THE RICE'S of CLAIBORNE COUNTY TN

This article came to me from Peggy Gawelko, 7718 W. 85th St. Playa del Rey, CA 90293. It was done by Mary England, Editor of Journal of Claiborne CO TN. Historical Society-Winter, 1987. Others are given credit as the article goes on.

In doing research on the RICE family of Claiborne County, I discovered that we were dealing with at least two distinct and separate lines. Hopefully as the story unfolds with what we now know, someone maybe can add or correct what may be said now that will give a more complete picture. If so we will run a RICE UPDATE in a later edition of our quarterly.

The first line that will be presented is that of the STEPHEN RICE family. This part of the information was compiled by me, the editor.

STEPHEN RICE FAMILY

Stephen Rice was born in VA ca 1795-96. In the Bell County 1880 census he states that his father was born in MD and his mother was born in PA. He came to Harlan CO KY, early and married Rebecca Woolum Sep 1, 1820, at the home of James Woolum and Rosannah Henderson. According to MABEL GREEN CONDON'S book "A HISTORY OF HARLAN COUNTY, page 201, a Mary R. Culton testified at the wedding, that they had known them since childhood. He received a land grant in 1850, applied for pension in 1871 and was drawing a pension at the time of his death, 15 Feb 1887. By the 1850 Harlan CO Census, the following children were listed. He probably had more children prior to this census that were already grown and married but at present unknown:

Stephen listed his age as 55 in this census and Rebecca's age as 45. In the 1860 Harlan CO Census he give his age as 64 and Rebecca's age as 54. She is listed as being born in VA also. By the 1860 census the following children are listed, all born in KY or VA. There is a difference in this census as to birth place.

The 1870 Census was not checked for more children but at Rebecca's age (she was 54 in 1860), it is unlikely. In the 1880 Bell CO KY census STEPHEN is listed as 84 and Rebecca as 75. She states in this census that both she and her parents were born in TN, in 1860 census that they were born in VA, presenting a conflict.

STEPHEN RICE served in the War of 1812. Their place of burial in Bell or Harlan CO KY is presently unknown. In the Bell CO marriage records I located a marriage record for one of their children. Benjamin F., who married Polly Napier, 31 Aug 1872. Nothing more is known of his children except for PRESTON ASHER RICE who came to Claiborne County TN before the 1870 Census. The following information was compiled by Helen Snodgrass, a member of the society.

PRESTON ASHER RICE was born 08 Nov 1842 in Harlan CO KY on Straight Creek and died in Claiborne CO 10 Mar 1927. He is buried in the Brooks Cemetery, Claiborne CO, beside his wife. His death certificate states his father was Stephen Rice of KY, informant was Waymon Lambert of Claiborne CO. Asher Rice, as he was called, married in Union CO TN 04 Jan 1866, Martha E. Hayes, daughter of William Hayes and Laura A. Brooks. Martha was born in TN 25 Mar 1851, and died 23 Aug 1905. After her death Asher married Lucy Cox 19 Oct 1910; later he married a third time to Maggie Bryant. They had 13 children who were all born in Claiborne CO TN. listed below:

ELLEN RICE and JOSEPH WAYMON LAMBERT, 3rd child above of Asher Rice had 8 children then died. Joseph then m. Sallie Morrison and had 2 more children. Joseph was the son of Joseph Lambert, Jr. and Nancy Ellison. He was b. 13 Jan 1873 and d. 22 Oct 1947.

ARTHUR RICE, 11th child of Asher Rice, . This information was compiled by Luther Rice of Morristown, TN. He had 8 children by 2nd. wife Pearlle Ellison, all born in Claiborne CO TN. Listed below:

Asher Rice was a private in the Union Army during the Civil War. He enlisted 16 Oct 1864 and was discharged 11 Sep 1865 at Knoxville, TN. He died from Cancer.

