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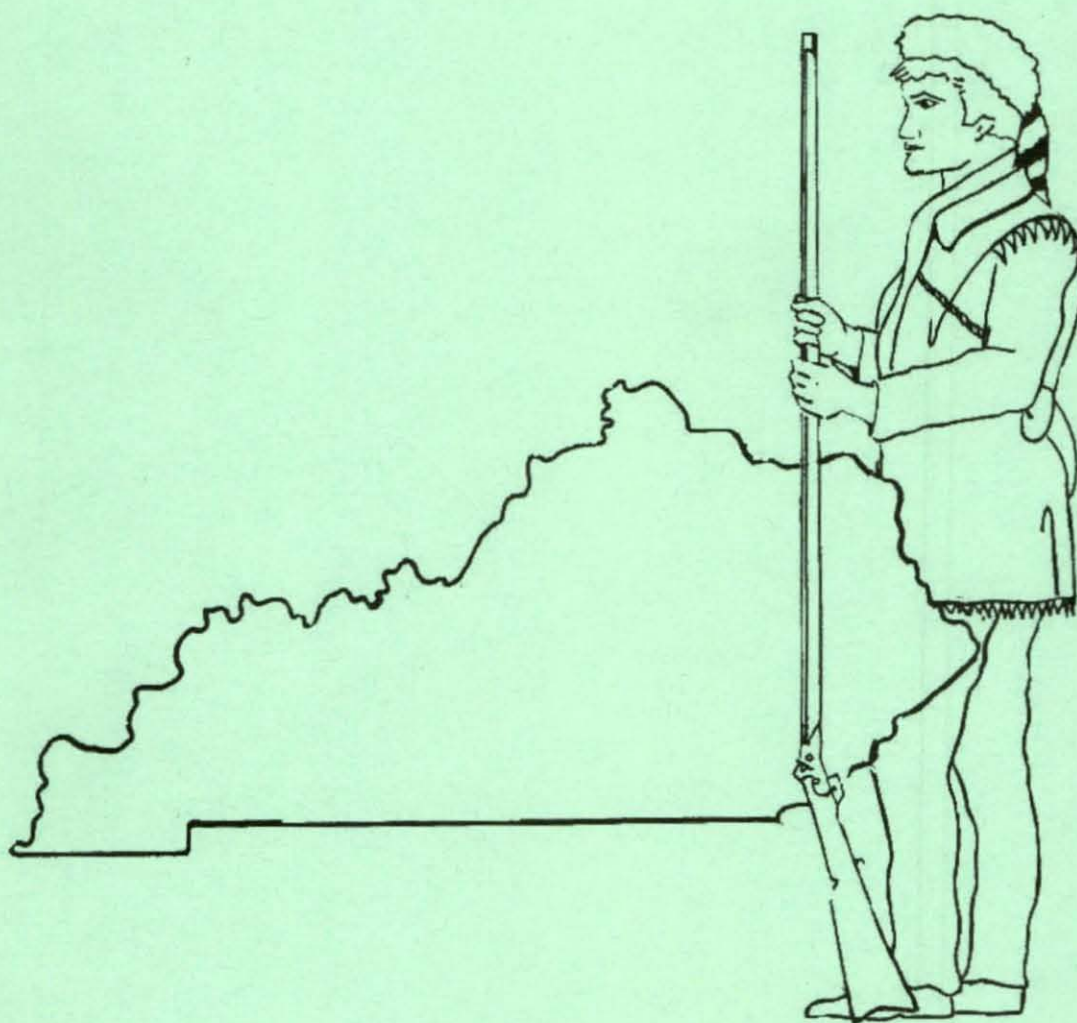

A History of the Little Muddy Creek Valley

(Butler County, Kentucky)

Roger G. Givens is an amateur historian and former co-publisher of the Butler County Banner newspaper, where he wrote weekly articles about Butler County's historical events, people and places. He wrote a feature article about Butler County for the magazine Back Home in Kentucky. He is co-author along with Nancy Richey of Images of America, Butler County by Arcadia Publishing. Givens' current book is, African American Life in Butler County, Kentucky – Black Culture, Contributions, and Community. Givens has given several talks about the Civil War in Butler County and wrote a 200th Anniversary saga and historical booklet of the Mt. Vernon Baptist Church in Butler County. He is retired but stays active serving on the Morgantown/Butler County Chamber of Commerce, Board of Directors, Green River Museum, Board of Directors, Kentucky Historical Highway Marker, county chairperson and is Vice President of the Charles Duncan Chapter, Sons of the American Revolution in Bowling Green.

