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

#### BENJAMIN WILSON CLARK

The Benjamin Wilson Clark and his wife Frances Ragsdale Clark came to Barren County from Virginia and settled on a 500 acre military grant as assignee of George Rogers Clark. They settled about one mile from the present sight of Edmonton and at first built a pioneer cabin but later built a brick home on Douglas Branch. They reared a family of eleven children. They were: Benjamin Clark, Elizabeth Clark, Joseph Clark, Frances Clark, Richard Clark, Roderick Clark, Lucy Clark, Martha Clark, Druery Clark, Sophia Clark, William Clark, and Jonathan Clark.

Benjamin Wilson Clark died in 1825. Jonathan Clark, and Edmund Rogers were his administrators. He was a first cousin of George Rogers Clark, and also of William Clark of the Lewis and Clark Expedition which was commissioned by President Thomas Jefferson to explore the West.

#### ZACHARIAH THOMAS AND SOME OF HIS DESCENDANTS

I, Rebecca Amanda Thomas, great, great, great, granddaughter of Zachariah Thomas and Mary Cloantha Thomas, am hereby completing the genealogy of the Thomas family started by my father, Virgil Collier Thomas, in 1909 at Fulton, KY. I, Rebecca, started work on the same in 1945.

Zachariah Thomas, b-1767 in Germany, came to America at the age of 16. He married Mary Cloantha Young who had emigrated from Ireland. To this union were born the following eight children.

#### Second Generation

- 1. James Thomas, b-in Botetourt Co., VA, was killed in the Civil War.
- 2. Johnathan Thomas, b-1800 in Botetourt Co., VA married (1) Ellen Garrison, and d-1881. Their children were: Robert Young Thomas, William Clifton Thomas, Mary Ann Thomas, Alice Jane Thomas, Elizabeth Jane Thomas, David Warren Thomas, John James Thomas, Zachariah Thomas, and Ellen Thomas (born and died in 1845). Johnathan married (2), Rendie Emberton and had 2 children: Magolia Thomas, and Grant Thomas. He is buried in the Thomas Graveyard at Three Forks, in Warren Co., KY.
- 3. David Warren Thomas, b-ca 1804 in Kentucky, who died when about 21.
- 4. Elizabeth Thomas, b-ca 1806 in Kentucky, married John Pedigo.
- 5. Jane Thomas, b-ca 1808 in Kentucky, married Aaron Phillips.
- 6. Malinda Thomas, b-ca 1810 in Kentucky, married Wesley Phillips.
- 7. Lucinda Thomas, b-ca 1812 in Kentucky, married John Finney.
- 8. Ann Thomas, b-18 Jan. 1813 in Kentucky, lived single, and d-13 Mar. 1902.

She is buried in a lone spot near Martinsville church in Warren Co., KY. The single grave has on iron fence around it on a farm owned by Frank Herald (1964). Inscription on her tombstone reads: "Her toil is over, and her work is done. She fought her fight, her victory won".

#### Third Generation

John James Thomas, (from 2 above), was born in 1839 at Martinsville, in Warren Co., KY. He married Rebecca M. (Herndon) Gilmore (b-1840, d-1925) and died in 1922. He was known to his friends as Squire "Red" Thomas. His wife, Rebecca, also had red hair. He was well read in Law and was known to defend those who were too poor to hire a lawyer in the courts at Bowling Green, KY. They reared their family on a farm in East Warren County, KY about two miles from Gott's store. They later built a house on Porter Pike. Their children were: Emmett Thomas, Emma Thomas, Beadie Thomas (died young), Allie Thomas, Delia Thomas, Virgil Collier Thomas, and Whit Thomas,

#### Fourth Generation

Virgil Collier Thomas, (from above) was born on 12 July 1880 and died on 3 June 1939. On 1 Oct. 1913 he married Etta Martha Hunt Phillips in the Burton Memorial Church in Warren County. Her mother had died when Etta was about eight years old, and she was adopted by her aunt and uncle, James and Amanda Phillips. James Phillips was a son of Wesley Phillips, and his wife, Malinda Thomas Phillips who was a daughter of Zachariah Thomas (Generation 1). Virgil C. and Etta (Phillips) Thomas had the following children: Rebecca Amanda Thomas, b-15 Jan. 1915, in New Orleans, LA; Rachel Thomas, b-14 July 1919, d-14 July 1919; Virgil Collier Thomas, JR, b-19 Jan. 1921; and Ruth Etta Thomas, b-17 Dec. 1926.

