the massive volume of records arrived. It seems no one had foreseen the sheer number involved or the state of the records, after having been stored in the courthouse attic and the county road barn for a number of years.

Fortunately, the Logan County Genealogical Society rose to the herculean effort--volunteering to clean and organize the records. For the past six years, thirteen dedicated men and women of this Society (or "the group"--as they have lovingly become known) have volunteered literally thousands of hours of time to clean, press, file, index, box and shelve the early records of this region of Kentucky.

A sign designating this historic structure as "The Logan County Archives" has recently been set in place. This was a special moment for the many people who have aided in making it possible to preserve these records and keep them readily accessible to the people of this region, where many decendants of the early settlers still abide. And a very special "tip of the hat" for a job well done is due to the following thirteen men and women of The Logan County Genealogical Society: Judy Lyne (President of the Society when the project was undertaken), Mildred Russell (present President), Alva and Viola Pate, Betty Cates, Eleanor Poindexter, Drucilla Jones, Mary Elizabeth Duff, Carolyn Garrett, Nita Williams, Charles Veu Casovic, Lucy Lockhart and the late Kathryn Johnson.

The records stored in this archives are now in as excellent condition and order as any found in major archives. The group gives much credit to Mrs. Pat Hodges and her staff at the Kentucky Building Library and Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky, for the excellent result of the Society's work to date. Mrs. Hodges trained the group in the proper methods of processing and preserving old documents. Other help came from the Kentucky Administrative Office of the Court, which donated proper storage containers; a grant was obtained through the National Historical Publications and Records Commission; two Bowling Green businessmen donated a copy machine; funds for other supplies were donated by a local industry, a foundation, and appreciative people both in and out of state who had traced their heritage to the Land of Logan.

In 1983, Mr. Riley Handy, Head of the Kentucky Building Library and Museum, was so impressed by the results of the restoration project that he presented the Society with several boxes of early Logan records (some dating back to 1793) which had been placed in the Kentucky Building at an earlier date by an anonymous donor. Still yet, another set of original Logan County documents arrived anonymously from Mexico.

The Archives is located on the same block as the Logan Courthouse, on West 4th Street in Russellville. It is open to the public Monday through Friday from 7:30 A.M. to 2:00 P.M.* "The group" meets at the Archives each Tuesday to continue their work on various preservation

projects and to help visitors. On other days, Mrs. Evelyn Graham greets and assists researchers at the Archives. A copy machine is available at 25¢ per copy, and cold drinks are available for purchase. You are welcome to bring your lunch and "make yourself at home." If you cannot arrange a visit, the group will do MINOR research (1 question per letter, accompanied by an S.A.S.E.) at no charge except for the regular 25¢ per copy (see address below).

Among the records stored in the Archives are Circuit Court order books, loose case files for both Ordinary and Equity cases, Criminal Court cases, Judgment cases from the County Judge's office, and some Guardian books (some are still in County Clerk's office). The early original Will books are also stored here for preservation only; due to their fragile condition, the researcher is asked to use the excellently reproduced copies, which are in the County Clerk's office.

A card index of over 50,400 cards is available for use at the Archives, which lists (in alphabetical order) all major participants in Equity cases from 1800 through 1940, as well as the principal parties. In the many cases wherein heirs of an individual have been mentioned in an Equity case, these heirs have been assigned an index card, which cites the particular suit or case.

The Archives has not been the only project of this seemingly untiring and industrious group. They have also compiled and assembled an impressive list of genealogical aids to Logan County, their latest being Logan County, Kentucky, Cemeteries. This hardbound book contains 751 pages and over 29,000 names. The collection for the book began in 1979. Some of the entries are from the papers of the late Logan County researcher, Mrs. J. Wells Vick--her notes and records have been preserved by the Society; in many cases the tombstones no longer exist.