The Little Muddy Creek Valley was among the first areas to be settled in what would later become Butler County, Kentucky in 1810. Settlement of this area of Logan County began around 1800 with the **Borah, Carson, Ewing, Hay, Helm, Kuykendall**, and **Porter** families. The **Carson**, **Helm**, **Kuykendall** and **Porter** families were the more prominent in the area. Five of these families: - **Borah, Carson, Hay, Helm**, and **Kuykendall** - had at least one known Revolutionary War veteran in each while the **Porter** family had four veterans of the War for Independence among their numbers. The **Carson** and **Helm** families arrived from Campbell County and the **Ewing, Hay**, and **Porter** families from Prince Edward County in Virginia, while the **Borah** family had migrated from Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, and the **Kuykendall** family from Mecklenburg County, North Carolina.

The **Carson, Ewing, Hay, Helm**, and **Porter** families had been closely associated before coming to Kentucky. Several marriages took place between these families both before and after moving to Kentucky. All but the **Ewing** family had members who fought in the War of the Revolution, often in the same campaigns. Collectively they fought with Gen. Daniel Morgan's Rifles at Freemans Farm, the Battle of Saratoga and the surrender of Gen. Burgoyne's at the crossing of the Delaware River with Gen. Washington, in the Carolina Campaign of Gen. Nathanael Green, and in the command of Gen. Morgan's division, including battles at: Cowpens, Siege of Ninety-Six, Guilford Courthouse, Eutaw Springs and Yorktown. **William M. Porter** was severely wounded at Cowpens and thought to be dead. His brothers searched the battlefield via lantern until he was found, having been struck in the face by a British saber, which permanently disfigured him and nearly removed his nose. **John Porter** went on to join Gen. Morgan in putting down the 1794 "Whiskey Rebellion" and was with Gen. "Mad" Anthony Wayne in the 1794 Battle of Fallen Timbers.

After coming to Kentucky **John Porter** and his brothers were instrumental in getting the Butler County Seat named Morgantown in honor of Gen. Daniel Morgan. John was elected to six terms in the Kentucky House of Representatives, first from Logan County then from Butler. During the War of 1812, John served under Gen. William H. Harrison in the 1813 Thames Campaign in which Chief Tecumseh was killed.

Thomas Carson served as the presiding justice of the organizing court for Butler County in 1810 along with his brother-in-law, **William Porter**, who served on the court also. Porter later served as sheriff of Butler County.

All of the aforementioned families were slave holders. One hundred and fifteen slaves, nearly 42 percent of the slaves in Butler County, were settled along the Little Muddy Creek. Esquires **Thomas Carson** and **William Porter** were among the largest slave holders in the county, holding eleven and fourteen slaves respectively. **Matthew Kuykendall**, the first sheriff of Butler County had eight slaves. **William Carson**, the county's first surveyor, had one slave, and **Daniel Hay**, the first assistant judge to the circuit court had two slaves.

In 1805, **Alexander Chapman** migrated to the lower Little Muddy Creek area from Sumner County, Tennessee, in the midst of the "1800 great revival" of Southern Kentucky and Middle Tennessee. This revival had created a division within the Presbyterian Church between "revival"-those believing in the called from the field, so to speak and - "anti-revivals" those believing in the educated and well trained ministry. Chapman had been preaching the word of God according to his convictions of the Presbyterian denomination since about 1803, always siding with the revivals.

