RECIPE

HEAVENLY HONEY-WALNUT PUMPKIN PIE

Unbaked 9" Pie Shell, with high fluted edge,
4 eggs, separated
1 cup light-brown sugar, packed
1/2 teasp. cinnamon
1/2 teasp. nutmeg
1/2 teasp. allspice
2 cups canned pumpkin

l cup heavy cream
1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted
1 tblsp. cornstarch
1/3 cup honey
1/3 cup chopped walnuts
1/4 teasp. vanilla extract

Afternoon before, or early in the day:

- 1. Start heating oven to 450°F. In large bowl, with electric mixer at high speed, beat egg yolks till thick and lemon colored. At low speed, beat in sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, allspice, then pumpkin, 1/2 cup heavy cream, and melted butter.
- 2. Beat egg whites till frothy; gradually add cornstarch, beating until stiff but not dry; fold into pumpkin mixture. Turn into pie shell. Bake 15 min. then reduce oven heat to 350°F. and bake 30 to 40 min., or until knife, inserted in center, comes out clean. Cool; refrigerate.
- 3. At serving time, mix honey and nuts; spread on pie. Whip 2/3 cup heavy cream with vanilla; pass. Makes 1 9" pie.