The parents of Martha E. Hayes, Asher's wife were William Hayes, b. ca 1829 and Laura A. Brooks b. ca 1830. In the 1860 Census of Claiborne CO the following children were listed:

Another line in Claiborne County TN, but of the Stephen Rice Family was BENJAMIN AJAX RICE. According to Mabel Green Condon's Book, "A HISTORY OF HARLAN CO," pg 200, Stephen Rice was an uncle of Ben A. Rice from Taxewell TN. In her book pgs 125-126, it reads; "The Ben A. Rice Grist Mill was erected in the town of Harlan after the Civil War. A Milldam was built across the Clover Fork River, just east of the present bridge, with all the necessary millwrights for two miles on both sides of the river. The lumber sawed at this mill was used to build the third courthouse which was of frame construction and a two-story frame jailhouse. This mill furnished lumber for many of the frame houses which were built in Harlan up until about 1895. The grist mill was carried on by his son Henry Clay Rice who sold it to

Judge W. C.L. Huff about 1910."

BENJAMIN RICE resided in Claiborne CO TN prior to the Civil War, then moved to Bell CO KY, to the town of Pineville. He apparently spent time back and forth to Harlan while operating his mill. He was born in VA 05 Jun 1819 and died 14 Jun 1898. He is buried in the Irish Cemetery in Taxewell with a large monument marking his grave site.

In the 1860 Bell CO KY Census he is listed as 40 yrs old, his wife Tabitha, 20. His first 2 children were born in Claiborne CO TN, they were as follows:

In the 1880 Bell CO Census Benjamin Rice is now 60 yrs. old. He states his parents were both born in VA. His wife Tabitha is 55 born in KY ...her parents both born KY. Their children now are as follows:

It is quite possible that he was married twice as Mabel Condon in her book, states that his wife was a Zelphia, last name unknown, however, Tabitha is whom he is married to in the 1860-1880 Bell Co Census. Not much is known about his children except for the following:

HENRY CLAY RICE m. Sarah Amanda Eager. He was a surveyor for the town of Harlan, He later operated a livery stable at Hagan, VA for train riders who stopped over.

JOHN ROBERT RICE's 1st wife was a sister of Henry Clay Rice's wife. Her name was Serepta Eager. Serepta and Sarah Amanda Eager were daughters of George Washington Eager and Sally Clark Eager. Sally Clark was born 1810 in Wythe CO VA., d. Harlan CO KY 1905. She was the daughter of John Clark who fought in the War of 1812. After Serepta died, John Robert Rice married Elizabeth Smith. She died giving birth to her first child: He then married his third wife Elizabeth Neal. John Robert Rice served in the Union Army.

ELLEN RICE married Lewis Farmer, Jr. on 01 Nov 1870.

HENRY CLAY RICE had a son, Jeff Rice, who married Minta Wilson, daughter of Lucy Ward and Elhanan Wilson. Jeff Rice joined the Army in 1898 and fought in the Spanish American War. His picture is in Mabel Condon's book on pg 215 along with his cousin, Jim Kelly who enlisted with him. In the book also is a picture of Benjamin Ajax's mill on page 126. It was a combination grist and saw mill. Also on pg 80 of the book is a picture of Sally Clark Eager.

- Prior to coming to this area, Stephen Rice, his nephew, Benjamin Ajax Rice, Heseekiah, Esekiah, and Othniel Rice, along with James Rice obtained land grants in South Carolina. The parents of Stephen Rice are unknown at present. More research needs to be done on this line. The above information on Benjamin Ajax Rice was compiled by me. (Mary England, the editor.)

\*\*\*\*\*

The second apparently unrelated Rice line was that of HENRY RICE family who were in upper East TN early. The first part of this information is compiled by me, with most of the information coming from Melvin Weaver Little's book, "HENRY RICE, THE PIONEER GRISTMILLER." Henry had 12 known children, six sons and six daughters. Below a brief summary of each child will be given with emphasis on those who lived in Claiborne CO TN.

In Marvin Little's book he has this to say about HENRY RICE.

