SOUTH CENTRAL KENTUCKY HISTORICAL AND GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES FOR 1979 IN REVIEW Compiled by Ralph R. Garmon

Jan. 25 meeting postponed on account of weather conditions.

- Feb. 1 First meeting for the year held at Mary Wood Weldon Memorial Library. Program was presented by Vivian Rousseau Barren County historian, Kenneth H. Lee historian of the Mammoth Cave area and James Hyatt librarian at Mary Wood Weldon Memorial Library. This program was presented in a panel discussion centering around the topic <u>Genealogy</u> with Lary Davis interrogating the panel. This was an interesting program and was greatly enjoyed by the audience.
- Feb. 22 At this meeting the Society voted to make some minor changes in the Society's constitution and by-laws. These changes had been announced and had first reading at the last meeting.

Shelley Riherd, a local Glasgow attorney was featured speaker for this meeting. His talk was about interesting facts and some amusing episodes concerning people who lived or travelle. through this area in the past. We learned that the inventor of the safety pin was from our area and that John Dillinger was thought to have travelled through Cave City, Ky. before his death in 1934.

- Mar. 22 Featured speaker for this meeting was Riley Handy from Wester Kentucky University who gave some interesting history and what the researcher could expect to find in the Kentucky Building and Museum located on the campus in Bowling Green, Ky. He also announced that the rennovations were almost complete on the building and that the formal opening is expected on July 4, 1980.
- Apr. 21 Family History Workshop held in Glasgow, Ky. at Holiday Inn. The theme, being <u>Pioneer Paths to South Central Kentucky</u>, was featured by presentations of <u>Migration Routes</u> by Edna Milikin of the Ky. Department of Libraries and Archives and Marilyn Bell of the Tennessee State Library and Archives. Keynote address, <u>A Search for Heritage</u>, was given by J. L. Jackson, a Kentucky Historian and Art Collector from Bowling Green, Ky

The afternoon session was devoted to area genealogical sources; including as speakers, James Simmons of Glasgow, Randolph N. Smith of Burkesville and J. Y. DeSpain of Greensburg, Ky. A question and answer session was held at the close of the meeting.

- April 27-29 The Society sponsored the Historymobile from the Ky. Historical Society of Frankfort, and manned a booth at the Farm Expo. held at Ky. Sales Tobacco Warehouse on North 31-E.
- May 27 Death of Marion Vance one of the first ten directors and original incorporators of The South Central Kentucky Historical and Genealogical Society.
- May 31 Pres. Cecil E. Goode, named James Simmons as chairman of

nominating committee along with Mary Davis and Gladys B. Wilson to select names for new officers to be presented for election by the Society at next meeting.

Dr. Randall Capps, a well known author and historian from Western Kentucky University; Woodford L. Gardner, a local attorney; and Cecil E. Good presented the program for this meeting which was in the form of panel discussion that also included a question and answer session concerning the publication of the book, Pictorial History of Glasgow and Barren County. Dr. Capps placed some books on display that he had compiled and published on pictorial history of Bowling Green and Warren County. This was an interesting meeting.

June 28 The committee named at last meeting reported and suggested that the present officers be retained for another year and recommended that Shelley T. Riherd and Woodford L. Gardner be elected to fill the office of 2nd and 3rd Vice-Presidents. These offices had not been filled prior to this time. These suggestions and recommendations were placed in form of a motion and the Society voted in favor of these recommendations.

Announcement was made that the annual picnic would be held next month in place of the regular meeting. Birdie Lutzow was appointed to secure a site and make arrangements for the picnic.

Our speaker for the evening was Linda Anderson from the Department of Genealogy of the Kentucky Historical Society in Frankfort, Kentucky. The talk was on genealogy and was well received by the audience. A question and answer session was held at the close of the meeting.

- July 27 Several members and guests of the Society met at 6 P.M. at Weldon Park on Cleveland Avenue in Glasgow and enjoyed a delicious picnic.
- Aug. 23 At this meeting a suggestion was made that the Society make a tour to some of the historical sites in Kentucky. Almost every one agreed that they were interested to doing so. A committee consisting of Lee Smith, Charles Wininger and Ralph R. Garmon was named to make proper plans for the tour.

The program for this meeting was devoted to the subject, "Main Street Preservation or Revitalization." The speaker, Robert R. Fitch of Bowling Green, Ky., President of the Comnonwealth Preservation Council, presented slides depicting old buildings and streets and told how repair and preservation could be made with help from the Preservation Council if they are of historical nature.

Sept. 27 Charles Wininger, who was named to committee at last meeting to make plans for a tour to some of the historical sites in Kentucky stated that White Hall Shrine, the home of Cassius Clay at Richmond, and the ancestral home of Mary Todd Lincoln had been chosen as places to visit. The date set for the tour being October 6th.

Charles presented the program for the evening with a recording

on the life of Cassius Clay which was quite interesting and proved to be helpful in understanding life at White Hall Shrine.

