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

1860 Butler County, Kentucky Mortality Schedule [Continued]

The 1860 Mortality Schedule was collected in conjunction with the 1860 Population Census. It listed persons who died within the preceding year. The schedule was divided into eleven columns with the following labels: Name of Every Person who Died during the year ending 1st June 1860, whose usual place of above at the time of death was in this family; Age; Sex; Color, white, black, or mulatto; Free or Slave; Married or widowed; Place of Birth, Naming the State, Territory or Country; The Month in which the person died; Profession, Occupation, or Trade; Disease or Cause of Death; and Number of Days Ill. Obtaining a Tennessee Birth Certificate

Submitted by J. Mark Lowe 505 Josephine Street Springfield, TN 37171

The Tennessee Office of Vital Records registers and maintains the original certificates of births, deaths, marriages and divorces that occur in Tennessee. Certified copies of the original records are available to the person named on the record and to certain family members or legal representatives.

Birth Records

Records are available beginning with January 1914 births. Records of some births that occurred in the major cities from 1881-1913 are also available. A certified photocopy of the original record may be obtained at a fee of \$10.00 for the first copy and \$2.00 for each additional copy of the same record requested at the same time. For persons born from 1949 to the present, a certified copy produced by computer is also available at a fee of \$5.00 for the first copy and \$2.00 for each additional copy of the same record requested at the same time. Both types of copies (photocopy and computer produced) are certified and include a raised, embossed seal.

By Personal Visit

If you are in the Nashville vicinity, you may visit the office between the hours of 8 am to 4 pm Central Time. Computer produced birth certificates will be handled while you wait; other services will be handled by 3:00 pm if you are in the office before 10:30 am. If after 10:30 am, the copy will be available by 3:00 pm on the next working day.

By Mail

Mail your request to the office at the address shown on the right. Certificates requested through the mail are usually returned to the customer within two weeks of the day received. The certificate of a recent birth, death, marriage or divorce is often not available from the Office of Vital Records until several weeks after the event.

Adairville Training School Yearbook, 1906-1907 Adairville, Kentucky

Taken from the original yearbook located in the Robertson County Archives, Springfield, TN.

Location:

This school is located at Adairville, KY forty miles north of Nashville, TN, and thirty miles southwest of Bowling Green, KY. It is the southern terminus of the Owensboro and Adairville branch of the Louisville and Nashville Railroad.

Adairville is a beautiful town situated in the rich agricultural district of southern KY, and is the highest point between Owensboro and Nashville. It is unsurpassed in its advantages of good water, pure air, and freedom from all local causes of disease.

The moral character of the people is seen in the fact that they support four churches, and they have recently gained a decided victory over intemperance, and all the saloons are now closed. The social life here would do credit to a much larger place, with the advantage of being free from the common vices of larger towns. The people are largely college bred, giving them culture and refinement in the highest degree.

Miss Sudie Chambers, Third and Fourth Grades and Intermediate Work. Graduate of the Public Schools of Nashville, TN; Special Course in Peabody Normal College, Nashville, TN; Graduate Normal School, Bowling Green, KY; for several summers a student at Chautaqua, NY; several years Teacher in Public Schools in TN; for eight years a Teacher in the Adairville School.

Miss Zue Sloss, Primary Teacher, First and Second Grades. Graduate of Auburn College, Auburn, Kentucky; Summer Course at Northern Indiana Normal School, Valparaiso, IN; Teacher in Public Schools of KY, two years; Teacher in Auburn Seminary, two years; six years, Teacher in the Adairville School.

Miss Madge Terry, piano. Student under Mrs. Milliken, Adairville, KY; Miss Schurig, graduate of Leipsic, Germany; and Miss Coleman, Hollins Institute, VA; Course in Bethel College, Hopkinsville, KY; under Miss Follinby, Boston Conservatory; Graduate of Miss Chambers of the Indianapolis Conservatory; Course in Conservatory, Cincinnati; For four years a Teacher of piano.

