#### Rules

One of the qualifications for Banner Chapter is an Attendance Contest neld over a three month period. Such a project stimulates attendance, aids in the fulfillment of ABWA objectives, and helps each member realize the value of her membership.

The Standard Chapter Bylaws state each chapter meeting consists of two equally important parts - the dinner meeting with a speaker or planned program; and the business meeting.
