Georgia was graduated from Richardsville High School and attended Western Kentucky University.

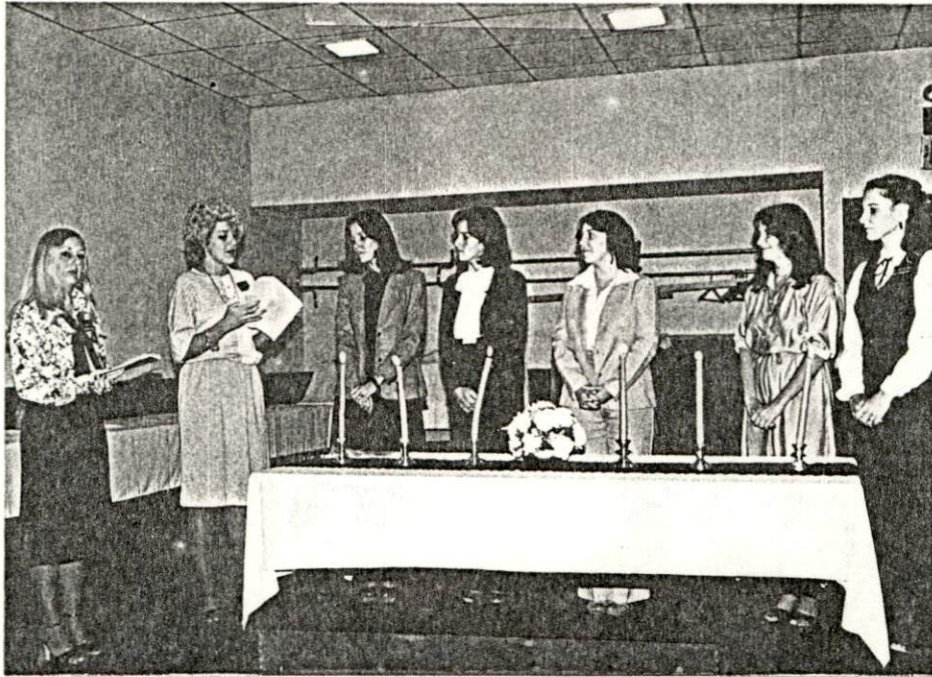
She has been a member of ABWA since April of 1979. She is currently serving as Chairwoman of the Bulletin Committee.

*** RECIPE OF THE MONTH ***

Persian Chicken

2 cups	Cooked diced chicken
1 can	Cream of Chicken soup
1 ½ cups	Celery diced
2	Medium onions diced
½ cup	Salad dressing or mayonnaise
¾ cup	Pepperidge Farm Bread Crumbs

Cook celery onions, and 1 tablespoon butter until tender. In mixing bowl combine chicken, cream of chicken soup, celery, onions, butter and salad dressing. Salt and pepper to taste.

Place mixture in casserole dish and top with crumbs. Bake 20 to 30 minutes at 350°. Yields about 4 servings.