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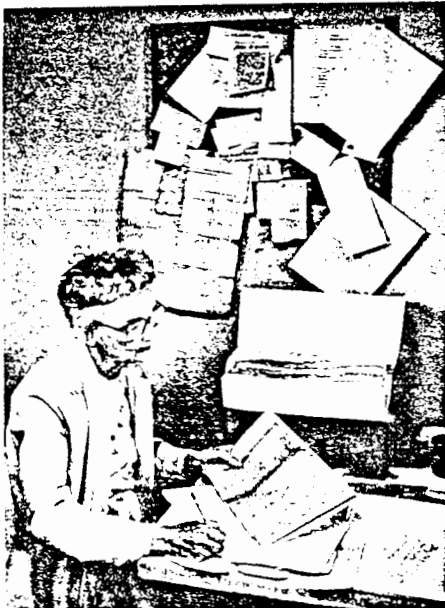
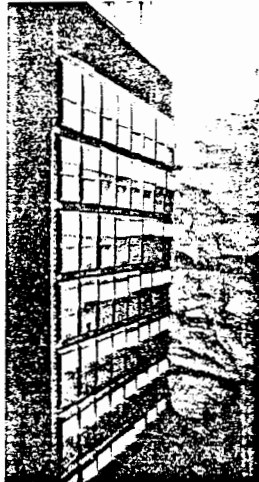

Fulltime parttimers

THAT WHICH STARTED as a one-time project has become a full-time, non-paying job for a dedicated group of volunteers known as the Logan County Genealogical Society. The group was organized in 1979 to straighten and file the papers of genealogical interest of the late Mrs. J. Wells Vick. Some three years later, the Genealogical Society is in the midst of the monumental task of sorting, restoring, and filing countless documents which are of permanent interest to the people of Logan County and their descendants. The society has been given and accepted the responsibility for housing county records in the old jail, which has been restored for that purpose. The photos show some of the work involved. 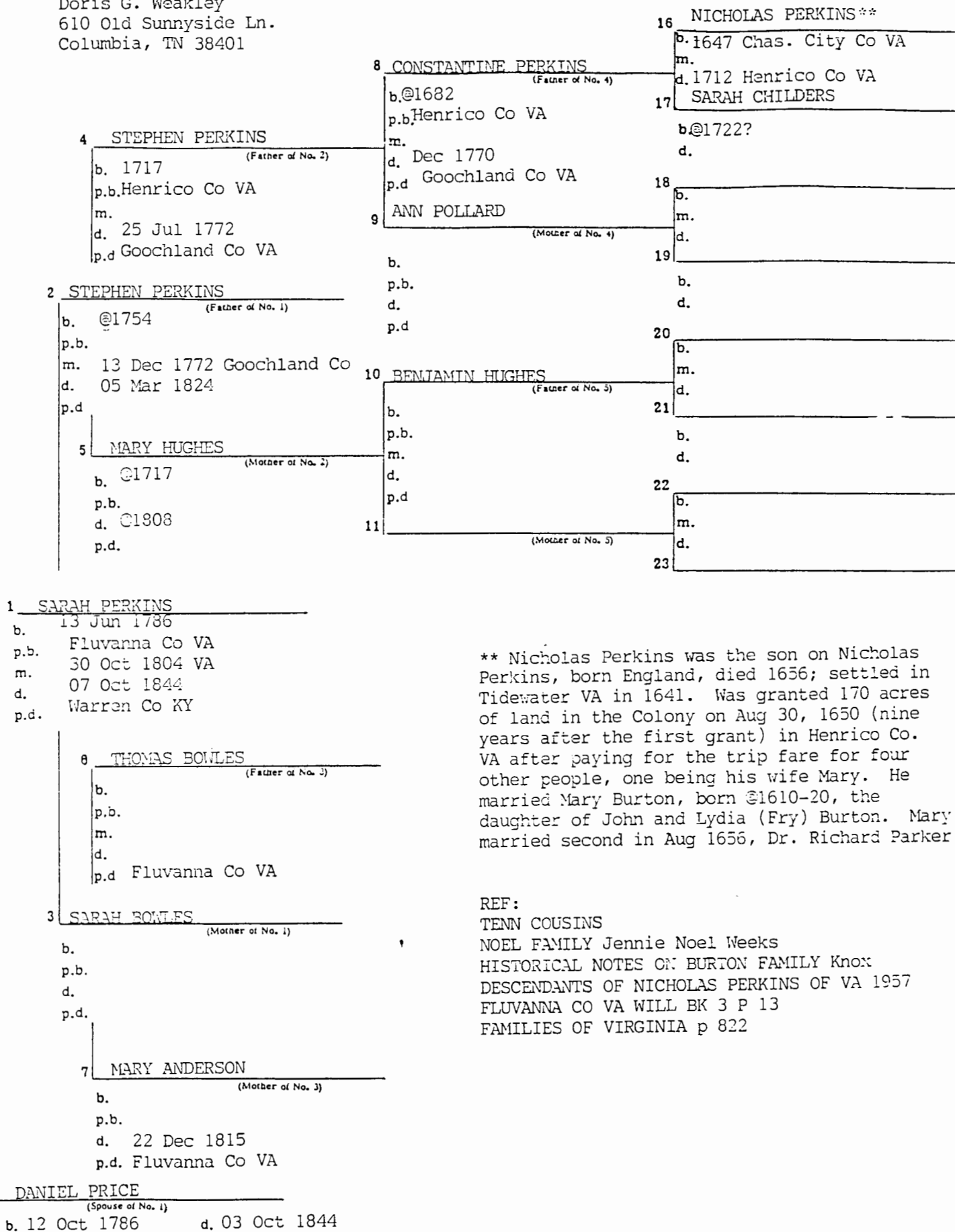

