

"The Kentucky Colonel Chapter" of the American Business Women's Association will hold its Hand of Friendship Enrollment Event September 17, 1972.

This event is held semi-annually to introduce the organization and the local chapter to business women in this area. At the same time similar events will be held across the country by more than 1,000 other ABWA chapters.

"The chief function of ADWA is to help women in business advance through education, increased competence, and through upgrading of professional skills and business attitudes".

The Association, founded in Kansas City, Missouri, in 1949, now has over 60,000 members. One of its worthy projects is giving scholarships to women students. Locally, chapters awarded over \$350,000. in scholarships from October 1, 1970 to September 30, 1971. During this period an additional \$70,000. in scholarships was awarded from the National Scholarship Fund.
