

> "REGIONAL MEETING INFORMATION"

American Business Women's Association THE ABWA COMPANY, INC 9100 WARD PARKWAY KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI 64114 February 6, 1979 TO: ALL CHAPTER PRESIDENTS "I'm amazed! I had no Idea we would be so busy this weekend," was the comment made by a member of the National Board of Directors on January 20, 1979, following the close of the annual Directors' Meeting. From the time they arrived in Kansas City on Thursday, January 18, until their departure three days later, the nine National Officers were almost continuously involved in discussion of the affairs and policies of ABWA and in conducting the many items of business which required their attention. Cognizant of their responsibilities as managers of the Association and as the Trustees and Selection Board of SBMEF, the Officers carefully considered the many recommendations and proposals presented to them. Several resolutions amending the National Bylaws of ABWA were adopted and these resolutions are printed as a portion of this mailing. The following is a recapitulation and explanation of the Board's action in adopting the resolutions.

INITIAL MEMBERSHIP FEE AND NATIONAL ANNUAL DUES

After reviewing a five year comparison of costs of services provided by The ABWA Company, Inc., the National Board of Directors approved the request of the Company for national annual dues of \$15 and initial membership fees of \$38.50, which include the first year's national annual dues. Spiraling costs of postage, paper, printing, and labor necessitated these modest increases in order to maintain membership services at the present or an improved level. Noting that dues and fees have not been increased for five years, the Board voted that the change will become effective May 1, 1979.

PLEASE MAKE THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THIS MAILING AVAILABLE
TO YOUR BULLETIN CHAIRMAN FOR PUBLICATION IN YOUR CHAPTER BULLETIN.

At the Annual Meeting of the National Convention which will be held in Minneapolis, Minneapota, October 25-28, 1979, chapter delegates in attendance will elect nine National Officers who will serve as the 1979-1980 National Board of Directors. There are many well qualified and experienced members of ABWA who have demonstrated their leadership capabilities at the chapter level. Chapters are encouraged to seriously consider nominating outstanding leaders in their chapters as candidates for national office. Please familiarize yourself and your chapter with RULES GOVERNING NOMINATIONS AND CAMPAIGNING FOR NATIONAL OFFICE which is enclosed with this letter. Enclosed, also, is the 1979 NOMINATION FOR NATIONAL OFFICE and the ACCEPTANCE OF THE NOMINATION FOR NATIONAL OFFICE AND STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS form which must be filed by every member who is nominated by her chapter.

To allow sufficient time for the National Nominating Committee to process candidates' nominations and to give approved candidates adequate opportunity to prepare campaign materials, the National Board of Directors adopted a resolution for amending the National Bylaws which required 1979 nominees for national office to submit nomination forms no later than JUNE 15, 1979. The possibility of your chapter wishing to sponsor a candidate for national office should be discussed at your next chapter meeting in order to allow sufficient time to comply with the rules for nomination.

After considering the influence of modern methods of transportation on the accessibility to National Headquarters, the Directors adopted a resolution amending the National Bylaws to permit the National Secretary-Treasurer to reside within a one hundred mile radius of Metropolitan Kansas City, Missouri.

1980 PRESIDENT'S SCHOLARSHIP

Law Enforcement was selected by the Trustees of SBMEF as the field of study for the 1980 President's Scholarship of \$2,000. Prior to 1972, there were few women working in state and federal law enforcement. Currently there is a wilder range of job opportunities available in local and federal agencies, including the FBI and CIA. The selection of this field of study for the special grant for graduate students should be an incentive for women to pursue careers in Law Enforcement.

REGIONAL MEETINGS AND NATIONAL CONVENTIONS

Sites and dates for the 1981 Regional Meetings and the 1982 National Convention were selected by the Board of Directors in accordance with the Association's National Bylaws. Included with this letter is a listing of sites and dates of the 1979, 1980, and 1981 Regional Meetings and the sites and dates of the next four National Conventions.