#### Fifth Generation

Rebecca Amanda Thomas (from above) was born on 15 Jan. 1915 in New Orleans, LA. She married Samuel Ford Thomas on 15 Jan. 1936. They had one daughter, Mary Lee Thomas, whom they adopted.

To those of you whose veins carry Thomas blood, may I say, you can be proud of your heritage for in my search and findings, I find not a people of pomp or power or even aristocracy, but I do find a people of high integrity with a deep love for their fellow man and especially for those less fortunate. For example, the first Zachariah, I find went on a bond to see that an orphan child was protected. His grandson, my grandfather, John James Thomas, went to court and defended those too poor to hire a lawyer. Words cannot describe the qualities of my own father, Virgil Thomas.

#### JAMES GILLOCK 1782-1842

James Gillock was born on 16 Dec. 1782 in Orange Co., VA. He was a son of

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Lawrence and Jane (\_\_\_\_\_) Gillock, SR, who were of Scotch Irish descent. He and two brothers, Lawrence Gillock, JR, and Reuben Gillock came to Barren County in the late 1700's and settled on Skaggs Creek.

James Gillock (from above) married Celia Hunt on 29 March 1804. They had seven children: Catherine Gillock, who married George Ellis; Harriet L. Gillock, who married Anderson Wooten; James Milton Gillock, who married three times, the first to Martha Ann Bush, the second to Harriet Woodson, and the third to Catherine Beckman; Albert G. Gillock, who married twice, the first time to Ann Barbour, and the second to Gilly Ann Owens Williams; Robert Robertson Hunt Gillock, who married first to Louise Jane Settle, and the second time to Sallie B. Terry; Hezekiah Page Mills Gillock, who married Elizabeth M. Dodd; and Elijah Malchijah Gillock, who married Julianna Page. Robert Robertson Hunt Gillock (from above) was the first pastor of the Cedar Grove Baptist Church. Several of James' and Celias' grandsons fought in the Civil War.

The house known as the Strange Home, located on Roseville Road south of Glasgow, was willed to America J. Gillock, wife of Hardin Ralston, and a daughter of Mal-chi-jah Gillock, in 1890, when Col. Robert Strange died. The property has passed through many hands over the years.

One of James Gillock's and Lawrence Gillock, JR's brothers, Samuel Lindsay Gillock, settled in Casey Co., KY. Many of his descendants are still in that area.

Lawrence Gillock, JR and James Gillock are buried in the Old James Gillock Burying Ground on Matthews Mill Road, Skaggs Creek. (First Settlers of Barren County, 1988 Barren county Homecoming, pg. 9)

#### MATTHEW BOWSHELDER/BOUCHER

MATTHEW BOWSHELDERR was born in France about 1700. He settled in Loudon Co., VA and married Mary Jones on 26 Jan. 1734. They had a large family but all were killed by Indians or died early except for one son, Peter Bowshelder (b-1743, d-1809).

Peter Bowshelder (above) when he was about 20 years old married Jane Waddell from Maryland and moved down the Ohio river to Louisville, KY and settled for a time at Boonesboro for protection from the Indians. At this time Peter Bowshelter began buying up land warrants from Revolutionary soldiers and accumulated about 4,000 acres in Warren County most of which later became Allen County. These warrants were signed by Governor Shelby and in the process Peter's name was spelled Boucher. Since he was the only surviving member of his family the new spelling was accepted by him and was thereafter used by his descendants. About 1796 Peter Boucher, SR moved his family to their newly acquired plantation in an area which later became Warren Co., KY and still later became Allen County. He lived in this community until his death in 1809. To this union was born James Boucher, Amos Boucher, Sally Boucher, Peter Boucher, JR, Obed Boucher, Betsy Boucher, and John Boucher.

