FRESH-CORN PUDDING

6 to 8 ears very fresh corn (enough for
3 cups pulp)
1 egg, seperated
2 teaspoons sugar
1 teaspoon salt
About 3 tablespoons of butter or margarine,
divided.

With sharp knife slit down center of each row of corn kernels. With dull edge of knife press out pulp and juice into bowl. Add egg yolk, sugar, salt and 2 tablespoons butter, melted. Beat egg white until stiff peaks form; fold into corn mixture. Turn into greased shallow 1-quart baking dish and dot with remaining butter. Bake in 350 degree oven 45 minutes or until golden brown. Makes 6 servings.
