Bill 86-31-S
Amendment of By-Laws for Expulsion of Representatives
Introduced 4-08-86

PURPOSE: To amend the By-Laws of the Associated Student Government so that a College Representative that has missed two Academic Council meetings and has not been represented by an alternate or a substitute be brought before the Judicial Council for possible expulsion.

STATUS: PASSED

WHEREAS, It is the duty of the College Representative to represent Associated Student Government and the students in his/her college in the Academic Council, and

WHEREAS, The college representative is a voting member and an important liaison between Academic Council and Associated Student Government, and

WHEREAS, The Academic Council meets only eight times during the regular school year and twice over the summer, and

WHEREAS, If a representative missed over two Academic Council meetings without substitution of an alternate, then that college would not be represented over 50% of the time during the regular school year, and

WHEREAS, Less than fifty percent attendance does not suggest active participation or adequate representation of Associated Student Government and students in the respective college,

THEREFORE, Be it resolved that we, the Associated Student Government being duly elected representatives of the student body, do hereby amend our By-Laws by adding a Part C to Section II that reads as follows:

- C. Attendance at Academic Council meetings shall be required of all College Representatives. Two(2) absences without representation of a College Alternate or any other legal substitute will result in the representative being brought before Judicial Council for possible dismissal from Congress. Failure to appear before the Judicial Council results in immediate dismissal from Congress.
