





- b. Percent of farm women who took an action in the past year to reduce farm related risks







c. Percent of farm women who said someone in their family visited a physician during the last year because of a farm related injury




 d. Percent of farm women who said they could benefit from additional training on equipment




Percent of farm women who said they would like training on the following equipment and tasks




f. Woman's influence over health and safety decisions on farm


ACTIVITIES OF COMMUNITY COORDINATORS
