

- 4. Hold an Attendance Contest over a three-month period*
- 5. Enroll a minimum of twelve (12) new members...or enroll the chapter's quota of new members at the March Enrollment Event*
- 6. Have a member qualify for Inner Circle (Diamond Hand of Friendship quard)
- 7. Have a delegate at the 1977 National Convention Salt Lake City, Utah, and a member in attendance at the chapter's 1978 Regional Meeting
- 8. Have the 1977 chapter Woman of the Year in attendance at the 1977 National Convention Salt Lake City, Utah...or have any Inner Circle member of the chapter in attendance at the chapter's 1978 Regional Meeting
- 9. Have a minimum of five (5) members in attendance at the 1977 National Convention Salt Lake City, Utah...of the chapter's 1978 Regional Meeting*
- 10. Sponsor a single Ways and Means project returning \$300 or more net proft
- 11. Contribute a minimum of \$150 to SBMEF
- 12. Contribute a minimum of \$300 to one local scholarship recipient...or a minimum of \$150 each to two local scholarship recipients

To earn Standard of Achievement, a chapter must complete all twelve (12) requirements during the <u>current Chapter Award Year</u> - <u>September 26, 1977, through July 31, 1978.</u>

- 1. Hold a Boss Night
- 2. Hold a Hand of Friendship Enrollment Event during March 1-31, 1978*
- 3. Contribute a minimum of \$150 to one local scholarship recipient
- 4. Publish and submit to National Headquarters seven (7) or more issues of a chapter bulletin*
- 5. Elect and submit to National Headquarters, by July 1, the name of the chapter's 1978 Woman of the Year
- 6. Contribute a minimum of \$50 to SBMEF, the Association's national scholarship fund
- 7. Observe the chapter's Anniversary in the month the chapter was chartered, recognizing members who have qualified for Perfect Attendance since the preceding chapter Anniversary...or have a member qualify for a Plain, Pearl, or Ruby Hand of Friendship guard*
- 8. Observe Citizenship Month at the February meeting
- 9. Observe ABWA Scholarship Month at the May meeting
- 10. Hold an Orientation Session for new members*
- 11. Have a delegate in attendance at the 1977
 National Convention Salt Lake City, Utah... or
 a member in attendance at the chapter's 1978
 Regional Meeting
- 12. Enroll a minimum of eight (8) new members*