Chapman was not a complete stranger to the people of the Little Muddy Creek Valley, having known the Carson family since about 1802 or 1803 when they all lived in Prince Edward County, Virginia. In his earlier years, while working as a teamster, Chapman had been invited to the **Thomas Carson** home. Upon entering the home, he saw **Ann D. Carson** sitting at a wheel spinning. He was immediately enamored by her, possibly the feeling was mutual. They both knew they wanted to pursue the relationship further, according to Chapman's brother Benjamin. They were married in October 1805. Eight children were born to the union.

Under the leadership of Chapman, the congregation of the Little Muddy Church began having camp meetings as early as 1805. In 1811, **Alexander Chapman** was one of the first ordained ministers in the newly created Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Mission work was among the duties of Rev. Chapman in the newly formed denomination. He traveled extensively in his work for the church. Included in his field of labor were Kentucky, Tennessee, Indiana, Illinois, and Pennsylvania where he drew hundreds to hear him speak. He recruited many young men to the ministry and aided in forming many new churches. After serving as pastor of the Little Muddy Church for 29 years, Chapman stepped down in 1834 to be succeeded by his son-in-law, **Nathaniel Porter**. **Alexander Chapman** had a significant and lasting impact on the church, community, state, and, to some degree, nation.

Chapman was a slave holder but was somewhat different from most others in the fact that he required his slaves to attend both morning and evening worship with his family. His instructions to the slaves was that no matter what the work load, they must stop and attend family worship consisting of a reading of scripture, a short dissertation on the subject and a prayer.

In 1811, the Little Muddy Church, would become one of the first Cumberland Presbyterian churches in the newly formed denomination. The congregation first built a story and a half solid chestnut log structure for use as a meeting house and school. The land was donated by Esquire **Thomas Carson**. By the year 1830, the congregation had outgrown the original structure. A decision was made to build a brick building to serve as a church and school. It is assumed to have been built by the labor of slaves. Bricks were made on the grounds. The building has survived the years and is now being used as the Little Muddy Rural Development Center. It is the oldest known brick structure in Butler County.

The brick structure served as a church and school until 1860 when the need for an even larger building became necessary. The present frame structure was built at that time, assumed to have also used slave labor in the construction. After construction of the frame building the original brick building served as the Little Muddy Academy, offering a formal education in the study of Greek, Latin, algebra, and philosophy until the late 1880s or early 1890s, at times having as many as 75 students. In 1891, the building was leased to the Butler County School System and used as a one-room elementary school until 1956. Beginning in 1957, it began to be used as the Little Muddy Rural Development Center and continues to this date. The building remained in its original condition, except for repairs and maintenance and normal wear until 1957. The rural development club has added a side room (kitchen), closed windows on the adjacent side and moved doors from one end of the building to the sides. Otherwise, it is mostly original.

The 1860 frame structure has survived the years in near original construction with the addition of a porch to the front and an entrance foyer to the rear of the building. Sunday school rooms have been added to the inside rear of the church thus decreasing the seating size of the interior. The original pews are still used with the addition of a cushion seat. Notches can still be seen on some pews where gates were hung to divide the slave area in the rear of the church from the rest of the congregation. All of the notched pews have been moved to provide space for the Sunday school rooms. The pulpit and furniture are original. However, the choir area has been added and a door behind it sealed. Little Muddy Cumberland Presbyterian Church records show that as far back as 1837 bondsmen were members of the church and possibly before that.

It is evidenced by the records of the Little Muddy Cumberland Presbyterian Church that there was an African-American church in the area as early as April 15, 1852, listing four Little Muddy members as being "attached to the colored church." The location of the church at this point is only speculation. The possible location, as gathered from older Little Muddy residents as told to younger residents, is that it was located on what is often referred to as Mt. Zion Hill, the next hill

over if standing in front of the present frame church facing U. S. 231 and about 45 degrees to one's left, about one-half mile in distance.

Three other churches are known to have existed in the Sugar Grove area of the Little Muddy Creek Valley: Two of them were churches established by the black residents of that area. One was a Presbyterian Church located on what is today King Road, with the other a Methodist Church located on today's Old Schoolhouse Road next door to the old Sugar Grove "colored" school. Neither of these two exist today. The other church is the Sugar Grove United Methodist Church, which still functions today. It is not known by this writer when any of these churches were established. The African-American Methodist bought property in 1912.

