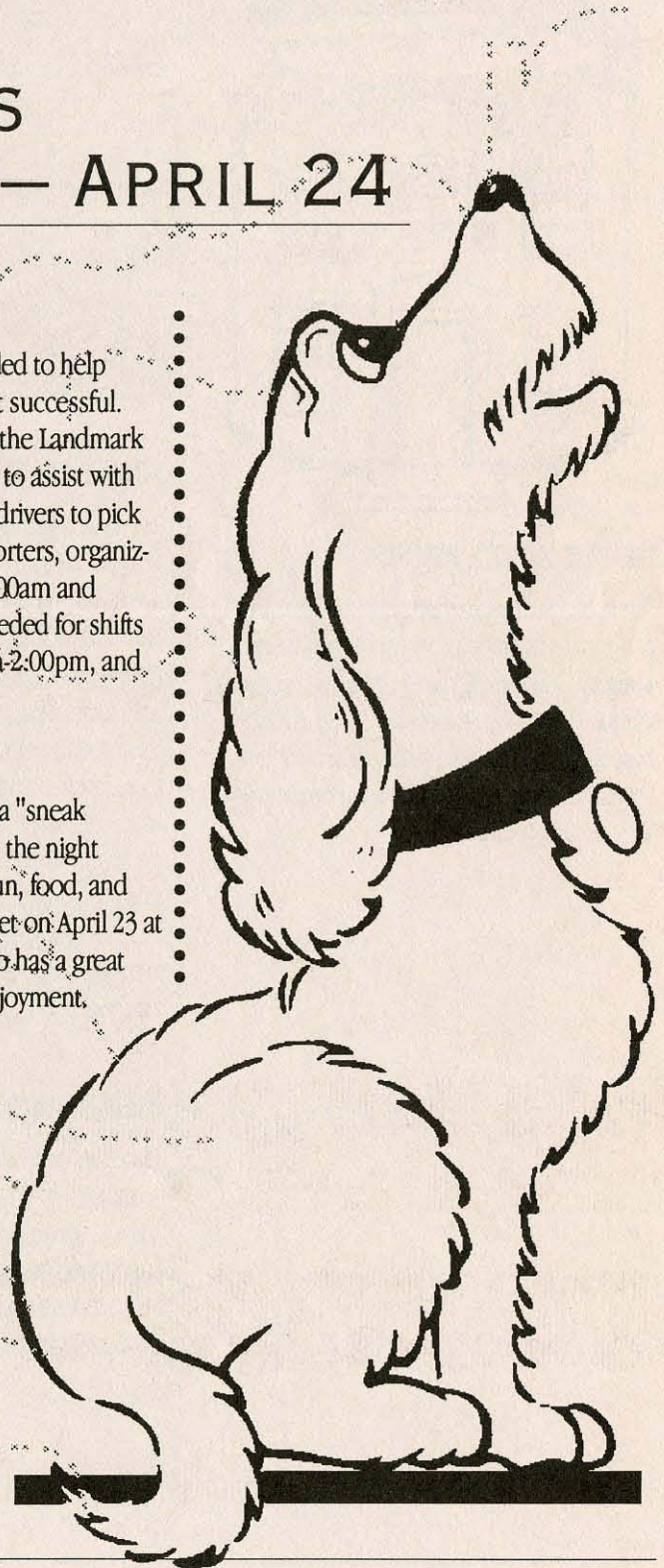
Preferred sales items include: those of architectural interest, antiques, furniture, jewelry, household items, and sporting goods. Landmark will not sell clothing this year.

**WORKERS NEEDED**

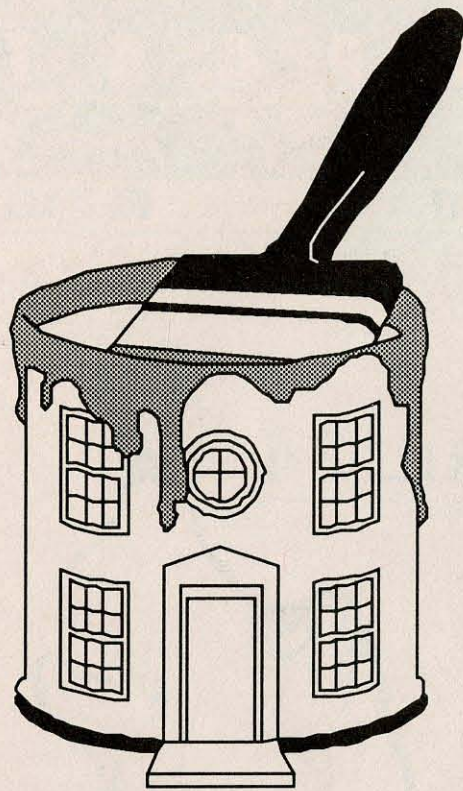
- A variety of workers are needed to help make this year's Flea Market successful.

### MEMBERS HEAR UNIQUE PROGRAMS

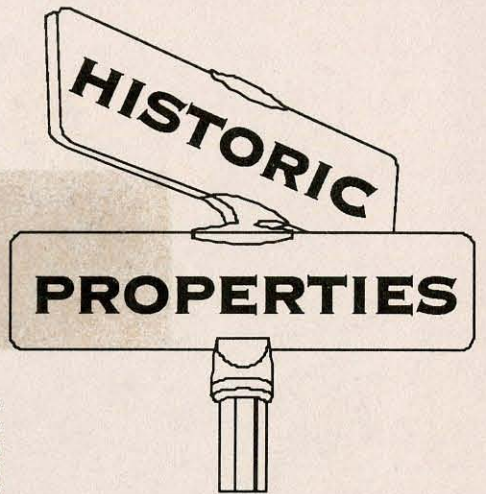
