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

Using World War I Records

November 11, 1998 marked the 80th anniversary of the armistice ending World War I. For many Americans, this war is ancient history. Young people born after the depression were living through the rapid changes in technology and the growing unrest in Europe leading to World War II. Today, genealogists are discovering the wonderful records which were created during America's involvement in "The Great War."

On June 28, 1914 Gavrilo Princip, a young Bosnian student who was living in Serbia, leaped on the car of the Archduke Ferdinand (heir to the throne of Austria-Hungary) and began firing a gun. The Archduke and his wife, Sophie, died immediately. By autumn, the Central Powers (Austria-Hungary, Germany, and the Ottoman Empire) were at war with the Allies (Belgium, France, Great Britain, Russia and Serbia.)

The United States attempted to remain neutral during the early part of the War. American attitudes changed with the sinking of the Lusitania and Germany's announcement that they would begin unrestricted submarine warfare on all ships, including passenger ships.

Although Woodrow Wilson had declared his intention to keep America neutral in this conflict, the nation declared war on April 17, 1917. Before the war ended, more than four million "doughboys" had served in the U.S. Army with American Expeditionary Forces (AEF), U.S. Navy, or Marines.

Selective Service Draft Registration Cards

The first records we will examine are the Draft Registration Cards. The records provide information not only about the soldiers who served, but about men in the community who registered for the draft. Under the Selective Service laws enacted in Congress in 1917, all men (U.S. citizens and aliens) born between September 1873 and September 1900 were required to register with the local draft board. The only county in Kentucky with a separate city draft board was Jefferson (Louisville). These records are available on microfilm at the Bowling Green LDS Family History Center, The Kentucky Department of Libraries and Archives in Frankfort, and the National Archives in Washington, DC. The original draft registration cards are located in the National Archives-Southeast Region in East Point, Georgia.

There were three dates of registration:

- A 5 June 1917 for those age 21-31
- B June and August 1919, for those age 21 since first registration
- C 2 Sept 1918, for those age 18-21 and age 31-45

The forms used for each of these registrations were different and the information reported varied.

The cards are filed by county and then alphabetically by registrant's surname and given name. Be sure to check adjacent counties for registrants who might live near the county or state line.

War Department Statement of Service Cards

After the war, there was a need for states to identify and provide proof of services for benefits and certain exemptions. A Statement of Service was authorized by an act of Congress approved July 11, 1919. These statements were prepared by the Adjutant General's office in Washington, DC and sent to the respective state Adjutant Generals. For the state of Kentucky, these original cards are located in the Kentucky Department of Libraries and Archives in Frankfort. They have not been microfilmed and are stored in alphabetical order by surname and then first name. They are separated by branch of service (Army, Navy, Marine or Nurse). These records provide the following information: Name, Serial Number, Race, Address, Induction [or enlistment] location & date, soldier's place of birth, age or date of birth, the service organizations of the Soldier with dates of assignment and transfers, promotions of rank & date of appointment, battle engagements, wounds or injuries received in action, overseas service with dates, Date of discharge, percentage of disability, other remarks.

Soldiers Discharge Books

Soldiers were instructed at the end of the War to report to their local County Court clerk and record their Military Discharge. These records (DD-214) although incomplete, provide family information about the soldiers. The originals are held by the County Clerk's Office.

Other Resources

In addition to the direct official records which were created, you should not forget that many other records of the events of this war were created. Remember the first step of genealogy, which also applies here - Start with yourself and your home. Be sure to look for World War I era certificates or medals. Don't forget to check the newspapers of Nashville and Louisville, which were collection points for companies. There are daily accounts of soldiers enlistments and company movements. In addition, there are regular accounts of the events in Europe and even larger accounts of the Armistice and Victory continuing into 1919.

Flowers, John A., Private, C Co, 23 yrs, 10 Sep 1861 Rochester, KY. Jan-Feb 1862 home furlough. May-Jun 1862 sick at Hamburg, TN. Jul-Aug 1862 in hospital Stevenson, AL. Sep-Oct 1862 sick at Danville, KY. Jan-Feb 1863 sick at home. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Flowers, Nottley C., Private, C Co, 23 yrs, 10 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Promoted to 3rd Sergeant (vice **Isaac W. Embry**, promoted) on 15 Aug 1862. Promoted to 2nd sergeant (vice **Isaac W. Embry**, deceased) on 2 Jan 1863. Promoted to 1st Sergeant (vice **William B. Neal**, commissioned) on 19 Jun 1863. 3 Mar 1864 detached duty on recruiting service in Butler C, KY (reported 7 Mar 1864). Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Fluallen, Alfred, Private, C Co, 20 yrs, 10 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Mar-Jun 1862 sick at Hamburg, TN. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY. (Also listed as Flewellan, Flewellen, Fluellen.)