"HENRY RICE was born in 1717/ in Hanover CO VA., lived in VA, SC and East TN: he died in 1818 at Lost Creek, TN. (Campbell CO, now Union). Name(s) of wife or wives unknown. He at at least six sons and six daughters, some born in VA and some in SC. Near the middle of the century the family moved to the "96 District" of SC and settled on land known as Indian Territory. After several years at RICES Creek of Twelve Mile River in SC, Henry traveled with some of his older children to Watauga Settlement, East TN, where he built and fortified a large grist Mill. He spent the rest of his 101 years here and at Lost Creek." Henry has been given credit for building the first gristmill in the state of TN, which is near Kingsport and still standing. Lost Creek is close to where Norris Dam is located. Henry when he lived at Lost Creek built another grist Mill. When Norris Dam was constructed, the mill was torn down and rebuilt on another site about a mile below the dam. Marvin Little states that Henry Rice may have been the son of JAMES RICE, son of the THOMAS RICE who in 1695 returned to England for an inheritance but was presumed lost at sea. If so related, Henry was a cousin to the Rev. David Rice of KY.

Information that I have compiled by Harold Rice of Pathfork, KY, states that JAMES RICE was born 1669-1730. He married Sarah Stone, Baptised 04 Apr 1680, Han-

over, VA. THOMAS RICE, the father of James Rice, came with his father to America and married Mary King (1622-1695). He had 9 sons and 3 daughters. The father of THOMAS RICE was EDMUND RICE of England. He married Tamazine Frosthosme, had six sons and 1 daughter. They came to America. He was a Deacon 1630-1648. He died in Sudbury, MA, 03 May 1663. EDMUND RICE was a twin of ROGER RICE who was a son of one of the nobles, Sir Lord WILLIAM RICE II (1594).

Other Rice sources are in disagreement as to the parentage of HENRY RICE. Some say that his father was HENRY RICE and mother Susan. Another says that Henry Rice married Margaret, last name unknown. In 1737, Orange CO VA. There is enough disagreement on these issues that some form of proof must be documented before we can say for sure who the father of old Henry Rice was and who he married.

Henry's grave site is marked with a prominent tombstone at Lost Creek Cemetery. It was place there by Nan Rice Shute: she is a descendant of Henry Rice through his grandson MARTIN RICE.

Henry Rice's children were:

1. WILLIAM RICE died a few months before Dec 1831. He left a will in Wilson CO, dated 12 Mar 1818, and recorded Dec 1831. This will mentions wife Easter Rice, then his first wife's (unnamed) children.

Another source states that this William was born 06 Apr 1743 in Wilson CO TN, and died 29 Nov 1831. Place of birth probably was not TN.

2. CHARLES RICE, had the power of attorney to sell his father's land. Proof is in the Anderson CO SC deed Book E. p 246. It states "on the 29 May 1800 Henry Rice of Granger CO TN do appoint my son Charles Rice of Pendleton District to sett a tract of 460 odd acres granted to me and is on waters of Rice and Wolf Creek."

Another land transaction in the Grainger CO Deed Book A. pg. 307, Henry Rice sold to his son 200 acres in 1803. This land was, I believe, next to Henry's Lost Creek land. No more is known at present of this son

3. JAMES RICE was born 1763 in SC, married Rebecca Miller in 1787. In about 1795 He moved to Lost Creek TN, and built a grist mill and practiced gunsmithing. He died there in 1829/ The James Rice Mill was operated by the Rice generations George, Henry, and James Rufus Rice. It was kept in continuous operation on Lost Creek until 1935 until the TVA moved it to its present location. Rebecca Miller is said to have been the daughter of John Miller who died in 1771 at the Battle of the Alamance. She was born in 1767 and died after 1830. Their children were:

4. DANIEL RICE was presumably in SC about 1765-1770. He was dead before 1822. This part of the information was compiled by Mary Parkey, our society Pres., who is a descendant of this line. Daniel lived and died in Claiborne CO TN, not far from the Cumberland Gap. He married Susannah Senter 18 Dec 1797 in Hawkins CO TN.