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Peter Boucher, JR, from above (b-11 Feb. 1770, d-Nov. 1854), married Sally Goodnight on 27 May 1795. Their son, Isaac Boucher was born on 29 Jan. 1800, and died 5 July 1876. His son, Marshall Boucher (b-1837, d-1891) married Dorinda Pruitt in 1858.

Marshall and Dorinda Boucher's son, Enoch Joshua Boucher, was born on 14 Feb. 1862 and died on 29 Dec. 1929. He married Ida Shields (b-7 Jan. 1868, d-5 May 1932) on 20 June 1895. Their son, Marshall Euclid "Jack" Boucher, (b-10 Aug. 1897, d-10 Mar. 1964) married Mary Beals Vickous (b-8 Aug. 1895, d-25 Apr. 1950) on 22 Aug. 1918. To this union was born four children: Nemola G. Boucher (b-24 May 1919, d-19 Nov. 1922), who died of diptheria at the age of three; Marles Ervin Boucher (b-5 April 1921); Frederick Dixon Boucher (b-23 Oct. 1925); and Marshall Adron Boucher (b-7 May 1929).

Marles Ervin Boucher, from above, married William D. McGinnis (b-20 Nov. 1890). Their daughter Mary Nemola McGinnis (b-3 Apr. 1953) married James Wallace Stark II on 21 Nov. 1973. Fraternal twin daughters were born to them on 17 Apr. 1981 - Marlessa Kay Stark, and Calandra Lou Stark.

Frederick Dixon Boucher, from above, married Claudia O'Dell Young (b-17 Sept. 1933, d-Mar. 1982). Their daughter Freda Boucher has two sons - Harold Dixon Cook (b-26 Sept. 1977), and David Edward Cook (b-4 Nov. 1981).

Marshall Adron Boucher, from above, married Georgia Elizabeth Duffy on 13 May 1961. They have three daughters: Suzanne Marie Boucher, Stephanie Lynn Boucher, and Michelle Lee Boucher.

#### THE HARLOW FAMILY

Five Harlow brothers came from Albemarle Co., VA to an area of Warren County, KY which became Barren when that county was formed. They were Claborn Harlow, Elijah Harlow, Michael Harlow, Samuel Harlow, and Thomas Harlow. They were all listed in the first census in 1789 in Mercer County but did not appear in the 1790 tax list of Mercer County. Michael Harlow and Claborn Harlow were however listed in the 1800 census in Barren Co., KY. Michael was a Revolutionary War veteran. They lived on Beaver and Sinking Creeks. Claborn Harlow deeded four acres, part of his farm, in 1804 to build the Mt. Tabor Church. Many Harlow descendants live today in Barren and surrounding counties. (First Settlers of Barren County, 1988 Barren county Homecoming, pg. 17)

#### GENERAL ELIJAH MOORMAN COVINGTON 1773-1848

General Elijah Moorman Covington, (1773-1848) descended from a family of Covingtons who were residents of Colonial Maryland. William Covington, born 1730, extrated to North Carolina. His oldest son, Benjamin Covington, born in Richmond County, married Frances Moorman, and became the parents of Elijah Covington and a number of other children.

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In 1795, Elijah Moorman Covington took up large tracts of land near Bowling Green in Warren County, Kentucky, which consisted of over 20,000 acres. He settled near John Cox, the first tax commissioner of Warren County, on Gasper River. He later returned to North Carolina and moved his parents, Benjamin and Francis Moorman Covington, his three brothers, and four sisters to the area.

Elijah Covington was appointed the first Sheriff of Warren County by Governor James Garrard in 1797. Also, in July 1797 he was made a Lieutenant of the 25th Regiment of Militia and on 17 Jan. 1811 was promoted to Brigadier-General over the Allen, Barren, and Warren County militiamen (20th Brigade). Rowland Madison was appointed the first county surveyor in 1797 and served for two years. Elijah M. Covington became the second county surveyor in 1799 and held that office until 1833 when he was succeeded by his youngest brother Isaac Covington who held that office until 1845.

