#### **George Washington Doss**

Among the earliest miners in the coal fields of Western Kentucky was George Washington Doss (the writer's 3rd great-grandfather). George W. Doss lived most of his life in Muhlenberg County, Kentucky along the coal-rich banks of Green River.

George's father, John A. Doss, came to Muhlenberg County with other family members from Bedford County, Virginia in about 1820. John moved into Posey County, Indiana shortly thereafter and fathered two sons, John J. Doss (born December 18,1824) and Bushrod Washington Doss (born August 12,1827). His wife (name unknown) seems to have died shortly after Bushrod's birth. John A. Doss returned to Muhlenberg County, Kentucky and married for a second time to Nancy Ann Whitehouse in late 1834. Their first child, James P. Doss, was born in Muhlenberg County in 1835. Next, John A. Doss moved his family to Mt. Vernon, Illinois, which is located in Jefferson County in the south central portion of the state. There his last son, George Washington Doss, was born August 13,1839. Then sadly the following year, John A. Doss died. He was not yet 50 years old. His widow, her two sons, and two step-sons returned to Muhlenberg County. We find in the early county court records of Muhlenberg County that on April 27,1840, John J. Doss and Bushrod W. Doss, orphans of John A. Doss, were bound to live with their uncle Azariah Doss until they reached the age of 21.

Nancy Ann, the widow of John A. Doss, began raising her two sons in or near her father's residence in Muhlenberg County. Her father, Charles Whitehouse (George W. Doss' grandfather), came into Muhlenberg County in about 1815 from Montgomery County, Maryland. Descendants of Charles Whitehouse remember an interesting story as to why he left Maryland. It was said that he was courting a young lady in Maryland and there was another man who had an eye for her. Charles and the man grew angry with each other and a fight was about to occur. He made a club out of a hickory limb and the other man was armed with a knife. Charles surprised the man by jumping out from behind a tree and then hit him over the head with his club. The man fell to the ground and Charles, fearing he had killed him, ran home and told his mother what he had done. She gave him money and a horse with silver stirrups and told him to run in fear that he would be hung. He settled in Muhlenberg County, Kentucky and it is believed he never heard from his family again.

In late 1842 Charles Whitehouse and his children, including his daughter, Nancy Ann, and her two Doss sons moved to Posey County, Indiana. Nancy Ann married her second husband, William Hart, in Posey County on December 19,1844. According to the 1850 Census of Posey County their family lived in Black Township. Most of the Whitehouse family had returned to Muhlenberg County prior to 1860. Nancy Ann was listed as deceased on the marriage license of her daughter, Mary Elizabeth Hart, to John B. Morris in Muhlenberg County, dated September 6, 1863.

The 1860 Census of Muhlenberg County, Kentucky names George W. Doss twice in Samuel Turner's district. The first listing showed him living in the household of his older brother, James P. Doss and they were working together as farmers. The second time he was working as a miner under Lewis Kincheloe, a coal dealer. The report of Samuel Turner of his district states, "At Lewisburg on Greenriver is a coal bank worked.". Lewis White Reno Kincheloe was owner of a coal mine at Kincheloe's Bluff (once known as the town of Lewisburg) and also owned several steamboats operating from and past that port on Green River. Tragedy struck Kincheloe on July 8, 1870 when he was killed by the explosion of one of his steamboats. George W. Doss named his second surviving son Louis White Doss in Kincheloe's honor.

Rothert's History of Muhlenberg County, Kentucky states the black rock (coal) that would burn was discovered about 1820 by Alney McLean on his farm near Green River and that he was one of the first men to report the existence of coal in Western Kentucky. Rothert further states that the coal along Green River received more attention in the early days than any found elsewhere in the county, because its location was near better transportation facilities.

On September 6,1861 George volunteered to serve in the Union Army. He enlisted at Hartford, Kentucky, which is on the other side of Green River in Ohio County. He served as a private under Lieutenant Thomas R. Brown's Company A of the 17th Regiment of Kentucky Infantry under Captain Preston Morton. He did not see much, if any, action as his military records state three months after his enlistment, December of 1861, he became sick. He took several leaves of absence during the next few months in Mound City, Illinois and in Muhlenberg County, Kentucky. Finally in July and August of 1862 he was hospitalized in Nashville, Tennessee. There he was diagnosed and treated for "phthisis pulmonalis," which *Taber's Cyclopedic Medical Dictionary* defines as tuberculosis of the lungs. Strict isolation

and prolonged bedrest was the treatment in those days before developments in chemotherapy were discovered. He was discharged with disability in Nashville on October 20,1862. His discharge papers state at enlistment he was age 23, stood 5 feet 71/2 inches tall, had a dark complexion, dark eyes, and dark hair.

During the last years of the Civil War, George met a young lady named Mary "Mollie" Elizabeth Fisher who was residing in Evansville, Indiana at the time. She was born February 25,1849 in Louisville, Kentucky and her parents were natives of Germany. Their actual marriage record has not been discovered. His pension application dated 1915 states they were married March 18,1864 in Evansville, Vanderburgh County, Indiana by a Justice of the Peace and that the certificate had been destroyed. The first of their eleven children, James Henry Doss, was born February 27,1865 in Henderson County, Kentucky. The other remaining ten children were born in Muhlenberg County: John A Doss on August 13,1867; Louis White Doss on March 23,1869; Mary E. Doss on January 31,1871; George Washington Doss Jr. on July 14,1874; Sarah E. Doss on January 8, 1877; Carrie A. Doss on November 11,1879; Emma Bell Doss on May 22,1881; Edward T. Doss on June 16,1884; Catherine Margaret Doss on May 11,1886 and Charles W. Doss on October 14,1889.