Forbes, Luther B., Private, E Co, 48 yrs, 1 Sep 1862 at Brownsville, KY and mustered in 30 Nov 1862. At enlistment was 5 ft 11 in, light complexion, Blue eyes, gray hair, farmer, and born in Ontario Co, NY. Killed at battle of Stones's River (Murfreesboro, TN) on 2 Jan 1863.

Ford, William S., Private, H Co, 28 yrs, 17 Oct 1861 at South Carrollton, KY, May-Jun 1862 sick at Ward I, General Hospital #5 (Jefferson Barracks) St. Louis, MO. Died 21 Jun 1862 at St. Louis, MO of chronic diarrhea. Buried 21 Jun 1862 at Blocker Cemetery, plot #43. Was resident of Earles, KY, married and born in NC.

Forge, William, Private, F Co., 18 yrs, 17 Oct 1861 at Rochester, KY. Jan-Feb 1862 sick at Nashville, TN. Detailed as Provost Guard at Division Headquarters 5 June 1864. Discharged 14 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY with notation of "one Springfield rifle and accouterments lost due to negligence."

Forrester, William, Private, K Co, 21 yrs, 10 Oct 1861 at Earles, KY. May-June 1862 sick at Hamburg, TN. Sep 1862-Feb 1863 sick at Danville, KY. Mar-Apr 1863 sick at General Hospital Cincinnati, OH. May-June 1863 AWOL. Discharged 19 May 1863 at Cincinnati, OH due to disability. Discharge certificate states disability due to chronic diarrhea. Was a resident of Earles, KY.

Fortner, George W., 3rd Sergeant, D Co, 30 yrs, 14 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Promoted to 1st Sergeant (vice **James H. Duncan**, deceased) on 26 Jan 1862. Apr-Oct 1862 detached service with I Co, 3rd Battalion, Pioneer Corps. Commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant (vice **Daniel M. Stahl**, promoted) on 19 June 1863. Promoted to 1st Lieutenant (vice **Daniel M. Stahl**, promoted) on Nov 1863. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Fortney, John G. W., Private, D Co, 21 yrs, 16 Oct 1861 at Camp George D. Prentice (Greenville), KY. Transferred to B Co 31 Dec 1861. Sep-Oct 1862 sick at Nashville, TN. Promoted to 3rd Corporal June 1862. Promoted 2nd Corporal Apr 1863. Due government 40 cents for lost ordnance May-Apr 1864. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Foster, Egbert J., Private, F Co, 26 yrs, 14 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Discharged 27 Mar 1862 at Nashville, TN due to disability. Discharge certificate states disability due to chronic bronchitis. At discharge was 5 ft 11 in, dark complexion, blue eyes, dark hair, painter, and born in Charlotte Co, VA.

Fox, Joseph, Captain, I Co, 27 yrs, 15 Sep 1861 at Camp Caloway (Hartford), KY. Detached duty 30 Apr-31 Aug 1862 as recruiter in KY. May-June 1863 sick at home. Tendered resignation on 1 June 1863 due to illness. Discharged 19 June 1863 at Hartford, KY.

Freeman, Jesse Knox, 1st Lieutenant, H Co, 23 yrs, 28 Sep 1861 at South Carrollton, KY. 13 Jan-26 Feb 1862 detailed as Aide de Camp for Colonel **James G. Jones**, Commander 14th Brigade. Promoted to Captain (vice **Isaac W. Sketo**, deceased) on 8 Apr 1862 at Shiloh, TN. 18 June-18 July 1862 on home leave to recover from bronchitis and diarrhea. Discharged 14 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Freeman, Matthew W., Private, I Co, 28 yrs, 8 Oct 1861 at Camp Caloway, KY. Jan-Apr 1862 sick at Calhoun, KY. May-June 1862 sick at home. Jul-Aug 1862 sick at Louisville, KY. Jul-Aug, 1862 sick at Nashville, TN. Deserted Sep 1862 at Bowling Green, KY. Deserters List of 5 Apr 1863 stated was near Greenville, KY.

