STANDARD CHAPTER BYLAWS

Article I

The OFFICIAL NAME of this chapter by authority of and under the provisions of its charter shall be the Kentucky Colonel Chapter, Bowling Green, Kentucky, of the American Business Women's Association.

Article II

The OBJECT of this Chapter shall be to promote its members professionally, educationally, culturally and socially, both locally and nationally.

Article III

The STRUCTURE of this chapter shall be the relationship of Members, Officers, Committees and National Headquarters.

Article IV

The OFFICERS of this chapter shall be elected to serve for a period of one year, and shall be President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer. The duties of the chapter officers shall be as follows:

The PRESIDENT of the chapter shall be its authorized leader. She shall preside at all meetings of the chapter and the Executive Board. She shall appoint all committees, except the Nominating Committee.

The VICE PRESIDNET of the chapter, in the absence of the President, shall preside at all meetings of the chapter and perform all necessary duties of the office.

The RECORDING SECRETARY shall take the minutes of each meeting of the chapter and of the Executive Board, and shall keep an accurate and complete record of all proceedings of the meetings.

The CORRESPONDING SECRETARY shall conduct all correspondence with chapter members and with National Headquarters.

The TREASURER shall have custody of the funds of the chapter, and shall collect whatever local dues are assessed members by a majority vote of the chapter.

Article V

The EXECUTIVE BOARD of the chapter shall consist of the five chapter officers only. The President of the chapter shall act as Chairman.

The Executive Board shall meet at regular intervals preferably once a month, or when called by the President.

Minutes of the Executive Board meeting shall be kept in a permanent form, and a copy shall accompany chapter monthly Minutes sent to National Headquarters.

With the exception of the office of President, if any chapter office becomes vacant during the term, it shall be the responsibility of the Executive Board to promptly appoint a successor to such office to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term. If the office of President becomes vacant, the Vice-President automatically becomes President and a successor to the office of Vice-President is appointed for the remainder of the term by the Executive Board.

The Executive Board shall constitute chapter authority in deciding matters of chapter policy not otherwise designated, and it shall require a two-thirds vote of the membership of the chapter to alter a decision passed by the Executive Board.

Article VI

The following STANDING COMMITTEES shall be appointed by the President of the Chapter, as directed by the Executive Board.

Program	Vocational
Employment-Housing &	Music
Transportation	Membership
Ways & Means	Banquet
Educational Project	Social
Publicity	

SPECIAL COMMITTEES may be appointed from time to time by the President of the chapter as directed by the Executive Board. One such committee which should always be appointed in chapters over three months old, is the Torchbearer-Friendship Committee.

Article VII

REGULAR MEETINGS of the Chapter shall be held on the 4th Tuesday of each month; the time and place of such chapter meetings shall be announced at the previous chapter meeting.

Article VIII

The ORDER OF BUSINESS in chapter meetings shall be as follows:

1. Meeting called to order.
2. Invocation.
3. Introduction of Guests.
4. Introduction of Speaker on Program
5. Reading and Adoption of Minutes of the Last Regular Meeting.
6. Reading of Official Communications from National Headquarters.
7. Reading of other communications to the Chapter.

8. Reading of Report of any change of address.
9. Report of any Transferees Who Might Want to Transfer to Your Chapter.
10. Report of the Treasurer.
11. Reports of Standing Committees.
12. Reports of Special Committees.
13. Report of the Executive Board.
14. Unfinished Business.
15. Adjournment of Business Meeting.
16. Installation of New Members.
17. Benediction.

Article IX

A QUORUM of the chapter shall be not less than one-third of the chapter membership.

Article X

The MONTHLY DUES of this chapter shall be paid to the Chapter Treasurer quarterly in advance. Members shall be in good standing nationally, paying their membership fees and annual dues as set forth in the national By-laws and payable as specified in the membership agreement signed by them.

Article XI

CANDIDATES FOR MEMBERSHIP in this chapter shall meet the requirements set forth in the National Bylaws. They shall be recommended by at least one ABWA member in good standing, and shall not be invited to join until approved by the Membership Committee. The decision of the Membership Committee shall be final except in instances where a Field Executive from National Headquarters is enrolling new members, in which instance her decision shall be final.

Article XII

STANDING RULES contained in the Procedure Manual of the American Business Women's Association shall constitute supplementary rules and regulations for the governance of members and chapters.

Article XIII

AMENDMENTS of these Bylaws, so long as nothing in them is in conflict with the National Bylaws of Procedure Manual, may be made by a two-thirds vote of the chapter. Such amendments shall be approved by National Headquarters before becoming effective.

Article XIV

If DEACTIVATION of this chapter should occur, all funds remaining in the treasury, after payment of all debts, shall be contributed to the Bufton Memorial Educational Fund.
