AMERICAN BUSINESS WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION CURRENT STATISTICS

The major aims and purposes of this organization are the improvement of employer-employee relations, keeping business women up to date on business techniques, and advancing women in business through more efficient service to business.

The American Business Women's Association believes that advancement and promotion must be earned, and it stresses this fact in urging its members to better themselves through education, either formal or informal, so that they will be qualified for possible future advancement.

From October, 1969 through September, 1970, over \$280,000 in scholarships was awarded by the combined chapters of the Association. In addition to this, a National Scholarship fund was founded in 1953; and the Association's National Officers, acting as trustees for the fund, approved scholarships for 1969–1970 exceeding \$75,000. The Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund is comprised of donations by Chapters of the Association and their friends, relatives, and business associates. It is a non-profit fund, and donations are tax deductible, within allowable limits.

There were over 3,100 members in attendance at the 1970 National Convention held in Dallas, Texas. The next National Convention will be held in Anaheim, California, October 22, 23, 24, 1971.