Frizzell, Abraham A., Private, D Co, 21 yrs, 14 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. May-June 1862 sick at Hamburg, TN. Jul-Aug 1862 discharge furlough. Promoted to Corporal Dec 1862. Captured near Atlanta, GA on 25 Aug 1864 and confined Andersonville Prison 28 Aug 1864. Transferred Millen, GA 11 Nov 1864. Paroled 15 Apr 1865 and exchanged 28 Apr 1865 at Jacksonville, FL reported to Camp Parole, MD 11 May 1865 and sent to Camp Chase, OH 18 May 1865 and reported 20 May 1865. Discharged 29 May 1865 at Louisville, KY.

Furgeson, James, Private, C Co, 24 yrs, 10 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. May-Oct 1862 sick at Field Hospital Corinth, MS (admitted 10 May 1862). Nov-Dec 1862 sick at hospital Bowling Green, KY. Captured at Bowling Green, KY on 31 Dec 1862 by General **John H. Morgan** and

paroled. Reported to K Co, 4th Regiment Paroled Forces at Camp Chase, OH on 2 Jan 1863. Returned to regiment 13 Mar 1863 at Bowling Green, KY. Discharged 16 Dec 1864.

Furgeson, Timothy, Private, C Co, 18 yrs, 10 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Sep-Oct sick at Danville, KY. 20 Oct 1863 detailed as guard at Knoxville, TN. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Furgeson, Tobias, Private, C Co, 21 yrs, 10 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. 25 Dec 1861-Feb 1862 sick at Home. Discharged 1 Mar 1862 at Bowling Green, KY due to disability. Kept on muster rolls and had notation of "Deserted Sep-Oct 1864 in Georgia". Notation was subsequently removed.

Gadden, James M., Corporal, D Co, 30 yrs, 14 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Died 1 Mar 1862 at Calhoun, KY of pneumonia.

Gaines, John P., Private, D Co, 20 yrs, 1 Sep 1862 at Rochester, KY and mustered in 4 Oct 1862. At enlistment was 5 ft 11 in, dark complexion, gray eyes, dark hair, farmer and born in Grainger Co, TN. Wounded (severely) at battle of Stone's River (Murfreesboro, TN) on 31 Dec 1862 and sent to University Hospital #2 Nashville, TN. Died 31 Mar 1863 at Nashville, TN of gunshot wounds. Buried 2 Apr 1863 at Nashville City Cemetery, plot #420. [Reinterred Nashville National Cemetery, section D, plot #3213.]

Gaines, William W., Private, D Co, 18 yrs, 1 Sep 1862 at Rochester, KY and mustered in 4 Oct 1862 at Louisville, KY. At enlistment was 5 ft 10 in, fair complexion, gray eyes, dark hair, farmer and born in Grainger Co, TN. Wounded (slightly) at battle of Stone's River on 2 Jan 1863. 20 Mar 1864 home furlough. Discharged 22 Jul 1865 at Louisville, KY.

Gardner, Edward, Private (Farrier), A Co, 37 yrs, 11 Sep 1861 at Calhoun, KY. May-Aug 1862 sick at Corinth, MS. Died 12 or 28 Jun 1863 at home of pneumonia (which was contracted in line of duty.)

Garrett, James C., Private, D Co, 30 yrs, 20 Sep 1861 at Camp George D. Prentice, KY. Dec 1861 transferred to B Co. Discharged 14 May 1862 at Hamburg, TN due to disability. Discharge certificate states disability due to valvular disease of the heart (ascites) following a march. At discharge was 6 ft 1 & fract 12 in, fair complexion, blue eyes, dark hair, farmer and born in Simpson Co, KY.

Garrison, Moses E., Private, G Co, 23 yrs, 15 Sep 1861 at Camp Caloway (Hartford), KY. Died 22 Jan 1862 at Calhoun, KY of pneumonia.

Gates, John, Private, K Co, 21 yrs, 10 Oct 1861 at Earles, KY. Wounded (slightly) at Battle of Shiloh, TN on 7 Apr 1862. Deserted 7 Jan 1864 from Branch #8, General Hospital #1 Louisville, KY.

Gibbs, John, Private (Wagoner), K Co, 27 yrs, 10 Oct 1861 at Earles, KY. Detailed as wagoner 24 Jul 1862 at Battle Creek, TN. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Gibson, Charles S., Corporal, F Co, 20 yrs, 21 Oct 1861 at Rochester, KY. Died 4 Jan 1862 at Calhoun, KY of typhoid.