Miss Katherine Anderson Hooper, Voice and Expression. Graduate of TN Female College; Unversity of Nashville; Course in Conservatory of Cincinnati; Three years a Teacher in Hiram Lydia College, Altus, AR; One year in Carr-Burdette College, Sherman, TX; Three years in Logan Female College, Russellville, KY.

Course of Study:

The course of study has been very carefully selected with the objects of this institution ever in view. There are three departments, the Primary, Intermediate and Academic.

The Primary Department covers a period of four years, consisting of the first four grades which are as follows:

First Year: Primer, First Reader, Hiawatha's Childhood, Spelling, Writing, Numbers Drawing.

Second Year: Second Reader, Fairy Stories, Bible Stories, Spelling, Language, Arithmetic, Oral Geography, Writing and Drawing.

Third Year: Third Reader, Myths and Fairy Stories, Primary Arithmetic, Spelling, First Language, Writing, Drawing, Primary Geography.

Fourth Year: Fourth Reader, Wonder Book, Carpenter's Travels, Primary Geography completed, Arithmetic to percentage, Physiology, Second Language, Writing, Spelling, Drawing.

The Intermediate Department has been made a three years course instead of two, that the minds of the pupils may be more fully developed and a broader, firmer foundation laid for the academic course.

Fifth Year: Reading, Fifth Reader, Geographical Reader and other selections; Arithmetic, Elementary completed; Language, Lessons in English, Little Chronicle; Spelling, Written and Oral with Definitions and Diacritical marks; Geography, Natural Elementary completed; Writing.

Sixth Year: Reading, Geographical Reader, Selections from English and American Classics; Arithmetic, Practical Arithmetic to Percentage; Language, Grammar and Composition; History, Kentucky History and Agriculture; Spelling, Written and Oral, Definitions; Geography, Natural complete; Writing, Copy Books, and Principles.

Seventh Year: Arithmetic, Practical completed; English-Grammar, Composition, Selections from English and American Authors, Youths' Companion; Science, Physiology, Physical Geography; History, United States; Spelling, Special attention to Definitions and use in sentences; Writing, Copy Books and Principles.

Academic Department. In view of the fact that students differ greatly in ability as a student and in the choice of a life work, three courses of study have been adopted in this department:

The Classical Course for those who desire to be classical scholars, giving them the preparation necessary for the classical course in our best colleges and universities.

The Latin-Scientific Course for those who only wish to take a scientific course at college. The English Course for those who want a thorough training for business and practical life.

First Year: Mathematics- Milne's Elementary Algebra, and Mental Arithmetic; Latin-Collar & Daniel's Beginner's Latin; History-Montgomery's History of England; English-Rhetoric and Composition, Kingley's Greek Heroes, Lady of the Lake, Irving's Sketch Book.

Second Year: Mathematics-Wentworth's School Algebra and Wentworth's Arithmetic; Latin-Gradatum and Viri Romae; Greek-White's Beginner's Book; Science-Botany; English-Rhetoric, special attention to the laws of and the development of Composition; Selection from poems of Burns; Shakespeare's Merchant of Venice.

Third Year: Mathematics-Algebra, completed; Plane Geometry; Latin-four Books of Caesar and Composition; Greek-Four Books of Analysis; Philosophy-Civil Government and Political Economy; French-Edgren's French Grammar, French Reader, Aldrich & Foster; English-Introduction to American Literature, Mathews, with selections from American authors; Vision of Sir Launfal, Tennyson's Princess; Burke's Speech on Conciliation; Bacaulay's Essay on Addison, Decoverly Papers.

Fourth Year: Mathematics-Solid Geometry, Plane Trigonometry; Latin-Virgil, Cicero; Greek-Homer's Iliad, Composition; Science-Physics, Astronomy; Philosophy-Logic and Psychology; French-Columbia, L'Abbe Constatine; English-Halleck's English Literature, Elliot's Silas Marner, Shakespeare's Macbeth and Hamlet; L'Allegro, and Il Penserosa, Goldsmith's Deserted Village, and Coleridge's Ancient Mariner and other selections.

