Muhlenberg mining engineer drowns

T-A 4-10-74 Dawson Springs - A twoday search by combined rescue teams ended Thursday, April 4 at 4:05 p. m. with the recovery of Nate Quarcelino, 48, of Madisonville, from the south end of Lake Beshear in Caldwell County.

Eyewitnesses to Mr. Quarcelino's drowning Wednesday, April 3 at 5 p. m., Mr. and Mrs. Ben Bearden Jr., saw him fall from his boat into the portion of the lake directly behind their lake front home.

Before they could do anything to help him, he was gone, leaving only his empty boat circling around above the spot where he disappeared.

A search operation involvrescue teams from Princeton, Christian, Hopkins, Lyon and Caldwell counties began the same day, only to stop when the water became too rough and it became dark.

Beginning Thursday at 10 a. m., the search continued until a Lyon County rescue team found and recovered the body, aided by the Caldwell County sheriff's office and the Kentucky State Water Enforcement unit,

Confusion as to where the search should begin was first due to the searchers finding the victim's boat trailer parked at another dock area on the lake.

A search of the area revealed that the victim had a cabin located on the lake shore across from where he fell from his boat, narrowing down the search area. Mrs. Bearden then aided the search teams to recover the body with her eyewitness account of the accident and later with a sigwhen the searchers reached the approximate location of where Quarcelino fell in.

Mr. Quarcelino, prominent in local mining circles, was mining engineer for Corum and Company and Center Coal Mining Co. in Muhlenberg at the time of his death. Before that he was division engineer at the Peabody Coal Co. in Muhlenberg.

Mr. Quarcelino was born in Bevier, Mo. Feb. 23, 1926, the son of the late Floyd and Lucia Darne Quarcelino. He was a member of Christ the King Catholic Church. He attended Rolla School of Mines in Rolla, Mo. and was a member of Kappa Sigma fraternity.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Margaret Dearstone Quarcelino of Madisonville; a daughter, Nancy Quarcelino, a student at Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green; two sons, Lee Quarcelino of Murphreysboro, Ill. and Nate Quarcelino Jr. of Madisonville; three sisters, Mrs. Harold Kitchen, Mrs. Pete Marra and Mrs. Herman Teter, all of Macon, Mo.; one grandchild.