Givens, Alfred Thomas, Private, F Co, 21 yrs, 17 or 21 Oct 1861 at Rochester, KY. Sep-Oct 1862 sick at General Hospital Louisville, KY. Jan-Feb 1863 sick at home on discharge furlough. Discharged 28 Mar 1863 at Bowling Green, KY due to disability. Discharge certificate states disability due to general debility and phthisis (tuberculosis). At discharge was 5 ft 11 in, dark complexion, black eyes, dark hair, farmer and born in Butler Co, KY.

Glass, Jesse, Private, C Co, 18 yrs, 10 Sep 1861 at Calhoun, KY. Died 24 Feb 1862 at Calhoun, KY of typhoid.

Glass, William J., Private, C Co, 18 yrs, 10 Sep 1861 at Calhoun, KY. Died 28 Feb 1862 at Calhoun, KY of typhoid.

Glenn, Henry F., Private, H Co, 21 yrs, 4 or 11 Nov 1861 at South Carrollton, KY. Jan-Feb 1862 sick at Calhoun, KY. Died 1 Mar 1862 at Calhoun, KY of typhoid.

Goode, Henry A., 1st Sergeant, E Co, 25 yrs, 22 Sep 1861 at Brownsville, KY. 10 Oct -22 Dec 1863 left sick in barracks in Bowling Green, KY. 1 Mar 1864 recruiting duty in Edmonson Co., KY. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Goode, Samuel V., 6th Corporal, E Co, 18 yrs, 8 Nov 1861 at Brownsville, KY. Promoted to 5th Corporal Sep 1862. Promoted to 3rd Corporal Mar 1864. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Goodman, George W., Private, D Co, 18 yrs, 14 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Died 10 or 11 Mar 1862 at Calhoun, KY of typhoid.

Goodman, Gibby, Private, D Co, 20 yrs, 14 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Nov-Dec 1862 sick at home. Promoted to 4th Corporal Sep 1862. Mar-Apr 1863 sick at home. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Goodman, Wesley, Private, D Co, 18 yrs, 14 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Jan-Apr 1862 sick General Hospital Nashville, TN. Wounded (slightly) at Battle of Stone's River, TN on 31 Dec 1862 and sent to General Hospital Nashville, TN. Home furlough to recover from wounds 26 Apr-11 May 1863. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Goodman, William, Private, D Co, 18 yrs, 14 Sep 1861 at Rochester, KY. Wounded (severely) at Battle of Shiloh on 7 Apr 1862. Died 16 or 17 Apr 1862 at Shiloh, TN of wounds.

Goodwin, James, Private, G Co, 23 yrs, 6 Dec 1861 at Camp Caloway, KY. Died 4 Mar 1862 at Calhoun, KY of typhoid.

Goodwin, Pleasant, Private, G Co, 26 yrs, 6 Dec 1861 at Camp Caloway, KY. Jan-Feb 1862 sick at Calhoun, KY. May-June 1862 sick at Iuka, MS. 11 Jan-Feb 1864 on courier post in eastern TN. Discharged 17 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Gossett, Henry, Private, K Co, 23 yrs, 10 Oct 1861 at Earles, KY. Mar-Apr 1863 sick leave at South Carrollton, KY. May-June 1863 AWOL. Jul-Aug 1863 arrested for desertion. Restored to duty 6 Aug 1863 by order of General Burnside with stoppage of pay during absence. Discharged 16 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Gossett, Joseph, Private, H Co, 26 yrs, 28 Sep 1861 at South Carrollton, KY. Mar 1863 sick at Bowling Green, KY. Mar-Apr 1863 detailed as wagoner. 20 Oct 1863 detailed as guard at Knoxville, TN. 25 Aug 1864 sick at Marietta, GA. Discharged 14 Dec 1864 at Bowling Green, KY.

Gott, John W., Corporal, G Co, 21 yrs, 15 Sep 1861 at Camp Caloway, KY. At enlistment was 5 ft 6 in, fair complexion, blue eyes, light hair, and a farmer. Wounded (slightly) at Battle of Shiloh on 7 Apr 1862 and sent to General Hospital Nashville, TN. May-June 1862 sick at hospital Nashville, TN.

Grady, Whitfield E., Private, H Co, 19 yrs, 28 Sep 1861 at South Carrollton, KY. Promoted to Corporal Jan 1862. May-Jun 1862 sent to General Hospital Nashville, TN. Discharged 16 June 1862 at Nashville, TN due to disability. Discharge certificate states disability due to phthisis (tuberculosis).