There have been four and possibly five schools other than Little Muddy Academy to serve the Little Muddy Creek Valley: Liberty (grades 1-8) in the upper reaches of the creek, Sugar Grove (grades 1-8) Sugar Grove "Colored" (grades 1-8), and Little Muddy (grades 1-8). It is believed the Mt Zion Church offered a school for about two years operated by the Freedman's Bureau. This is also believed to have been a Sabbath only school, open to all.

Other development and activities in the lower Little Muddy Creek Valley, the area known today as the Little Muddy Community, include the Butler County Court beginning to build roads from the county seat at Morgantown to the surrounding county seats in 1810. The construction of the road from Morgantown in the direction of Bowling Green cannot be determined as to the exact date. Overseers were given permission to build the road in several court meetings from 1810 to 1813. The bridge across Little Muddy Creek at the three-mile point was completed by 1813 as evidenced by its mention in the September court meeting. Thomas Carson was given permission to construct a mill on land he owned in the April 1811 meeting of the Court.

On October 1, 1823, **John, a slave of Alexander Chapman**, was charged with the murder of, **Edmond, a slave of Thomas E. Carson**. On June 15, 1824, John was tried in circuit court and found guilty. He was sentenced to be hanged, which was set for Saturday, July 17, 1824, between the hours of 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. Alexander Chapman was awarded \$650 for his loss. Not by law, but out of a sense of fairness, he split the money with Carson, his brother-in-law. So far as is known John was the only man ever to be legally hanged in Butler County.

Nathaniel Nathan Hodge and his wife, **Jane**, moved into the Little Muddy community from Clark County, Kentucky in about 1811. He enlisted in the 14th (Mitchisson's) Regiment, Kentucky Militia, November 20, 1814. Hodge served in the Battle of New Orleans. He mustered out May 20, 1815, and returned to Butler County where he died in 1819 and is buried near Little Muddy Creek just off U. S. Hwy, 231 along with his wife, Jane, and an infant son.

The establishment of the slack-water navigation system on Green and Barren rivers, 1836-1841, made year round river transportation possible all the way to Bowling Green but, was a mixed bag for farmers in the Little Muddy Creek Valley. It made getting their products to market much

easier while at the same time making their land more susceptible to flooding. Clark's Landing on Barren River in Warren County was the closest shipping point for most of Little Muddy farmers although Woodbury was not much farther for some farmers and had three pork packing houses and two tobacco warehouses.

In his retreat from the Union attack on his encampment at Woodbury on October 29, 1861, Captain Thomas Lewers, CSA, rendezvoused with Colonel Wirt Adams of the Mississippi Cavalry at Little Muddy Church. They gave their troops a two hour rest at the church before setting out for Woodbury to engage Colonel Steven Burbridge's Union troops. Burbridge had already left Woodbury headed for Morgantown when they arrived. Adams caught up with Burbridge as his last units were crossing Borah's Ferry in Logansport. Union troops camped at Little Muddy Church at various times during the Civil War.

Of the roughly estimated 125 soldiers serving the Confederate Army from Butler County, more would come from the Little Muddy Creek Valley than any other community. **Captain Thomas Henry Hines** from Woodbury was the most notable from Butler County, having led the famous prison break from the Ohio State Penitentiary of General John Hunt Morgan, and six of his officers. Later serving as a clandestine military operations leader, Hines operated out of Canada into the northern United States. Hines' grandfather was none other than **Thomas Carson**, First Lieutenant. **John M. Porter**, son of **Rev. Nathaniel Porter**, served as Hines' second in command. Although Porter was not with Hines during the Ohio prison break or Canada operations, due to his own imprisonment at Johnson Island, Ohio, he and two of his subordinates, **Andrew** and **Hezekiah Kuykendall**, from Little Muddy, did participate in the many "behind the lines" operations in this area including: the sinking of the steamer **Hetti Gilmore** at Clarks Landing and the burning of grain bins at the Shaker Village in South Union. **John M. Porter** later served as commonwealth attorney for Warren County.