He married Mary Burton, born @1610-20, the daughter of John and Lydia (Fry) Burton. Mary married second in Aug 1656, Dr. Richard Parker.

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SEARCHING IN VIRGINIA

by Glenn M. Turnell

These comments on Virginia will be concerned primarily with the early period and counties, the counties where it is difficult to get records, and with the southwest area where many of our ancestors ended up after generations of slow movement across the state from a beginning in Henrico and other original shires.

On July 30, 1619, Virginia called to order a group from which the newly elected Burgesses from each town, hundred or plantation would form the first representative legislative body in the New World. After the necessary preliminaries, the Royal Governor, Sir George Yeardley, established a precedent for future American legislatures - he appointed two committees to study and recommend action on those parts of Virginia's Great Charter of 1618 dealing with land. Most of the laws in existence were adopted - fines were payable in tobacco and labor; every householder was supposed to reserve a barrel of corn for each person living on his land, and this corn was to be sold to the Virginia Co. of London or exchanged for needed products. Land and tobacco were the first things of record in Virginia, and because of these items we have records to help trace our ancestors. Also, we have the "head right" - 50 acres for each person transported to the new land - but this was highly abused and many names on the lists should be questioned, especially dates shown as arrivals. Again, there are the Land Patents, but these, too, must be considered carefully as oftentimes a Patent was not recorded until many, many years after settlement, so do check these for names and dates.

THE HANDY BOOK FOR GENEALOGISTS by Everton Publishers, Inc., which is practically a necessity for any researcher, gives the various counties, when and from what they were formed and usually what records are available and where you may write for them. Therefore, rather than go into that phase, I thought it might be of help to tell you about where you CAN NOT GET RECORDS and some of the TYPES.

- APPAMATTOX - Lost a number of records in an 1892 fire.
- BUCHANAN - Had a total loss of records in 1885. Some deeds were brought in and re-recorded in an effort to replace records.
- BUCKINGHAM - Suffered a loss by fire in the Civil War period and again in 1869. There are a few records available in the Huntington Library in San Marino, CA.
- CAROLINE - Records destroyed in 1836 and again in the Civil War, with the exception of a few which are mostly mutilated.
- CHARLES CITY - Most records lost when they were scattered during a rainstorm following a raid on the Court House by Federal troops. Some were returned by local citizens but many remain lost.
- DINWIDDIE - Some records destroyed in 1830's and again in 1864, but not as extensive as might be imagined or suggested.