Music:

The purpose of this Department is to give the pupil a thorough training in technique, to encourage a love and appreciation for good music, not merely to give the pupils a showy repertoire, but to make of them true musicians. Selections are given from the best composers of all periods, in connection with the standard etudes of all grades. The methods of instruction are modern, and are determined by the individual requirements of the pupil. Class lessons including Theory, Ear-training and Musical History will be taught without extra charge.

Recitals by the pupils will be given from time to time to accustom them to public performance and that they may acquire self-possession in playing.

Elocution:

"I believe that every man should train his voice and body under some system of elocution. First, for the health it affords; second, for its educational effects; third, for the advantage it gives a man over others for usefulness." - Rev. Charles Spurgeon.

In the study of elocution the development of the powers of each individual is of the highest importance, the intellect should be quickened, the imagination cultivated, the feelings deepened and guided. The course in elocution will include voice culture, physical culture and rendering. Throughout the course, special attention will be given to the literary analysis, that the student may be led to experience the thoughts and feelings of the author. The study of elocution means more than the ability to recite a few selections well. It is not a training for exhibition day, it is a training of all the agents of expression used in everyday life. It will give one the ability to stand before others and express in a natural, forcible, and entertaining manner what he has for them. It will give him an added power in whatever field his future work may be.

Requirements for graduation are three years' work in elocution and the first three years of the English course in the Academic Department or a course equivalent to that.

Obsolete Words

Submitted by Gail Miller, using as a reference *Elizabethan Left-Overs in Allen County* by **Alford Paul Dalton**, Western KY State Teachers College, 1936.

I have always been fascinated by what I considered the quaint words which my older paternal grandparents used. My dad was the youngest of their 6 children with my grandfather, **Arthur Jackson**, being born in 1891 in Hopkins Co., KY and my grandmother, **Virgie** (**Steele**) **Jackson**, being born in 1899 in Dekalb Co., TN. They both claimed to be of Scot-Irish descent.

Mr. **Dalton** has listed several of the words which I heard my own grandparents use. Even though his study attempts to show Elizabethan influences in his reference group in Allen County, many of the words obviously show up in rural settings in other areas. Listed are some of the words I have heard used.

Airish. An adjective used in referring to a cool, breezy condition of the atmosphere. From Scotland and Yorkshire, England. <u>It's kindly airish this morning</u>?

Peaked. An adjective from the dialect of Devonshire which means pale and ill-looking. You look peaked; are you feeling poorly?

Mammy and **Pappy** survive from English provincialism. They mean mother and father. <u>My</u> grandmother's parents were Mammy and Pappy.

Jaunt. A noun meaning little trip. My grandmother always used this word when she meant a little adventurous trip.

Gumption. From Scotland. It means bravery or spunk. <u>If you had any gumption, you wouldn't let them other boys run over you.</u>

Fizz. A variant of Old English feeze meaning a nervous state. What are you in such a fizz about?

Transferred to Camp Parole, MD 24 Jan 1865. Transferred to General Hospital #2 Camp Parole, MD 28 Feb 1865. Furloughed 20 Apr 1865 and ordered to report to Camp Chase, OH upon expiration of furlough. Discharged 20 Apr 1865 at Louisville, KY.

Greenwood, William, Private, B Co, 24 yrs, 6 Nov 1861 at Camp George D. Prentice (Greenville), KY. Deserted 16 Sep 1862 and returned to duty 4 Oct 1862. Wounded (slightly) and captured at battle of Stone's River on 31 Dec 1862 and sent to Belle Island Prison, Richmond, VA 15 Jan 1863. Paroled at City Point, VA 20 Jan 1863 and reported to Camp Paroled, MD 21 Jan 1863. Sent to Camp Chase, OH 10 or 12 Mar 1863. Reported to Camp Chase, OH 22 Mar 1863. Exchanged May 1863 and returned to regiment. (Camp Chase listed as AWOL 30 Apr-30 July 1863, but removed from records 24 Aug 1886.) July-Aug 1864 sick at Marietta, GA.
