To guide you in preparing your letter of nomination, the judging will be based on the following ten point system.

1. EDUCATION - Schools and colleges attended, degrees and technical training (Two Points)
2. BUSINESS EXPERIENCE and ACCOMPLISHMENT Major places of employment and position held (Six Points)
3. GENERAL INFORMATION - Outside activities in community, educational, and character building areas. (Two Points)

The letters of nomination will be judged by an unbiased panel of three judges. The decision made by the judges will be final.