John M. Porter's uncle, **Dr. Frances "Uncle Frank" Porter**, was advanced in age when the Civil War began but still served: He enlisted at Bowling Green in October 1861; he volunteered to go with the troops to Fort Donaldson; he was captured and then released; he was discharged from service due to his age in November 1862. Uncle Frank returned to his home in Butler County but was later arrested by Union occupational forces and jailed in Bowling Green where he died. John M. Porter believed his uncle was murdered as stated in his memoirs.

Other than Thomas Carson's Mill, the only business in those early years, known to this writer, was a large dry goods, general merchandise and later drug store owned by **Rev. Nathaniel Porter**, his brother Frank "Uncle Frank," and brother-in-law, **Owen Helm**. The store was operated out of a log structure built by the Rev. Porter in 1844 on his 1,200 acre farm located in the middle reaches of Little Muddy Creek in what would later become known as Sugar Grove.

The first Post Office to serve the Little Muddy Creek Valley area was Locust Grove, later Sugar Grove, established in 1832 by **John P. Carson**, who operated the facility until 1851. **Rev.**

Nathaniel Porter then became postmaster moving it into his dry goods store and renaming the post office Sugar Grove for the large number of sugar maple trees and maple syrup and sugar made in the area. The Sugar Grove Post Office continued in the area until 1967, operated then by **Ada Belcher Montague**.

A Post Office was established in the Little Muddy community by **Calvin E. Stahl** on July 1, 1893. **Columbus M. Cole** took over the postmaster position on May 17, 1895, adding it to his merchandising operation. Cole continued operating the Post Office until December 12, 1917, when **Ina Hays** became postmistress. Hays operated the facility until February 15, 1919, when the mail service was transferred to the Sugar Grove post office.

In the late 1940s following the end of World War II, Gary Brothers Crushed Stone Company, owned and operated by **Hayward** and **Elwood Gary** began operations in the Little Muddy community, providing employment to residents of the area. The limestone rock quarry continued operation in Little Muddy into the 1970s. At least four other rock quarries operated during the "Great Depression" or before and after: Butler County Stone located on Sugar Grove/Dimple Road; Coffman Quarry to the right off Sugar Grove Road one-half mile before Sugar Grove and Keith Lawrence Quarry located on U. S. 231 South on the left one-half mile before the Warren County Line; and the only one in operation today, Yukon Valley Minerals, located at the corner of U. S. 231 and Guy Road.

Cyril Thompson owned and operated a fairly large sawmill business in the 1940s and early 1950s, located on 1083 (Sugar Grove Road) on the left about one-half mile before Sugar Grove. Young Pallet Co., located on Old Clarks Landing Road, operated in the late 1970s until 2010s.

Seven small groceries have served the Little Muddy Creek Valley, operating under the names of: Barkley, Deweese, Dunn, Givens, Montague, Owen, Porter, and more. **Avis Givens** Grocery was rebuilt in 1958 from an old frame structure to a larger concrete block building and operated under the name Givens Clover Farm Market, the only franchised chain store to serve the community. According to the late **Edwin Henderson**, in the same location as Givens Grocery and Dunn Grocery there had been a tavern at each until April 1942 when Butler County voted "local option" to go "dry" in alcohol sales.

The United States Department of Agriculture in cooperation with state and local Cooperative Extension agents enacted a Rural Development Program in 1956 with more than 55 counties involved throughout the nation. Butler County was one of only three pilot counties selected in Kentucky. Following the organization of a county wide Rural Development Committee a total of seven community rural development clubs were started with a goal of providing a long range, leadership oriented program. Butler County is the only county in the United States that still has a Rural Development program that produces leadership and accomplishes goals as set up under the original guidelines. Of the seven original clubs in the county only four remain active today: Big Bend

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(Logansport), Little Muddy, Provo, and Reedyville. This writer, being one of the first youth members of this club, salutes the Little Muddy Rural Development for 58 years of continuing leadership, educational programs and community improvement.

Little Muddy Cumberland Presbyterian Church, its schools, and Rural Development Center have been the center of activities in the community from 1805 until today.
