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## NOTES ON CONTRIBUTORS

- AIMEE BERGER is a graduate of the University of Dallas, the University of South Carolina, and the University of North Texas (Ph.D., 2001) and is currently Assistant Professor of English and Assistant Director of the Center for Faulkner Studies at Southwest Missouri State University.