Oct. 6 Members of the Society who took the tour to White Hall Shrine at Richmond, Kentucky and to the ancestral home of Mary Todd Lincoln at Lexington were: Jerry Hood, James Simmons, Katie M. Smith, Lee Smith, Birdie Lutzow, Charles Wininger, and Ralph R. Garmon. Space will not permit me to list all the historical knowledge that one can gain from visiting these places.

- Oct. 25 Our Past President, James M. Simmons, presented the program for this meeting. His topic for discussion centered around Veterans Day and the honor that Glasgow and Barren County would be giving to the 123rd Ca., the local National Guard Unit that went into training in 1941. A placque bearing the name of each person who served or left with this unit on the evening in January 1941, for training in Texas, would be unveiled on the north side of the courthouse on Veterans Day. As usual a question and answer session was held which proved to be quite interesting also.
- Nov. 15 President Cecil E. Goode, in giving a progress report stated that the "Pictorial History," that the Society plans to publish is nearing one-third of completion. Mr. Paul Holman, a local business man was speaker for this meeting. Mr. Holman gave some interesting history concerning the kind and places of business houses located around the square in Glasgow, Ky. He also displayed and read articles from old newspapers. All this caused many questions to arise. All in all, this was a very interesting meeting.

THE BARRY FAMILY

AN ACCOUNT WRITTEN FROM RECOLLECTIONS TRADITIONARY AND OTHERWISE, BY ONE OF THE FAMILY, 1866-1867

"At the request of Mrs. Mary Clark (my niece) I commence some account of the family from which we are descended.

It is a natural wish to know something of our forefathers, and it will be found in this recital, that all knowledge of our family further than the families of my grand-parents is unknown to me, and I am the only one now left, who can tell even the little I shall attempt to write.

I learned what you find here from the lips of my mother, from the diaries and memorandums kept by my father in his youth and first scenes of life when acting for himself, and from my own memory (which is still unimpaired) of localities, dates and events.

My grand-father, John Barry, and my grand-mother, Eleanor Dimond, had both been married had had (he) three children: one daughter, Eleanor, and two sons, David and Michael. She had one daughter, also called Eleanor; after they married they had three sons: Daniel (my father), Henry and John; and two daughters, Mary and Betty. I cannot boast of the wealth or high position of my family: I was always led to think them an honest, respectable and industrious people and from many circumstances, they must have had an anxiety for education.

My mother's family was called "Toland." Her father, Henry Toland; her mother Elizabeth McAlpin lived in the County of Antrim, near the South-western extremity of Lough Nesgh, ten miles distant from Belfast, a seaport city in the North of Ireland. They raised eleven children, the sons, John, William, Hugh, Roger, Arthur and Henry. The daughters, Elizabeth, Rosanna, (my mother) Catharine, Nancy, Alice and Jennie. All the children remained in their native land except Arthur and my mother. Her brother had come over two or three years before she did, to the (then) far-famed Land of Liberty, "America," and his migration had much effect in reconciling her to leaving all the rest behind.

The Barry family were Catholics, and selected my father, who early showing a capacity to learn and a love of books, as the scholar and future Priest of the family. He was sent to school in Newry, a town of some note in the County of Down (which I forgot to mention as the place of their residence) he was placed in advanced schools as his progress required, until, when he was about eighteen years of age, he was thought to be prepared to enter the Jesuit College, that he might be qualified to carry out the anxious desires and hopes of his parents. He had always been fond of reading and books of a controversial character, had fallen into his hands. Among them were some that animadverted severly on many of the principal doctrines of Popery, and they had succeeded in undermining his faith in "The Virtues of the Confessional," Transubstantiation and many others, which rendered his entering on the course which had been laid out for him, from his childhood, an impossibility in his conscientios mind. He candidly told his father his feelings and views, "that he could not go forward to teach what it was impossible for him to believe." Horror stricken at the avowal, that his son, his favorite son, the hope

of his age, should become a heretic, the old man at once told him, that if he disappointed his hopes in that way, for his present and future welfare, he must hereafter depend on his own exertions for his support, as he neither could nor would do anything more for him.

hy father firse went to live with a relative, a druggist, with a view of studying medicine, his relative being also a practicing physician. He soon became disgusted (as I have heard him say) with the deception practiced on the ignorant poor who applied for advice, etc., and left that place, preferring the situation of a private tutor in the family of a gentleman by the name of Orr. He now had made a most fortunate selection; the family being intellectual, furnished with an excellent library, his labors not heavy, he had much leisure for improving himself, and by the acquaintances formed here, he gained friends of such standing in society as to be of much benefit to him in after years.

Depending as I do, in writing this from memory, many irregularities as to the arrangement will necessarily occur which I hope will meet with due allowance. I should have given the date of my father's birth first. He was born 1 August, 1769, near Bannbridge, County of Down, in the North of Ireland. About 1791 he obtained a situation as tutor, but of a high grade, in the house of a gentleman called John Heyland, his residence known as Glen Oak, in the County of Antrim, near the home of my grandfather Toland, where he found his future wife, Rosanna Toland. He had the instruction of daughters, sons and other relatives here, and secured the esteem and warm friendship of the entire family connection. I have seen many evidences of grateful feeling evinced by presents marked with the names and written by the hands of the donors expressive of kind and grateful acknowledgements.