In 1808, Elijah M. Covington made a survey of the whole county for the purpose of fixing the county seat of government. He found the center of the county to be on the south side of Barren River just east of the Water and Sewer Works of Bowling Green Municipal Utilities and there laid out a town named Jeffersonville. It lasted only a few months of the year 1808, when the inhabitants of the city of Bowling Green obtained an Act of the Kentucky Legislature returning the county seat to its original place.

Elijah Covington married Harriet W. Baldwin (1781-1826) of Virginia on 27 Dec 1804 in Warren Co., KY, and lived on a farm on Drakes Creek near Woodburn where the first four of his children were born: Euclid Covington, Albert Covington, Erasmus Covington, and Harriet Covington. They moved near Bowling Green where the remaining children were born. She died in 1826.

Four daughters of Elijah and Harriet were "brought out" in New Orleans while visiting their uncle, Federal Judge Isaac Baldwin. One daughter, Cornelia, married Gen. Richard Delafield and moved to New York City. The name "Delafield" now applies to a large section of Bowling Green between the city and the Barren River.

Euclid, from above (1805-1888), practiced law and served in the Kentucky Legislature. He lived in a home at Elm Grove (now Hartland Development).

Albert Covington, from above, attended Transylvania University in Lexington, KY and afterwards went to the University of Pennsylvania and graduated in Medicine. He married Josephine Wells, daughter of Robert William Wells, U.S. District Judge for Missouri in 1853. Their son, Robert Wells Covington (1856-1949) graduated from Warren College (which became Ogden College) in 1875, secured a law degree in 1877 from the University of Virginia, and married in 1892 Mary Wickliffe Cooper, teacher of art at Potter College.

Erasmus Covington, from above, when he was ca 27 years old, died soon after graduating from the West Point Military Academy and left his farm, known as the Lazarus farm, to his brother, Euclid.

In 1901, Robert W. Covington, helped organize the Citizens National Bank which he served as a Vice President and director, until his resignation in January 1942.

The names Covington Woods Park, Covington, Euclid, Wakefield, and Wickliffe Avenues are familiar to us all. #### JOSEPH HARVEY 1754-1828 LUCY BALLARD

Though the precise date of his arrival in the South Central Kentucky area is not known it was undoubtably before 1800 for John Gorin, in his Times of Long Ago, listed Joseph Harvey as being one of the first settlers on the headwaters of Marrowbone Creek.

Joseph Harvey was a Revolutionary War vetreran who had enlisted in the Second Contintental Line under Francis Taylor in Orange Co., VA. He married Lucy Ballard, an Orange County neighbor and toward the end of the war, moved his family to Surry County, North Carolina where they lived until sometime in the 1790's.

Joseph and Lucy (Ballard) Harvey had ten children. They were: Elizabeth Harvey, wife of John Lawrence, who was a charter member of Skaggs Creek Baptist Church; James Harvey, ancestor of the late, Dr. Darly Harvey; William Harvey, and Austin Harvey, who both married daughters of Henry Bushong, another early settler; John Harvey and Thomas Harvey, who spent their lives in the neighborhood but left behind few public records; Martin Harvey and Abner Harvey who followed pioneer preachers, Kemp Scott and J. B. Logan to Missouri in 1840; Wilson Harvey, and Martha Harvey, who married William Davis and lived on Marrowvone Creek in Cumberland Co., KY. Many of their children married into other pioneering families whose names are still familiar today.

As a clue to his character, it is known that Joseph Harvey never applied for his military pension because he felt that there were others who needed it more than he. He died in March 1828 at the age of 74. His funeral was conducted by Rev. Geo. B. Harlan.