Seminars which have been held in conjunction with Regional Meetings the past two years have been enthusiastically received by members who participated in these four hour sessions as part of their Regional Meeting activity. This spring members are being offered the opportunity to take part in a self-development seminar titled "Get Your Life in Shape." (Brochure enclosed.)

Registrations for the 1979 Regional Meetings and seminars are currently being received at National Headquarters. Space is limited, however, so please encourage members of your chapter to register promptly using the forms which were printed in the January issue of WOMEN IN BUSINESS.

If you have never attended an ABWA Regional Meeting, you've missed a valuable experience. If you're a "seasoned" Regional Meeting attendee, you'll want to once again join friends from other chapters throughout your Region, your National Officers, and National Headquarters' staff members, for another enjoyable and productive meeting that will have a somewhat "new look."

The past month has forced many of us to cope with record breaking winter weather conditions which were psychologically depressing. An appropriate antidote to the feeling of having contracted a case of "cabin fever" is the contemplation of this year's vacation plans. Enclosed is a brochure outlining ABWA's 1979 "London Lark" -- the post-convention tour which will follow the close of the National Convention in Minneapolis next October. Please call this travel opportunity to the attention of the members of your chapter -- just thinking about this fascinating trip to London and the "Longer Look" at Scotland and Ireland will help counteract winter doldrums!

Just as we anticipate the arrival of spring, each year we look forward to being with new friends and also those of longstanding at ABWA Regional Meetings. We hope to see you and your ABWA "Positive Image" soon at your Regional Meeting.

Section 1 and Section 2 of ARTICLE VII entitled 'Dues and Fees' shall be deleted, and in lieu thereof the following Section 1 and Section 2 of ARTICLE VII are hereby adopted as follows --

ARTICLE VII. DUES AND FEES

Section 1. The initial membership fee shall be \$38.50, which includes the first year's national annual dues of \$15.00.

Section 2. National annual dues for membership in the Association shall be \$15.00, payable in advance for every year of membership."

RULES GOVERNING NOMINATION AND CAMPAIGNING

I. NOMINATION

A. National Offices

- National offices of the Association are President, First Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, and six District Vice Presidents.
- The nine National Officers of the Association serve a term of one year, or until their successors in office have been elected.

B. Qualifications

- Each chapter of the Association may submit the name of any chapter member to the National Nominating Committee as a candidate for national office.
 Each candidate must:
 - a. Have been an active chapter member in good standing for at least two years as of June 15 preceding the Annual Meeting.
 - b. Have held or currently be holding an elective office in a chapter.
 - Be gainfully employed. No member who is retired or unemployed is eligible for national office.
 - d. Be nominated at a chapter meeting by a majority vote of the entire active membership of record of her chapter. Only those members present at that meeting are eligible to vote. The vote shall be by written ballot. (The minutes of the meeting at which the candidate is nominated must show: 1) the number of members present; and 2) the exact number of affirmative votes cast.)
 - e. Be in attendance at the Annual Meeting. Any candidate for national office not in attendance at the Annual Meeting will be disqualified by reason of her absence.
- A candidate for National Secretary-Treasurer must reside within a one hundred (100) mile radius of Metropolitan Kansas City, Missouri. A candidate for the office of District Vice President must be a resident of such district. No National Officer may serve in the same office for more than one year.

II. NATIONAL NOMINATING COMMITTEE

- A. Each national office nominee must submit the 1979 NOMINATION FOR NATIONAL OFFICE, and ACCEPTANCE OF THE NOMINATION FOR NATIONAL OFFICE AND STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS form to the National Nominating Committee Chairman and National Headquarters by JUNE 15, 1979.
- 8. The National Nominating Committee will review the official forms it receives. The nominee will then be notified by the Chairman of the National Nominating Committee, in writing, that her candidacy has been approved or disapproved.
- C. Information compiled by the National Nominating Committee concerning all approved candidates for national office will:
 - Be sent by National Headquarters to all ABWA Chapter Presidents at least forty-five (45) days prior to the Association's Annual Meeting.
 - 2. Be published in the September issue of WOMEN IN BUSINESS magazine.