- ELIZABETH CITY - Has had several destructions of records but the Vestry Parish Book survives.
- GLOUCESTER - Practically no early records of period before 1821. Abingdon Parish records from 1678 have been published.
- HANOVER - Sent records to Richmond, supposedly for safe keeping during the Civil War, and all were destroyed in the great fire which raged though the city. There are a few original volumes which had been transcribed and retired and which were not among those destroyed.
- JAMES CITY - Practically no records - only those which can be picked up from the references to James City in other records and the Williamsburg and Burton Parish records.
- KING WILLIAM - Only 17 Will Books saved - all else destroyed by fire in 1885.
- KING & QUEEN - All destroyed in a Reconstruction fire with the exception of a few very early records.
- MATTHEWS - All destroyed except a few Fee Books and some records dating after 1890.
- NANSEMOND - Total destruction in 1866. Try surrounding counties for possible records.
- NEW KENT - Records destroyed in 1787 and 1865. St. Peter's Parish records survived.
- PRINCE GEORGE - Most destroyed during the Civil War but the Register of Bristol Parish is available. Also, Dr. Benjamin B. Weisiger, III of Richmond has assembled some old records into two Volumes - VOL I, RECORDS 1733-1792 and VOL II, WILLS and DEEDS 1713-1728 - and both are very good.
- PRINCE WILLIAM - Some records destroyed but more here than in most of the "burned out" counties.
- STAFFORD - Very few early records with the exception of deeds and St. Paul's Parish records.
- WARRICK - Records destroyed in Civil War and earlier. Very few surviving fragments, but these are indexed.

In working with any of the above mentioned counties, be sure and check your HAND BOOK anyway to see what is shown. Also, it never hurts to try sending a request with a SASE, because you just might be lucky and get a favorable answer.

Henrico County has a surprisingly large number of existing records. There are two books by Dr. Weisiger, COLONIAL WILLS OF HENRICO CO., VIRGINIA PART ONE 1654-1737 and PART TWO 1737-1781, which he has published on this county from some of the records not previously in print. They are inexpensive, but very easy to work with and contain many early records.

As the settlers started moving further and further up the James, more and more new counties were formed from this parent county of Henrico. There is a published (in 1981) record of "500 Pages Census of 1850, HENRICO COUNTY and CITY OF RICHMOND", which is a prime source for the capital city of the Commonwealth and its neighboring county, which shows the place of birth of all the persons listed, and hence a migration pattern can be seen for many of the families. If working in the Henrico area always remember to check Chesterfield, what records you can find for Charles City, those for Prince George, Dinwiddie, Albermarle, Powhatan, Goochland and Lunenburg. It has been said that a person could have lived in the same place, not moved an inch and still be recorded in three or four counties, so check them all.

Moving yet further along, we have many early settlers whose descendants can be located in Halifax--taken from Lunenburg in 1752 which then included the present Pittsylvania, Henry and Patrick Counties--and surrounded by Mecklenberg, Charlotte, Campbell Counties and the state of North Carolina. Halifax was, and I trust still is, a very cooperative county as far as the clerks are concerned and I have even had them go out of their way and beyond what might be expected of them in actually searching records to be of help.

At this point I would like to mention three books that have been written about three of the counties above and ask that you use these books with caution. The first is Campbell County with the well-known and greatly used CAMPBELL CRONICLES and FAMILY SKETCHES by Ruth Hairston Early. This book and HISTORY OF HENRY CO., VA by Judith Hill are both reprints of early issues. And then there is HENRY and PATRICK COUNTIES by Pedigo, which is almost a copy of Hill's book. As in all family histories and genealogies there are of course some excellent items and then there are some gross errors which have really fouled up a number of Virginia family lines. DO NOT use information in these books unless you double check with other sources, such as court records. This situation can be said to exist for many area histories and family genealogies.

THE BEVERLY and BORDEN PATENTS of Virginia have many, many names shown which will be very familiar to those searching in Augusta, later in Botetourt which was formed in 1769 from Augusta and then Fincastle which was discontinued in 1777, with Montgomery and Washington Counties picking up at 1776-77.

