Minutes of Board July 20, 1910.

Board of Regents met, 9:30 A.M., in the office of the American National Bank, Present Messrs. Cole, Potter, and Mark.

President Cherry presented his report and recommendations. The Board proceeded to consider the recommendations with reference to salaries of members of Faculty. These recommendations were approved as follows:
