It was a pleasure and privilege to serve as 1974 Boss Night Chairman.

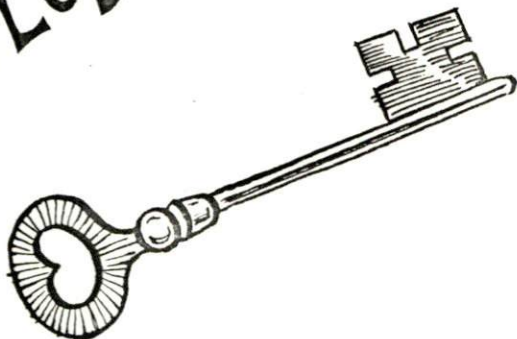
MARY FRANCES BROWN

Treasurer (was RS)

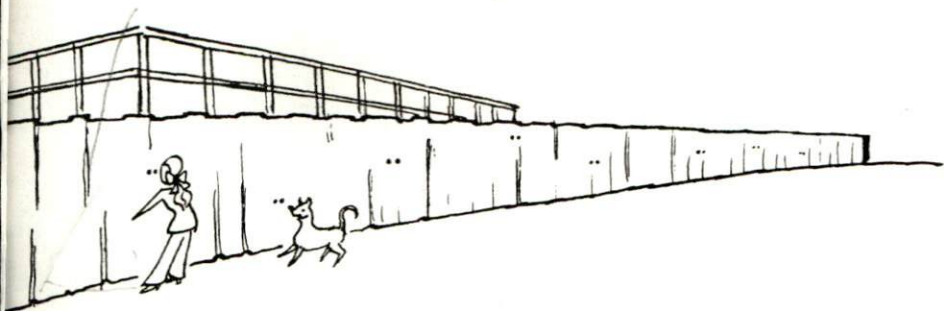
Seeks out qualified scholarship recipients for chapter approval. Maintains list of available night schools, continuing education, and correspondence courses for use of chapter members.

Makes arrangements for chapter meetings place -- includes maintaining standing reservation list; planning menu, decorations; preparing place cards. Informs members of regular and special meetings and events. Extends special chapter courtesies; i.e., congratulations and condolences. Plans optional social activities not related to chapter meetings.

Membership
Recording Sec'y

Promotes, increases, and stabilizes membership of the chapter. Maintains the chapter's membership roster.

YOUR NATIONAL OFFICERS SPEAK



NATIONAL PRESIDENT Vivian Gardner. "Every person is born with a tremendous potential, and whichever direction he takes is the result of the attitudes he adopts. All of us have had failures, but some people dwell on them and some do not. If you want to take advantage of your potential, stop worrying

about the problems and mistakes of the past and concentrate only on what you want in the future. In order to accomplish your goals, you must be a 'doer.' Decide if it's possible to change -- you can do it, but only if you think you can! Examine yourself and see what you want to change. When you admit you need to change, you're not down-grading yourself -- you're realizing there's room for improvement. Set a goal. In order to be a different person, you must start to become that person. No one expects you to change over night; it must be done gradually. There are five keys to success: work; knowledge and skills; self-discipline; belief in self; and goal setting. It has been said people are divided into three groups: those who make things happen; those who watch things happen; and those who wonder what happened. Which group applies to you?"