D. The National Nominating Committee, by a majority vote of its members, shall have the right in its sole discretion to disqualify any candidate who has violated the rules for qualification or campaigning for office.

E. All charges of violations of such rules shall be made in writing to the National Nominating Committee with a copy to National Headquarters. If the written charges of violation are submitted to the National Nominating Committee fifteen (15) days or more before the Annual Meeting, the committee shall consider and act upon such charges, and notify the complainant or complainants and the candidates involved before the vote for office at the Annual Meeting. If the charges in writing are submitted to the Nominating Committee less than fifteen (15) days before the Annual Meeting, then the Nominating Committee may consider such charges and waive the requirement of time of notice by a unanimous vote of the Nominating Committee. In that event, the Nominating Committee shall consider such charges and act upon them as an emergency matter at the earliest practical time before the vote for the office in question at the Annual Meeting.

III. CAMPAIGNING

A. Starting Date

- All nominees for an ABWA national office must be approved as candidates by the National Nominating Committee <u>before</u> they are eligible to campaign for national office.
- No campaigning by any means can be conducted for a national office
 of the Association by an approved candidate before <u>JUNE 15, 1979</u>.
 This includes announcing the nomination and/or soliciting support
 from chapter members of other ABWA chapters prior to June 15, 1979.

B. Materials

Candidates and their campaign workers <u>must limit</u> campaign materials to items that have as their <u>primary purpose</u> the presentation of the candidates' qualifications for national office. These materials must be limited to any or all of the following:

- CAMPAIGN BROCHURES -- A campaign brochure is a pamphlet, leaflet, or flyer presenting a candidate's qualifications for national office.
- CAMPAIGN BADGES -- A campaign badge is a device or emblem denoting support for a candidate, which can be attached to a garment. The name and/or picture of the candidate must be displayed on the badge. Badges must be approved at the Candidates' Meeting at the National Convention before distribution.
- CAMPAIGN POSTERS -- A campaign poster is a printed or handmade placard publicizing a candidate and/or her qualifications for national office.

C. Mailing

A campaign malling is defined as any written or printed material soliciting support for national office. A candidate for national office is:

- 1. Not required to send a campaign mailing.
- Limited to one (1) mailing to each chapter whose delegate is eligible to vote for the office sought by the candidate. One copy of this mailing is to be sent to the National Nominating Committee Chairman, Miss Vicki S. Berry, 9340 Bales, Apt. B; Kansas City, Missouri 64132; and one copy to National Headquarters, 9100 Ward Parkway, P.O. Box 8728, Kansas City, Missouri 64114.
- Sent a request form for ordering malling labels for Chapter Presidents following National Headquarters' receipt of her nomination form.

D. Booths

For the purpose of meeting and talking to delegates at the Association's National Convention, arrangements will be made for candidates to rent a campaign booth at the National Convention. More information about booths will be mailed to Chapter Presidents.

E. Expenditures

- A chapter may furnish financial support to a candidate it has nominated. Chapter funds may not be used for campaign purposes for candidates who are members of other chapters. However, any ABWA member may participate in special fund raising projects for a candidate's campaign.
- Campaigning expenses can and should be kept to a minimum. Good judgment and common sense are the key attributes of a successful and wellorganized campaign, not the amount of money spent. Candidates may find the following checklist of questions helpful in developing their campaigns:
 - a. Have I checked all possible sources for free or low cost supplies and services?
 - b. Have I utilized the talents, ingenuity, and resourcefulness of other chapter members in designing my campaign material?
 - c. Do my proposed campaign materials meet the specifications outlined under Section III, B, Materials?
 - d. Is a mailing necessary for my campaign since the National Nominating Committee will be sending notification of candidacy to each ABWA Chapter President and since information about all approved candidates will be published in the September Issue of WOMEN IN BUSINESS?
 - e. Are campaign costumes necessary to carry out my theme?
 - f. If so, can the costumes be easily and inexpensively made and worn after the election?