5. JOHN RICE, the old preacher, was born possibly in SC before 1775: he was in TN by 1797. Very little is known of him. He had one known child, Sally Rice, who m. a famous outlaw, Willie Harpe (whose life was quite short). John Rice later migrated with his daughter, Sally (a "reformed" young lady) to IL and was recognized at Ford's Ferry on the Ohio River as late as 1820. Sally had a unnamed daughter of, maybe, and unknown second husband, when they were seen on the ferry.
6. LEVI RICE, a Baptist preacher, was born presumably in SC around 1770. He lived and died in Hawkins CO TN. He was a third rate Baptist or Dunkard preacher. He married Mary Catherine Mitchell before 1789. She was the daughter of Isaac and Mary Williams Mitchell and granddaughter of Ursula Henderson and Daniel Williams. Isaac Mitchell had removed with wife and children to Newberry District SC and later to Abbeyville Dist where he died. His will signed 23 Jun 1789, named his wife and children: Levi Rice signed for his wife (30, pg 76). Levi Rice may have had a second wife, for he is listed in the Granger CO marriages: Levi Rice to Jane Simmons, 04 Dec 1801. Only 5 of his children are known:

The last two children were given or found from another Rice source other than Marvin Little's book, although Marvin Little stated that he had two daughters. Levi Rice died after 1835.
7. MARTHA (Patsy) RICE 7th child of Henry Rice, was born between 1745-1755, perhaps in VA. She was married to David Bailey in the 1700's in SC. They moved to Hawkins CO TN and appeared in the 1830 census. Many of the Bailey descendants went to MO and settled around Cass and Jackson Counties near James Rice's descendants. Their children were:

Recently I received a Query from James D. Trabue, P.O. Box 1018, Belle-ville IL 62223 concerning Benjamin Duvall and his wife Mary, which I ran in the HERITAGE. He writes now: "In my query, I did not fully explain the problem. In the 1850 and 1860 Censuses, there seems to be only one "Mary Duvall"-- the wife of Benjamin. In 1850, she was 58 and in 1860 she was 68. These dates would each conform with the dates which I quoted in my query. (Unfortunately, at the time I got the data, I thought my descent came through Howard Duvall and his wife Quinney Wells--I had not discovered the Butler CO Marriage--so I wasn't as careful as I should have been writing the source of the note.) In the Logan CO Marriage records There are apparently some notes as to several Marriages which occurred before the county's formation. One was the marriage of Mark Whitaker and Jean (Gean) (Jane) Whitaker on Dec 19 1790. This data all fits together. However, in the same cemetery records published by the Butler CO Gen. Society 1975, there is a record of a stone in the Arnold Cemetery on the Butler/Ohio county line of "Mary Duvall--wife of Benjamin died April 22, 1867 age 77 yrs, 11 months, 25 days. In the same cemetery are the graves of M.W. Duvall and M.E. Duvall -- purportedly the son and daughter in law

of Benjamin and Mary.

As you can see the 1867 date does not fit with the marriage date which raises the problem of whether Mary might have been the daughter of the previous marriage. Mark was in the Revolution, so it is quite possible that he could have had a previous marriage prior to 1790. There is also a possibility that due to the weathering of the marker, the number "7" could have been a "9" or that the Mary buried in Arnold Cemetery was the second wife of a Benjamin living in Ohio CO whose wife was Elizabeth!

Mr. Trabue also sent the following which might be of interest to many of our members.

THE GRIFFITH FAMILY OF CALVERT COUNTY, MARYLAND

I  
 SAMUEL GRIFFITH I

Samuel Griffith I and his wife, Elizabeth, and 2 servants came from Wales and settled in Calvert County, Maryland prior to June 1651. His plantation, "Welch Poole" was near the Patuxent River. Samuel Griffith I died between June 13, 1717, the date of his will and September 3, 1717, the date it was proven in the Calvert County Court. The inventory of his estate included a large variety of cloth, needles, canvas and other items which indicates that he probably operated a mercantile business. His wife and son, Samuel Griffith II, were the executors. An accounting of December 13, 1718 is sworn to by Samuel II and affirmed by Elizabeth, who is referred to as "one of ye people called Quakers". On December 16, 1718, Elizabeth Griffith assigned her share of the estate to Samuel II with the provision that after her decease, he pay several gifts to his histers. In accordance therewith an account was filed by Samuel II on July 28, 1720. The Children were:

 SAMUEL GRIFFITH JUNIOR

I 1 Samuel Griffith Junion was a resident of Calvert County Maryland. He m. Sarah daughter of Lewis Evans of Anne Arundel County on November 26, 1702 in St. James Parish. See Evans below. On the basis of the dates of birth and the references in the will and accounts of Samuel, it is possible that he married a second time. The will bequeaths to Benjamin "all that piece or parcel of land which was formerly his grandfather Clark's skin \* \* \* " (The word "skin" could refer to a measurement of ground or could have been an error in copying the name Skinner. It should be born in mind that skinner appears as a middle name for several of Benjamin Duvall's and Ann Griffith's children, including a Clarke Skinner Duval.) There is also a record of a marriage between a Samuel Duvall and a Susannah Evans in St. Ann Parish, Anne Arundel County, on November 22 1726. For that reason and the date of Anne's birth, and the fact that Bathsheba was still a minor in 1747, I think it may be reasonable to assume that there was a second marriage.

NOTE: Although Newman does not include a Lewis among the children of Maren Duvall and Sarah Griffith, it is quite probable that the "cousin, Lewis Duvall" to whom Benjamin left his clothes is their son. Newman did not identify Sarah as being a Griffith. The references in Benjamin's will make much more sense with this interpretation, especially since Anne was only twenty in 1751 if she did not lie about her age in 1776, which is possible, considering Benjamin's age at the time, and the three children whose age has been ascertained were born from 1764 to 1768. Lewis then was most probably a child in 1751 and could not utilize Benjamin's clothes.

EVANS

That Samuel Griffith II married Sarah Evans is certain from the following information. However, it is still uncertain whether there was a second marriage as: 1. the span of births of the children is over a long period of time; 2. in Samuel's and Benjamin's will there seems to be preferences over one group of children over others (possibly merely due to the fact there may have been marriage settlements on the older children; 3. the use of "Skinner" as a middle name for several of Ann Griffith's and Benjamin Duvall's children; 4. the reference to "grandfather Clark's skin" by Samuel II in his will.

Lewis Evans d testate at his plantation in Anne Arundel County. His last will and testament, dated December 10, 1690, was probated at court on March 11, 1690/91, by Thomas Tench, John Chappell and Edmund Evans. (Source: wills, Liber 2, folio 200, Maryland Hall of Records) He leaves:  
to daughter, Elizabeth and her heirs the dwelling plantation and moiety thereof  
to daughter, Sarah and her heirs the residue of the dwelling plantation  
to daughter, Katherine and her heirs 100 acres of "Jerico"  
to daughter, Anne personalty and the aforesaid plantation in the event of the death of any of the aforesaid children without issue.  
 Children to be of age at 16.  
 Personalty to wife Lois and she is to be executrix.

In 1711 Elizabeth Ankehile and Samuel Griffith in right of his wife, Sarah, petitioned the Lord proprietary to resurvey their inheritance.

"Whereas Elizabeth Ankehile als Evans of Anne Arundel County was one of the daughters of Lewis Evans, of Anne Arundel County, deceased, and Samuel Griffith of Calvert County and Sarah his wife one other of the daughters of the said Lewis by their humble petition to his Lordship\*\*\* that the said Lewis Evans by his last will and testament gave and bequeathed to the said Elizabeth and Sarah a tract of land lying on Herring Creek originally laid out for William Parker of Anne Arundel CO deceased, for two hundred acres of land granted Sept 4 1666 and by several sales of length became the right and property of the said Lewis Evans\*\*\*\*\* Lay out therefore and carefully resurvey for and in the name of Elizabeth Ankehile alias Evans and Samuel Griffith and Sarah, his wife the aforesaid tract of land according to the true Orient Meets and bounds thereof including all surplus therein not running your lines \*\*\*\*" Sources; Warrants, Liber BB, folio 56, Land Office, Annapolis.

NOTE: Further research should be made for ultimate disposal of property of Samuel and Sarah. It may give some hint as to date of Sarah's death and as to whether all of children were hers.