Joseph and Lucy Harvey lie at rest along with many of their kin in the old family plot now known as Singing Pines, their hand hewned stones weathered beyond legibility. There are two other cemeteries nearby that bear the Harvey name. They are just about the only present day reminders of a family that called Barren County home. #### THOMAS CHAPMAN

Thomas Chapman moved from Virginia to Kentucky in 1790. He settled at

McFadin's Station on Barren River with a few other pioneers. He married Rebecca Todd in Virginia and his familu consisted of his wife, six sons and ont daughter when he came to Kentucky. He remained about a year at the station, and then moved his family to a stockade dwelling which he had built four or five miles up Drake Creek from the station, near the present residence of James L. Coleman. Here every morning, with a beat of drum and shouldered muskets, he marched around the stockade at the head of his family. He died on 24 October 1884 and is buried in the old family graveyard on a bluff overlooking the creek near the Chapman bridge on the farm owned by James L. Coleman.

Thomas and Rebecca (Todd) Chapman's son, David Chapman was born on 25 Oct. 1791. He built a home on a beautiful site about a quarter of a mile from the old stockade his father built. This house burned before the Civil War, and another was built on the same spot. He purchased from the Shakers the land on which the old Shaker Mill stood. This farm was owned for many years by one of his older sons, J. J. Chapman. Warren County History, Biography of Thomas Chapman



325. MISS LIZZIE STRANGE AND MR. ROBT. KELLEY FOREVER JOINED IN INSEPARABLE BONDS. The First Presbyterian church was crowded to overflowing on Wednesday evening when the lives of Miss Lizzie Shape Strange and Mr. Robert L. Kelley were forever entwined in inseparable bonds. The large sanctuary had been very beautifully decorated and the scene presented was a lovely one. Promptly at nine o'clock the bridal party arrived and in a few short minutes thereafter the young couple had been made man and wife. The ceremony was performed by the pastor, Dr. Wm. Irvine.

The bride entered the church upon the arm of her brother, Mr. F. L. Strange. Mr. Chas. Langley, of Louisville, was best man and the ushers were Messrs. James H. Barclay, R. W. Smith, Floyd S. Nahm and W. D. Sloyer, of this city. The flower girls were little Misses McClain Moore, of Adairville, and Carmine Manning, of Louisville.

The **bride** is one of Bowling Green's loveliest girls and has since entering society been a chosen leader. She is a queenly young lady and is very popular in this city and community.

Mr. Kelley is claimed as a Bowling Green citizen although he has chosen Louisville as his home. He is a business man of rare ability and holds the very lucrative position of Secretary and Treasurer of the Kentucky Consumers Oil Co.

Among the many relatives and friends who attended the wedding were Mrs. Clarke Offutt and Mrs. V. P. Moore, Adairville; Mr. and Mrs. Chas. E. Manning, of Louisville, and Miss Louise Belle, of Louisville.

The wedding gifts were both numerous and handsome. Immediately after the ceremony Mr. and Mrs. Kelley left via L. & N. road for an extended bridal trip East and on their return will make their home in Louisville.

326. The <u>Daily News</u> is called upon this afternoon to chronicle the sad death of one of Bowling Green's leading citizens and the vacuum caused by his death will be very hard to fill.

Just at 11:45 this morning the heart that had for the past 40 years throbbed in the bosom of one of our whole-souled christian townsmen, Dr. Thomas B. Wright, ceased to beat, the life light flickered out, the tired hands fell beside him motionless; in a twinkling his useful life was at an end. A loving wife and 3 little children, 2 sons aged 10 and 3 years, and 1 daughter were left to brave life's battles alone. It is sad indeed for death to occur, but for one so young, so useful to his fellow men, so beloved by all to be taken from countless friends, a loving and fond wife and children, is beyond human power to understand. There never lived in Bowling Green a more popular or universally admired citizen, one ever ready to abide by the wishes of his friends.

As is stated above the deceased was 40 years of age, and had been practicing medicine in Bowling Green for the past 17 years, after having graduated with high honors from the Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia. Since then he had taken several post graduate courses in New York City.

The deceased was taken ill on July 30 with cholera morbus, and was sick several days. After about two weeks he was able to drive up into the city and

spend a few moments in his office. Then a backset occurred and he again went to bed, where he has since remained, being unable to again get up. He remained in that condition up to 4 days ago, one day being decidedly better and the following worse, when he grew alarmingly ill and in only a few hours it was seen that the noble life was soon to be sacrificed. The end was only a matter of a few short hours, as the Doctor was growing gradually weaker and for the past 4 days could retain no nourishment.