One of George's many purchases of land in Muhlenberg County, Kentucky is recorded in Deed Book 39 on page 335: "Between James P. McIntire & Elizabeth McIntire his wife parties of the first part and Geo W. Doss party of the 2nd part...sum of \$125.00...certain tracts and parcels of land in the county of Muhlenberg, Kentucky on the waters of Green River and in and near the town of Lewisburg in the sd County...Acres of land known as the Dozier tract of land and adjoining the Town of Lewisburg KY One house and lot in said town of Lewisburg Styled The Finch House and Lot One house and lot in said town of Lewisburg known as the Dozier House and lot One blacksmith shop and Lot in said town 13 lots in said Town (unimproved lots) one store houseshop and lot in said town."

Rothert's History of Muhlenberg County, Kentucky 1913, as cited above, contains several articles concerning the old town where George lived: "Kincheloe's Bluff or Lewisburg, on Green River, was settled and made 'a port of entry' before the close of the Eighteenth Century. ...in the earliest times hauled much of the produce to shipping points on the Ohio River, but about the beginning of the Nineteenth Century, when Kincheloe's Bluff was made a landing place, all produce for the outside world was sent there...After South Carrollton was started about 1838,

Lewisburg gradually lost its business and finally became little more than a ferry crossing. An old brick residence, a frame house, and a small abandoned drift coal mine and tipple are all that is now standing on the site that in early days seemed destined to become one of the largest towns in the county. A short distance below the old Bluff Landing, which is still used by a ferry boat and some of the steamboats, is the pumping station of Central City's waterworks." The old

Kincheloe's Bluff ferry was once owned and operated by George Washington Doss and his family.

In addition to being a miner, George was a farmer, fisherman, ferry boat-operator, and boatmaker. He was also a sharp businessman who was very successful at buying and selling land for profit. His declaration for pension, dated 1922, states he had recently retired from being a coal miner. So he must have stayed with his trade up into his seventies. Bill Murphy of Central City remembers a story about "Grandpa Doss" in which old George nearly drowned. George had nets set up along Nelson Creek near the mouth where it empties into Green River. He was wading through the creek when his boots became entangled in the nets and he began sinking. He was pulled under and had to struggle to remove his boots. He was able to pull his feet out of the boots and managed to pull himself to safety.

In his later years he helped establish the Green River Chapel General Baptist Church His wife Mollie died January 11,1919 in Muhlenberg County. On June 3,1919, at the age of nearly 80, George married Mrs. Ella R. (Scatt) Johnson. She was thirty years younger than old George, born April 2,1873 near Star Mills, Kentucky in Hardin County. George died November 13,1925 and was buried alongside his first wife at their chapel's cemetery, today known as Kincheloe's Bluff Cemetery.

Vick his crops and a large portion of his household goods including "....two featherbeds and furniture, three fancy bedsteads, one cupboard,...two tables, eight chairs, one rifle gun, one coffee mill, one sorrell mare and sorrell colt and their increase..." along with various kitchen and farm implements.

This deed is dated February 10, 1840.

#### Two Men Killed At Powderly Mine

Claude Heltsley, 34, and George Maddox, 24, Victims of Slate Fall Two young men lost their lives at noon Tuesday when caught by falling slate in the mine of the Greenville Coal Company at Powderly. They were Claude Heltsley, 34 years old and George Maddox, 24 years old, both living at Powderly. They were engaged in repairing a trolley line not far from the main entrance, when falling slate crushed them, and it is thought, killed them instantly.

Their bodies were brought to Greenville to M.B. McDonald funeral director and prepared for burial. The double funeral service was held at the Baptist Church at Greenville at 3:20 o'clock Wednesday, the Rev. L. P. Whittaker, of Bremen, in charge. Interment followed in Evergreen cemetery.

The crowd of friends and relatives filled to overflowing the local church and the floral offering was very beautiful.

Heltsley is survived by his widow, his parents, Mr, and Mrs, Thomas Heltsley, of Powderly, and one sister, Mrs. Lucien Keys, Central City. Twelve years ago a younger brother was accidentally drowned in the lake at Powderly.

Maddox is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs, Edward Maddox, of Powderly, and four brothers and two sisters.

#### Jefferson Belcher Dies Wednesday

#### Served with Union Forces Throughout Civil War. Was 91 Years Old.

Mr. Jefferson L. Belcher, in his 9lst year, died at the home of his son, W.O Belcher, here Wednesday afternoon at 5 o' clock of a complication of troubles incident to his age.

Mr. Belcher was born in Wilson County, Tennessee, removed to Butler County, Ky. shortly after the Civil War, and to Muhlenberg County about thirty years ago. He served in the Union Army with an Illinois regiment during the entire war. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church.

A short funeral service was held at the grave, conducted by the Rev. G. W. Burroughs, pastor of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and interment followed in Evergreen Cemetery.

Surviving are two sons Messrs. W. O. and Newton Belcher both of this city.