His library was almost made up with presents of this kind, and even after living there till 1797. When he left for America, he found boxes at the seaport, Belfast, forwarded without his knowledge by his friends left behind. The date mentioned above (1797) will show that his dear native land was involved in trouble for some time past. The spirit of the "United Irishmen" was aroused; parties formed, and a time arrived when it was unsafe for men to that Party to remain in their native land. My father's brother, Henry Barry had been a warm partisan in the County of Down, had become a mark at which vengence was pointed by government spies, and he had gotten off by the aid of friends; came to Antrim, was concealed there some weeks, and my father determined to carry out immediately, his intention of going to America. It had been his desire for several years to make his home there ultimately, but he had been delayed while his business was lucrative and his Country peaceful. That time was now over.

I now go back and bring up my narrative. From my father's diary in 1791, I recollect to have read many remarks relative to his acquaintance with my mother; his observations on her conduct, mind and principles -- one thing which might not be noticed by any other man almost, may serve to give some idea of the nicety of his feelings as regarded females. It seems he had seen and conversed with Rosanna Toland that day. The subject of ages arose, and she mentioned her age as one year younger than he had heard it was. He commented on it in a tone of disappointment, he felt his opinion of her strict regard for truth, chilled, but he could not, he would not, think she would descend so low a deviation from truth, she had not intended to deceive. No! She was superior to any thing of that kind. And he was not wrong. No human being ever more strictly adhered to truth or more strongly inculcated its principles in her children.

My parents were married early in November, 1793. My mother still remained at the home of her father, as it was near "Glen Oak" that it was not necessary to remove and fit up a home. 1st August, 1794, my brother, Valentine Derry Barry was born. He was named for a favorite school-mate of my father, who many years after came to America and settled on Long Island, (N.Y.) and established a seminary of some note, of which he was principal. I (Mary Jane Barry) was next born, 17 July, 1796.

The increasing troubles of the country, and the prospect of an increasing family, now pointed out to my father the necessity of putting in practice his long-cherished project of removal to America. Accordingly, on the 3rd of June, 1797, it was commenced. A heart rending farewell between my mother and all her family!! How often in early years have I sat at my mother's knee and shed tears with her, over the recital of the trials of that hour. How her father, distressed almost beyond endurance, was unable to leave his bed, drawing her to his breast, kissed her, and exclaimed: "Oh Rosa, my child, how much rather would I lay you in your grave." The death of his son, Arthur, who had emigrated few years before and of whom the news of his death had recently reached his family, served to render the old man less hopeful for any more of his children when gone to the same country. My uncle died suddenly in some town in Pennsylvania, as my mother learned when she arrived in Philadelphia.

We left our native land, accompanied by my uncle Henry Barry, Miss Ann Galt, and two of her nieces, coming over under the care of my father to her brother-in-law, a Mr. Simmes, in Fincastle, Bottetourt County, Virginia. Miss Galt was a relative of the Heyland family, where my father had taught for several years. I can well remember reading her letters to my father and my mother and one to myself in answer to one written by me, when not more than six years of age.

Our voyage across the Atlantic, unlike those of the present day, was tedious. We were ten weeks on sea, two weeks becalmed. My mother worn down by distress and the effects of the sea, took a severe fever and was not expected to live during the greater part of the voyage. She was, however, spared, to pass through an eventful life. When we arrived in Philadelphia, early in August, she was barely able to walk supported by my father's arm to a boarding house. Here she commenced her new era of life, meeting with wonders innumerable and of every kind. She often amused her little ones telling over her adventures, if they might be called such.

A negro baby, nearly in a state of nudity, carried on the arm of it's mother, formed one of her sights. The woman was seeking employment -- the curly head, black face and white eyes, characteristic of the race, were as great wonders to her as any of the African or Asiatic wild animals are to our American children.

As genealogical fishing trips into the hinterlands are reduced because of petroleum priorities, the family historian must be alert to every alternative.

Periodicals that previously were given scant attention should be reconsidered.

As most researchers are interested in a particular area, and as Kentucky was a stopping spot for countless families moving north and west, an overview of these journals seems timely.

In 1959 Kentucky had no magazines specializing in genealogy. Two historical journals had nearly excluded material of interest to family historians. Realizing the great need for a publication helpful to those working on Kentucky ancestry, Martha Porter Miller began the Kentucky Genealogist. Hundreds of pages providing abstracts and trans cripts of Kentucky wills, deeds, court orders, marriages, censuses, tax lists and other data were published by Miss Miller. Other journals have appeared, but her pioneering efforts remain the model.

In 1979 the management and editorial direction of the Kentucky Genealogist were taken over by James Bentley. Bentley is secretary of the Filson Club at Louisville. His first volume perhaps exceeds the standards set by his predecessor. Subscription is \$8 per year. Address is: 118 W. Breckenridge, Louisville, Ky. 40203.

Kentucky Ancestors was first issued in 1965 by the Kentucky Historical Society as part of its annual membership.