Deceased was the son of Dr. A. C. Wright of this city, with whom he was in partnership for the practice of their professions, both ranking with the foremost physicians of the state.

Surviving Dr. Wright besides a wife and 3 small children are two half brothers, they being Hugh B. Wright and Master Wyley Wright, both of this city. Dr. Wright's mother was, before her marriage, a Miss Loving. Deceased married Miss Hattie Wilford, of this city.

Chronic inflamation of the stomach caused his death.

327. MRS. MARIAH STERRITT SHIELD FORMERLY OF THIS COUNTY DIES IN KANSAS. The following obituary of Mrs. Mariah Sterrett Shields, formerly of this county, is taken from a recent issue of the Highland, Kas., <a href="Vidette">Vidette</a>:

Mariah Wods Sterrett, wife of Samuel C. Shields, was born in Warren county, Ky., February 12, 1828, Of this union eleven children were born: Ann Elizabeth (Mrs. E. M. Hubbard); William Sterrett, who died in California in 1873; George Robert, who died in Kentucky in 1856; Edwin Eugene, who died in Kansas in 1860; Joseph Lapsley, who died in Kansas in 1861(?); John Fupnston, at present a resident of Highland; Margaret Jane (Mrs. S. K. McCreary, of Potter, Kansas); Mary Alice (Mrs. D. McIntosh, of Chicago); Milbourn Finley, who died in Kansas in 1858; Calvin Rice, of Spokane, Washington, Sallie Blain (Mrs. S. V. Kemper, of Butte, Mont.)

The subject of this sketch moved with her family to Kansas in 1858, and settled on a farm in Brown county. In 1863 the family moved to Highland, where she resided until the death of her husband in 1878. Since that time she has divided her time with her children, but mainly with her youngest daughter, Mrs. Kemper. 
# KENTUCKY AND HER COUNTIES

THE MAP OF KENTUCKY 1785-1786

IN MAY, 1782, THE COMMONMELATH OF VIRGINIA PASSED A LAM, WHICH BECAME EFFECTIVE ON AUGUST 1, 1782, IN WHICH THE THREE COUNTIES WERE CREATED INTO THE <u>BISTRICT OF KENTUCKY</u> AND GIVEN A DISTRICT COURT. THIS WAS DONE TO EXPEDITE THE ACTIONS OF THE COURTS IN SETTLING CASES AND AVOID LONG TRIPS TO VIRGINIA.

THE PERIOD 1785-1786 WITNESSED THE ERECTION OF THE NEXT FOUR COUNTIES IN THE DISTRICT OF KENTUCKY. THE FIRST WAS NELSON, WHOSE CREATING LAW WAS PASSED ON NOVEMBER 29, 1784, AND BECAME EFFECTIVE ON JANUARY 1, 1785. THE COUNTY WAS NAMED FOR GOVERNOR THOMAS NELSON OF VIRGINIA. BARDSTOWN (BAIRDSTOWN)


BECAME THE COUNTY SEAT. ON DECEMBER 15, 1785, MERCER AND MADISON COUNTIES MERE CREATED BY LEGISTATIVE ACT, TO BECOME EFFECTIVE ON AUGUST 1, 1786. MERCER
MAS NAMED FOR GENERAL HUGH MERCER, WHO MAS FATALLY MOUNDED AT THE BATTLE OF
RINCETON ON JANUARY 3, 1777, DYING ON JANUARY 12. MADISON WAS NAMED FOR THE
GREAT PATRIOT WHO WAS TO BECOME THE FOUNTH PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES IN
THE PERIOD 1809-1817. BOURBON COUNTY, NAMED FOR THE FRENCH ROYAL HOUSE OF BOURBON, MAS CREATED ON DECEMBER 29, 1785, AND THE LAW BECAME EFFECTIVE ON MAY 1,
1786. GOVERNOR PATRICK HENRY SIGNED THE BILLS CREATING NELSON, MERCER, MADISON AND BOURBON COUNTIES. HE WAS IN HIS SECOND TERM IN THAT OFFICE.
