



REV. GARRY POLSTON IN FULL-TIME EVANGELISM

He's the "Preacher's preacher", a "Walking Bible", from the backwoods of Ky. Born and raised in a small community called Jabez, Garry Wayne Polston, more popularly known in gospel circles as the "Round Man", is a true pioneer in the pages of modern-day evangelism.

At 29, Garry has been honored by numerous awards in both preaching and singing. He has traveled professionally with the SEGO BROS. AND NAOMI of Nashville, Tenn., has been named a KENTUCKY COLONEL, and was recently awarded a certificate for "Excellence in Pastoral Evangelism".

For the past 3 years, Garry has been pastor of the Adair Circuit U. Meth. Church in Milltown, Ky. Here the records show clearly his outstanding leadership abilities. In 1980 by the grace of GOD, there were 31 souls added to the charge, most of which were on profession of faith! The churches have grown and prospered with Milltown church paying off a new educational building in May of 1981.

I would like to share with you a news brief I heard on WERH radio station in Hamilton on October 23 on the 10 p.m. FM news.

According to this IRS article, during July and August 1980, Social Security made a mistake and sent out some checks in some states namely Kentucky, Virginia and others. In cashing these checks, the requirements on the backs of the checks stated the person to have a mark in their right hand or forehead.

The banks were concerned and refused to cash the checks, and after several discussions and uproars at the bank, the IRS was contacted and they admitted that these were valid social security checks, but that they had made a mistake in sending them out early, that these checks were not to be used, and this requirement not enforced until 1984.

IRS MARK

During the months of July and August, 1980 the Internal Revenue Service made a mistake that it wishes could be reversed. Reports from several states such as Kentucky, Indiana, Maryland, and Virginia, confirm this startling news item.

Scores of Social Security checks were accidently mailed to recipients that required a special and unusual process for cashing. It was so unusual that the banks "REFUSED" to even try to cash them. Are you ready for this? Here is what made the difference.

As you know, government checks have a special printed paragraph on the back with instructions and requirements for cashing. Normally, it states that proper identification must be shown, with the check being endorsed at the time of cashing.

Well, that instructional paragraph on these checks was changed to read that the



party cashing the check must have the proper identification, "MARK in their RIGHT HAND or FOREHEAD!" Without it, the check could not be cashed.

Naturally, the banks as well as the receivers of the checks were surprised, confused and frustrated. In spite of all demands (even threats) the banks refused to cash any of the checks.

The IRS was contacted in each case. After much confusion, denials and arguing, the IRS admitted the mistakes. The checks were valid Social Security checks. However, they were not useable at this time. In fact, the only problem with them, was that they were sent out too soon.

These government checks, requiring a "MARK" in a person's "RIGHT HAND or FOREHEAD" are not to be put into use until "1984."

Need I say more? Thank God, it can't be long until JESUS comes. If you are going to be faithful or If you are going to reach your lost friends and loved ones you had better do it NOW....
