

MINUTES OF BOARD OF REGENTS

July 23, 1909.

At a called meeting of the Board of Regents in the office of the President of the Western Kentucky State Normal School, there were present Messrs. J. Whit Potter, H. K. Cole, and E. H. Mark.

The report of President Cherry was read and that part of it with reference to election of faculty was unanimously adopted. The following is that part of the reports:

**MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING August 25, 1909**

At a called meeting of the Board of Regents held in the office of the President of the school, there were present Messrs. H. K. Cole, J. Whit Potter, and E. H. Mark.

The minutes for the last three meetings were read and approved.

On motion of Mr. Potter, the Vice President and the present Secretary were authorized to sign all unsigned minutes, the same having been approved.

Mr. Potter then reported that, after advertising for bids, he had awarded the contract for coal for the ensuing year for the school to J. T. Chandler of Bowling Green. This contract calls for 750 tons of coal at \$2.35 per ton nut and lump, said Chandler to pay for putting the coal back in the coal houses and to pay the man selected by this Board to do the weighing of the coal.

On motion a resolution was adopted authorizing Messrs. Cole and Mark to purchase a safe for the use of the offices of the school at a sum not to exceed \$100 as specified in former resolution.

At this point, a letter was read from Supt. J. G. Crabbe under date of August 24th, stating his inability with regret for not being present at this meeting.

On motion of Mr. Mark, President Cherry and Regents Potter and Cole were authorized to take up the matter of telephone and take such action as they deem necessary.

At 10:25 the architect and contractors with their bids were invited in and said bids read.
