TITLE OF LEGISLATION: Addition of Lights and Signs

NUMBER: 86-5-S

ACTION TAKEN BY CONGRESS: Passed unanimously

LEGISLATION FORWARDED TO: Mr. Kemble Johnson, Physical Plant Director

DATE FORWARDED: March 27, 1986

FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES: Talked by phone with Mr. Johnson; Mr. Paul
Bunch, Director of Public Safety addressed Congress concerning
this matter.

RESPONSE FROM ADMINISTRATION: The addition of a pedestrian light
and sign at this area falls under city jurisdiction. Resolution
has been sent to City Hall and follow-up activities need to be
made. Mr. Bunch informed Congress that laws governing pedestrian
zones on and around campus are fully enforced.

Resolution 86-5-S
Addition of Lights and Signs
Introduced 2-04-86

PURPOSE: For the University to add a pedestrian light and signs between Pearce-Ford Tower and Egypt parking lot for the public safety of Western Kentucky University to enforce the crosswalk laws in this area and all other crosswalk areas on campus.

STATUS: **PASSED**

WHEREAS, The area between Pearce-Ford Tower is not well lighted, and

WHEREAS, The crosswalk between Pearce-Ford Tower and Egypt parking lot is dangerous to cross because of the heavy traffic, and

WHEREAS, By law the pedestrian has the right-of-way, which is not being enforced by the Public Safety of Western Kentucky University, and

WHEREAS, Most crosswalks around the outside of campus are dangerous to cross because these laws are not enforced and they don't have the proper lighting, and

THEREFORE, Be it resolved that we the members of the Associated Student Government strongly suggest that a crosswalk light be added between Pearce-Ford Tower and Egypt parking lot, and we, being duly elected representatives of the student body, demand that the Public Safety of Western Kentucky University protect us by enforcing the laws governing pedestrian zones on and around campus.