This now brings us down into the southwest corner of Virginia, where many of the descendants of those real early Virginians settled. Some stayed and are still names well-known today in the area. There is one definite pattern I might mention--Bedford/Campbell families joined with Washington/Montgomery/Lee/Russell and all those southwest area families--many of them in the late 1700's and very early 1800's. In doing your research you will often find an alignment of names indicative of this pattern.

We have now crossed the state from the James River on the coast to the far southwest corner and for any or all the counties there is one source I would especially recommend--THE ENCYCLOPEDIA of AMERICAN QUAKER GENEALOGY by William Wade Hinshaw. Even though you may feel certain an ancestor just could not have been a Quaker, look at these anyway; you never know what you may find and these records are fantastic. Also, do not forget Hening's LAWS OF VIRGINIA.

Personal research in court houses is, of course, the most desirable method, but often impossible. The next is that in libraries, and last but often most necessary, is the obtaining of a record by mail. Some court clerks are very cooperative and others are often almost insulting. One county calls people like us "head hunters" and turns our inquires over to a "genealogist for hire" or sends the request back. We never hear from some counties even though a SASE was sent for a reply. If you do not hear, try again. After all, you are asking for public records and if you are willing to pay a fee to get them, you should at the very least be given the courtesy of a reply, and put that in your second letter of inquiry. Many times it works! Do not, of course, ask these people to do research for you, but if you have a date or even a close approximate date, names and type of instrument wanted, you are entitled to consideration.

The final and probably best source for materials is the VIRGINIA STATE LIBRARY at Richmond. They have called in all the loose records

from counties across the state to put them on microfilm so they may be made available for research with the original then being sent back to the counties. If you do not find what you have been looking for in an individual county, then check this invaluable source. It will usually take some time to get an answer to a request and an equal amount of time to get the copy of the instrument if they have it, but it is well worth waiting for. The Library has published indexes and books on the material there - write Virginia State Library, Richmond, VA 23219 for brochures on publications and information on research at the Library.

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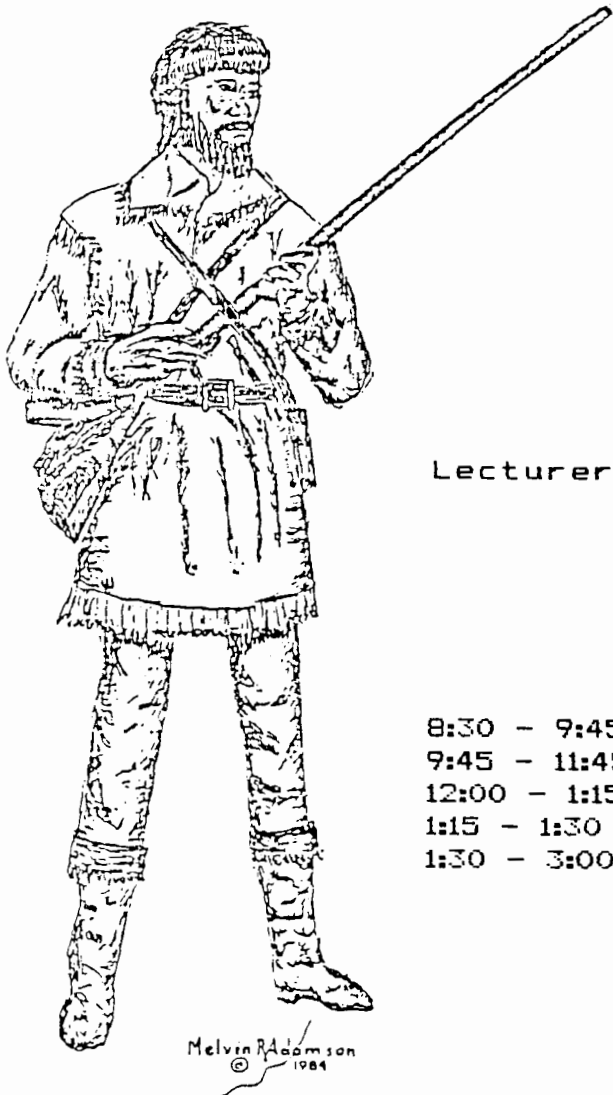
